Mark your calendars for the annual BAAA Christmas gathering at Black Market Gourmet on Sunday December 17th, 2-4 pm. More details will come.



## Review of October's General Meeting





# A Review of Author-Artist, John Reis's "Playshop on Design," BAAA meeting 10/15/2023

Unknowingly, John's "Playshop" was sandwiched between Saturday's eclipse (10/14) and Monday's art drop-off for SOCC's show, (10/16). Everything takes time, thought, and energy. Although participation at the (10/15/2023) BAAA meeting was low, enthusiasm was high.

John talked about generating ideas. He encouraged us to do several one-minute quick thumbnail sketches from a Sunset Beach photo, which he provided for everyone. Imagine doing 100 quick thumbnails. One out of a hundred ideas gives better odds than doing four thumbnails. Participants then chose a favorite thumbnail and, by varying directions, objects light-dark contrast and the horizon line, we produced even more sketches. We labeled each sketch with a quality or an intention.

"Design classes are incomplete because they focus on how to do design, but don't discuss why certain methods work (or not)," John said. "Without knowing why things work or don't work, we do not know how to make improvements. They do not mention that effective design requires both analytical and intuitive thinking."



Feeling the difference between writing with pencil-in-hand and sketching with pencil-in-hand was a key take-away for me. [See pictures.] The writing gesture activates one part of our brain, while the sideways gesture of sketching activates another part of our brain. This information reminded me of Tibetan "mudras," or hand gestures that generate various energetic connections.

In the psychology of design, John explained, "Even the left-right-brain concept is misunderstood. The left brain sees details, but not the big picture, and the right brain sees the big picture, but can't see details. Both are needed! We have to see the forest AND the trees. Brain scans have shown that analytical thinking uses selected regions of the brain (on both the left and right sides), but intuitive thinking requires the entire brain!"

John also recommended questioning yourself. "Why I like this sketch" and "What else could I do." Those kinds of queries stimulate more creative ideas.

We artists are doubly blessed when we learn and grow as artists. Loving what we do, is a rarity in today's world. Thanks John! Submitted by Shinan Barclay, BAAA Program Chair
