



Anthurium

Care Guide



Light

Prefers bright, indirect light. Direct sunlight may scorch the leaves. The more light this plant receives the more blooms it will produce.



Water & Humidity

Water when the top half to three quarters of the soil is dry. Water until liquid flows through the drainage holes at the bottom of the pot. Discard any water that has accumulated in the saucer. Prefers high humidity. Mist daily. Would benefit from a humidifier near by.



Temperature

Ideal temperature is 65-80°F



Food

Feed your Anthurium once a month during the spring and summer with a liquid fertilizer for indoor plants. A fertilizer with higher phosphorus will help it produce the best blooms.



Toxicity

Highly toxic to pets and humans if ingested.



Growers Tips

Make sure to remove fading or dying flowers quickly to help the plant focus its energy on new growth. Your Anthurium likes to rest for a few weeks during the winter. Lower temperatures, less light, and drier soil during this time will help it produce more flowers in the spring and summer.
