

Coconut Palm Care Guide





Thrives in full sun. Needs 6 hours of sun per day.



Water & Humidity

Like many plants that love warmth and humidity, the coconut palm is a thirsty tree. Keep the soil consistently moist but not soggy by saturating it with warm water once or twice a week. Make sure the container does not become waterlogged, as this can result in root rot.



Temperature

Ideal temperature is 70-95°F



Food

Coconut palms require regular fertilization during their growth stages to promote healthy growth and fruit production. A slow-release, balanced fertilizer that contains nitrogen, phosphorus, and potassium is recommended. The fertilizer should be applied at least twice a year.

Growers Tips

Coconut palms prefer sandy soil, so if your soil is heavy, mix in some sand to improve drainage. Mix compost or organic matter with the soil to improve its fertility. This will help the tree establish its roots and grow strong and healthy.
