

Desert Rose Care Guide





The desert rose flowering plant grows well in desert settings and will bloom beautifully with full, bright sun.



Water

The desert rose only needs watering when the soil feels dry. In the winter, it only needs water every three or four weeks.



Temperature

The desert rose needs temperatures of at least 70°F, but they can do very well in temperatures of up to 100° F.



Food

Fertilize your desert rose during its growing period (spring and summer) with a half dose of a 20-20-20 plant food, but be sure to stop the fertilization during the winter when it goes dormant.



Toxicity

Toxic to humans and pets if ingested.



Growers Tips

As a succulent, desert rose is quite drought-tolerant, but it will flower best if given regular water during the summer. When temperatures drop to 55 degrees or lower, you should cut back on watering quite a bit. Using a terra cotta pot is ideal, since this allows water to drain quickly. Use a cactus mix when re-potting and take care not to use a too-large pot.
