

English Lavender Care Guide







English Lavender thrives in full sun with 6-8 hours of sunlight per day.

Water

Mature/established plants need ½ gallon of water every 2 weeks until flower bud formation. During flowering, water one or two times per week through harvest. Lavender is very drought tolerant once established, but grows produces more blooms with regular watering.



Temperature

English Lavender is able to withstand temperatures down to -20°F.



Food

A low nitrogen fertilizer formulated to encourage blooming is best, but general purpose fertilizer will also work if it's diluted.



Toxicity

Non-toxic, but can cause stomach irritation in pets if they ingest large quantities.



Growers Tips

The plants prefer well-drained soil year-round, especially in winter. Poorly draining winter soils quickly kill English lavender. Soil should also be alkaline.
