



# Mexican Heather

## Care Guide



### Light

Mexican heather does best in full sun but can tolerate partial shade, so choose a spot that gets at least four hours of direct sunlight per day.



### Water

Water Mexican heather deeply about every week during the growing season, allowing the top two inches of the soil to become dry before watering again. Mexican heather can tolerate drought but doesn't like "wet feet," when its roots sit in soggy soil.



### Temperature

Can handle temperatures above 55°F



### Food

Feed your plant by building up your soil and/or planting your Mexican heather with a slow-release fertilizer. Water-soluble plant food can also be used to feed Mexican heather its nutrients.



### Toxicity

Toxic to human and pets if ingested.



### Growers Tips

Mexican heather plants are a very low-maintenance shrub when it comes to pruning. This small shrub doesn't require any pruning at all, however, if it begins to look overgrown or if you would like to give it a more rounded shape, then it can be lightly pruned in the early spring. The tips of branches can also be pruned back in early spring or late winter to encourage bushier growth.
