



Norfolk Pine

Care Guide



Light

Norfolk pine trees prefer several hours of direct, bright light, but they will also tolerate full indirect, bright light as well



Water & Humidity

Water only when the top few inches of the soil is dry. Avoid soggy soil as it can lead to root rot.



Temperature

Ideal temperature is 65-85°F



Food

Add an all-purpose fertilizer to the top of the plant's soil every six weeks during the active growing season from Spring until Fall.



Toxicity

Mildly toxic to pets and humans if ingested.



Growers Tips

Remove lower branches that have died—a common issue with indoor specimens. It is usually not recommended to trim the top of the tree, but if a potted tree gets too large for its space, cut off the central leader.

A potted Norfolk Island pine only needs to be repotted when it's root-bound or the roots are beginning to come out of the drainage hole. Young Norfolk Island pines are not very fast growers, so it might be possible to repot your tree every other year instead of every year. As the plant matures, it will begin to grow faster.
