



Arbequina Olive Tree Care Guide



Light

Needs at least 6 hours of full sunlight per day. Can tolerate partial shade, but less sun may hinder the crop it produces.



Water & Humidity

Thrives with consistently moist soil, but becomes drought tolerant once established. Water twice weekly for the first few weeks, then reduce watering to once a week. Does not require any extra humidity.



Temperature

Can withstand short freezing temperatures as low as 22°F, but needs at least 300 plus hours of 45°F and above to produce fruit.



Food

You can feed your olive tree once during the spring and once during the fall with a slow-release, nitrogen-rich fertilizer.



Toxicity

Non-toxic to humans and pets.



Growers Tips

Can be grown outdoors in zones 8-10 and on patios or indoors in zones 4-7. Takes about 2-4 years to start producing fruit in ideal conditions. Arbequina olive trees are self-pollinating, so you only need one to get fruit. However, planting another olive tree will increase your harvest
