

Tuscan Blue Rosemary Care Guide



Light

Tuscan Blue Rosemary thrives in full sun.



Water & Humidity

Once established, Tuscan Blue rosemary requires minimal water, which makes it an excellent plant for dry soil. In fact, excess water leads to fatal root rot in rosemary plants. Allow the top of the soil to dry out between waterings.



Temperature

Can withstand short cold snaps but will die if left outdoors in temperatures under 30°F for longer than a few days.



Food

Rosemary rarely needs fertilizer and certain chemicals can damage the plant and affect the taste of the herb. If you wish to fertilize your plant, you can do so in the spring and summer growing seasons. We recommend doing so with an organic or all-natural compost.



Toxicity

Non-toxic and pet safe.

Use can Rosemary leaves fresh, dried, or added into herb oils, vinegar, and butter. Rosemary's strong flavors add great flavor to beef, veal, lamb, pork, chicken, and vegetable dishes.
