



Sago Palm Care Guide



Light

Thrives in bright indirect light to full sun. Too much direct sunlight may scorch the leaves.



Water & Humidity

Water whenever the soil feels dry to the touch, making sure never to overwater to the point of soggy soil. Slightly reduce watering in the winter when the plant is not actively growing. Sago Palms do fine in average household humidity.



Temperature

Ideal temperature is 65-75°F



Food

Generally, the sago palm should be fed with a fertilizer 3 times a year, throughout its growing season. A slow-release palm fertilizer, with an N-P-K ratio of 12-4-12, is best.



Toxicity

Toxic to humans and pets.



Growers Tips

Sago palms' roots are surprisingly large for the size of their foliage. Even if your palm looks modest above ground, you may notice roots escaping through drainage holes, water taking a long time to drain, or even the sides of your container bulging out. This is when you should repot your Sago Palm.
