

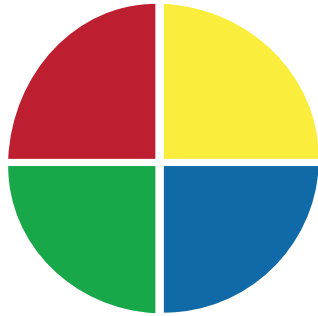
MICROFIBER CARE GUIDE

TOWEL SEPARATION:

Separating your towels is important. This allows towels to operate at their maximum efficiency. For example, glass towels washed with coating towels, or terry cloth towels, may now leave streaks on windows or lint behind due to the microfibers, or weave, being irritated during the wash.

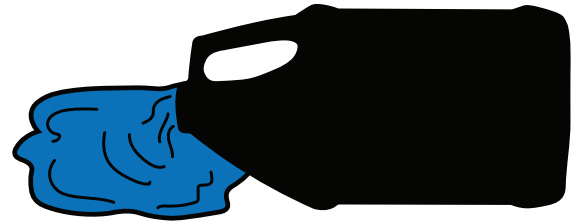
HOT TIP:

Color coordinating the towels in your shop allows for easier separation and washing.



USING A PROPER DETERGENT:

A proper detergent can mean everything when washing your microfiber towels. Avoid using generic household detergents as these have *fabric softeners, dyes, and scents*; all of which you want to avoid when washing your microfiber towels! Aim for a solvent based detergent that can break down chemicals and compounds in your towels allowing the microfiber to perform optimally. Stinger 706 Laundry Detergent is one of the best for microfibers!



RECOMMENDATIONS

I. Always Wash Towels Prior To First Use

- Washing new towels prior to first use will remove loose fibers leftover from factory production.

II. Never Use any Bleach/Chlorinated Products to Clean Towels

- These types of products or brighteners will harm the microfiber's performance by breaking down the fibers themselves.

III. Never Iron Towels, Never Dry on High Heat.

- DO NOT exceed 140°F when washing towels.
- Drying towels on high heat, or direct heat, will harm the microfibers of the towels.

IV. Always Separate Dark & Light Color Towels

- This prevents color bleeding from the darker towels (red, orange, etc.) into the lighter towels.

V. Avoid Washing Lint-Free Towels with Cotton or other Natural Fabrics.

- Lint will transfer among these towels and fabrics leaving unwanted results during the next use.

VI. Avoid Detergents that Contain Dyes, Scents, & Fabric Softeners.

- These 3 elements are killers of microfiber towels. They reduce performance by clogging the fibers.

VII. WHAT IF I HAVE BEEN WASHING MY TOWELS WRONG??

- Don't worry! Simply wash and dry your towels 3 times using a good laundry detergent and the method below and your towels should be good to go!



PROPER WASHING INSTRUCTIONS

WASHING

1. Load Towels Into Washer

- A. Be Careful not to overload washer. [¾ Full]

2. Add Laundry Detergent

- A. 4 Ounces of  706 Laundry Detergent
- B. OR any other Solvent Based Laundry Detergent.

3. Start the Washing Cycle

- A. Use Cold to Medium Heat when washing.

DRYING

1. Load Towels Into Dryer.

- A. Be Careful not to overload dryer. [¾ Full]

2. Tumble Dry on Low-to-No Heat.

- A. High heat will harm the microfiber towels.
- B. No Heat is best for towel maintenance.

3. OR Hang Towels to Dry.

- A. Best Method for Microfiber Lifespan.

4. Reuse Towels as needed.
