WHEREAS, Section 1 of P.L. 2020, c.74 amended N.J.S.A 40A:4-26 authorized the Director of the Division of Local Government Services ("Division") to promulgate new standards for the anticipation of COVID-19 affected revenues in the FY2021 budget, and, if necessary, in future years and

WHEREAS, for FY 2022, the Director once again authorized the use of a three-year average for the calculation of affected revenues; and

WHEREAS, the Chief Financial Officer of the Borough of Hasbrouck Heights, certifies that the following revenues were affected in 2021 by the COVID 19 pandemic and that the 3-year average of the amounts realized in 2019-2021 be anticipated in the introduced budget for 2022;

## EMERGENCY CLEARING AND REPAIR OF THE WEST END CULVERT

WHEREAS, on September 1 and extending into the early hours of September 2, 2021, a storm of historic proportions struck the Borough of Hasbrouck Heights producing record breaking rainfall amounts resulting in unprecedented flooding in vulnerable areas throughout the town, many of which had never flooded before; and

WHEREAS, that which is now known as the "West Side Drainage Culvert" was previously, since time immemorial, a natural stream, its tributary area being a large area of the Borough, and which runs across approximately parallel to and on the west side of the Boulevard beginning at Franklin Avenue and running in a northwesterly direction eventually leading into the Borough of Lodi; and

WHEREAS, the said natural stream crossed over numerous parcels private property that have since been developed and, as this area was being developed, although the Borough constructed the culverts in the public rights-of-way intersecting the stream in order to open and improve those streets and, over the course of time, either the developers of those particular parcels crossed by the stream, or the successive owners of those parcels privately enclosed the stream by numerous various methods; and

WHEREAS, to the extent that the stream traverses private property, it has remained a private facility the maintenance of which is the responsibility of neither the Borough of Hasbrouck Heights nor its taxpayers in general and the Borough had never before taken any action evidencing any control over the West End Drainage facility except to the extent that it lies within public rights-of-way; and

WHEREAS, during the aforesaid epoch storm of September 1 and 2, 2021, the said West Side Drainage facility failed, resulting in necessary repairs; and

WHEREAS this situation represented a potential threat to the health, welfare and safety of the residents of the Borough of Hasbrouck Heights and of the general public and potential damage to property in the neighborhood; and

WHEREAS the Borough's Department of Public Works does not have the equipment, manpower or expertise needed to immediately address this situation; and

WHEREAS it is the opinion of the Borough Engineer that this situation needed to be addressed immediately without the time necessary to prepare plans and specifications and advertise for bids; and

WHEREAS, the Borough Engineer advised that the cost to undertake the emergency repairs to the culvert on September 8<sup>th</sup> through November 14<sup>th</sup>, 2021 would amount to \$145,817,25, broken down as follows: \$126,229.75 payable to Joseph M. Sanzari Inc., \$10, 237.50 payable to Neglia Engineering Associates and \$9,350 payable to Luigi's Masonry; and

WHEREAS, the Chief Financial Officer has certified that funds in this amount are available.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Hasbrouck Heights, County of Bergen, State of New Jersey that they hereby declare that an Emergency/Exigency as defined in N.J.S.A. 40A:11-6 exists in connection with the need to undertake the aforesaid repairs; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Borough hereby authorizes the aforesaid undertaking all in accordance with the terms and conditions of the proposal provided by Joseph M. Sanzari and Luigi's Masonry and further under the supervision and direction of the Borough Engineer and the Superintendent of Public Works.
