## MONDAY AND THURSDAY

## WEDNESDAY

Electronic Waste – Pickup on Newspaper/Paper Day Only (see list)

## THURSDAY

Branches & Shrubs  
(no larger than 4 ft. in length, **bundled and tied**, placed curbside)

## GRASS PICKUP

**Tuesday Only**, March 14 through October 6

## LEAF SEASON

October 9 through December 8

Residents may place leaves in the street ( **not within** 10 ft. of a storm water drain catch basin)

**RECYCLING CENTER HOURS** – 7:00 a.m. to 11:00 a.m. (Monday through Friday), 7:00 a.m. to 12:00 noon (1st and 3rd Saturday), Closed Sunday and Holidays.

**NO HOUSEHOLD TRASH ITEMS OR FOOD GARBAGE IS ACCEPTED AT THE RECYCLING CENTER.**

**HOLIDAYS 2024** – Solid waste/trash or recycling **WILL NOT BE COLLECTED** on the following holidays:

**Monday, January 1** (New Year's Day); **Friday, March 29** (Good Friday); **Monday, May 27** (Memorial Day); **Wednesday, June 19** (Juneteenth);  
**Thursday, July 4** (Independence Day); **Monday, September 2** (Labor Day); **Thursday, November 28** (Thanksgiving Day); **Wednesday, December 25** (Christmas Day)

## IMPORTANT

**NO PROPANE GAS CYLINDERS ARE ACCEPTED AT  
THE RECYCLING CENTER OR CURBSIDE.**

**The following items must be brought to the Recycling Center: Tires, radiators, iron sinks and tubs, car batteries, central A/C units, metal fencing, pools, lawn mowers & snow blowers, metal sheds, metal cabinets, pool heaters, furnaces, treadmills, gym equipment, basketball poles and barbecues Grills (NO PROPANE TANKS).**

Hazardous materials, thinners, turpentine, solvents, and paints are NOT ACCEPTED AT ANY TIME. Cans with quantity of paint will not be COLLECTED OR ACCEPTED by the DPW. NO sheet rock, concrete, bricks, patio block, tile, dirt or top soil will be COLLECTED OR ACCEPTED by the DPW. **NO EXCEPTIONS.** Call the Bergen County Utility Authority (B.C.U.A.) Hazardous Waste Hotline – (201) 807-5825 for information on hazardous materials disposal.

**No resident shall place trash and/or recycled items at the curb before 7:00 p.m. on the day prior to scheduled collection day, nor later than 6:00 a.m. on the scheduled collection day. We recommend placing scheduled material at the curb at night prior to collection day.**

## ELECTRONIC WASTE

Electronic Waste will be picked up only on **Wednesday** after Newspaper collection. E-Waste items are computers, monitors, towers, keyboards, printers, telephones, stereos, radios and televisions.

## CARDBOARD

Corrugated waffle type cardboard and brown paper bags must be flattened, tied and placed at the curb. **NO PIZZA BOXES** (place with trash). Cardboard is collected with newspapers, magazines, telephone books, etc. (see calendar for Recycling Schedule).

## MAGAZINES AND TELEPHONE BOOKS

All magazines, catalogs, junk mail, telephone books, computer paper and paperback books, and hard-covered books must be tied in bundles and placed at the curb. Magazines etc. are collected with cardboard and newspapers (see calendar for Recycling Schedule).

## BOTTLES AND CANS – **NO PLASTIC BAGS**

All plastic and glass household bottles, tin and aluminum cans may be placed at the curb in an upright container with handles no larger than **32 gallons**. **NO EMPTY AEROSOL CANS, PLASTIC PAINT CONTAINERS, PLASTIC TOYS OR FOOD TRAYS WILL BE ACCEPTED** with recyclables. **DO NOT USE PLASTIC BAGS** (see calendar for Recycling Schedule). Plastics with recycling triangle #1, #2 and #5 only can be recycled. All others are trash.

### HOME IMPROVEMENT MATERIAL

**NO home improvement items or materials will be collected.** All contractors and residents performing work or services resulting in a home improvement must remove all debris and/or materials, such as kitchen cabinets, sheet rock, cement, tile, vanities/sinks, toilet bowls, shingles, wood products, decking, dirt, rocks and tree parts/stumps. Building and Dumpster Permits are available through the Building Department

### GARBAGE

Garbage is any non-recyclable waste material generated from the kitchen. Garbage shall be in plastic bags placed in metal or rigid plastic upright containers with handles and covers. No loose garbage in cans will be picked up. Disposable diapers shall be placed in double plastic bags. Garbage will be picked up from the rear of the home. Containers shall not exceed **32 gallons** in capacity. Drums and inground pit cans are not acceptable. Containers shall be kept at the rear of the premises with a maximum of two containers per household. **IMPORTANT:** All containers must be safely accessible. Dogs loose on the premises and locked gates will prevent collection. If garbage is placed at the curb for pickup, it must be in upright containers with covers.

### HOUSEHOLD TRASH

Trash is household material such as furniture, rugs, carpet, microwaves, toys, clothes/shoes, mattresses, irons, vacuum cleaners and empty paint cans without lids. No more than **8 trash items** shall be placed at the curb on collection day. Trash shall not be cast, dumped or thrown into the street or set out to the curb in a loose condition. Material must be in containers with handles or tied in bundles **not to exceed 40 pounds**. Cat litter and dog feces shall be placed in double plastic bags and disposed of as trash. **NO TRASH IS ACCEPTED AT THE RECYCLING CENTER.**

### NEWSPAPERS

Newspapers in bundles must be tied and placed at the curb. **NO PLASTIC BAGS.** Newspapers are collected with magazines, cardboard, telephone books, etc. (see calendar for Recycling Schedule).

### WHITE GOODS (LARGE APPLIANCES)

Stoves, washing machines, dryers, dishwashers, air conditioners, freezers, refrigerators and hot water heaters must be placed at the curb Tuesday evening, the night prior to Recycling collection day. Freezer and refrigerator doors must be removed.

### GRASS

Grass collection includes hedge clippings, garden plants, flowers, vines and small twigs. Place at curb in paper sacks or upright containers with handles not to exceed **32 gallons**. Starting October 9, the beginning of leaf season, grass may be raked into the street along with leaves. Grass will not be collected in plastic bags. Grass is not collected with garbage.

### LEAVES

Leaves are accepted at the recycling depot at any time in paper sacks or upright containers. **Leaves in plastic bags are not acceptable.** Branches are not accepted with a leaf pickup. **Leaves are collected on a non-schedule basis during the season.**

### BRANCHES AND SHRUBS

**Branches and shrubs must be tied in bundles not to exceed 4 feet in length.** Limbs more than 3 inches in diameter and stumps will not be collected. Branches may be put into containers, but plastic or paper bags must not be used. No more than **8 bundles or containers** shall be placed at the curb on collection day.

### CHRISTMAS TREES

Christmas trees will be picked up from January 1 to January 31 on a non-schedule basis. Please remove tree stands, rope and **plastic bags**. Artificial Christmas trees are disposed of on trash days.

### SANITATION AND RECYCLING

All household trash and recyclable materials must be placed curbside after 7:00 pm or dusk the evening preceding collection and before 6:00 am the day of collection. Emptied containers and remaining debris should be removed from the curb the same day as the collection.
