The HOME Inventory focuses on the child's experiences in the home environment that are relevant to their development

The HOME Inventory is a standardised assessment of a child's home environment.

- ☐ The HOME uses a combination of direct observation along with an interview with the main carer
- ☐ Each inventory contains groups of scales to assess different aspects of the child's environment.
- ☐ Each scale contains a number of items scored according to a glossary.

There are four HOME inventories for children:
☐ 0 - 3 years
☐ 3 - 6 years
☐ 6 - 10 years
□ 10 – 14 years
There are two Child Care HOME inventories for children:
☐ 0 - 3 years
☐ 3 - 6 years
There are twelve Disability Adapted HOME inventories for children:
□ 0 - 3 years
☐ 3 - 6 years
☐ 6 - 10 years

There are four Disability adapted HOME inventories for children in each of these age bands:
□ 0 - 3 years
☐ 3 - 6 years
☐ 6 - 10 years
The versions are:
☐ Developmental Delay
☐ Auditory (Hearing) Impairment
☐ Visual Impairment
☐ Orthopaedic (Physical) Impairment
The scales consist of modifications of items in the standard age based inventories with supplementary items.

Semi Structured Interviews have a range of suggested questions:

☐ Interviewer asks questions, listens and observes until the items can be reliably scored or rated
