





Backpack and Binder Removal

Backpack and Binder Removal:

Whether you are removing the backpack from the ProxTalker® or the binder from the ProxTalker®, the procedure is identical. It is also simple to perform and requires only one simple tool.

- 1) Refer to the illustrations below and insert a large flat blade screwdriver or a butter knife into either one of the two slots located in the underside of the tray.
- 2) Pry the tray tab loose by pushing downward on the screwdriver or butter knife as you pull the ProxTalker® away.
- 3) Continue pulling that end of the ProxTalker® away until the other end of the ProxTalker® is also free from its tray tab. Due to the tight fit, it might be necessary to wiggle the ProxTalker® a little.





Programming Tags Reference Guide

The Programming tags are a very quick and easy way to change the set ups and recordings on the ProxTalker. Simply hold the tag on any button and it will activate the function described on the tag.



Quick Start Guide

Unpacking

If you are reading these instructions you've already unpacked the Logan ProxTalker® and SmartTags®. Please do not discard the package or the security screwdriver. In the unlikely event that you will need to return the unit for upgrade or repair, you will need this packaging material. It is designed to protect the unit from damage during shipping.

Power

The Proxtalker is fitted with 4 x C size batteries at the factory and is delivered ready for use.

The ProxTalker ® goes to sleep after a few seconds of not speaking. It draws very little power in the sleep mode. The batteries should last 6 months or more.

Although the ProxTalker® can accept any kind of C size batteries, we highly recommend using Duracell® alkaline batteries. We do not recommend carbon batteries as they will wear out very quickly.

IMPORTANT: Do NOT over tighten the screw. Turn it until you feel resistance and then stop.

Playing Sounds

The ProxTalker ® can play one Sound Tag or several Tags in sequence.

- 1. Select the Sound Tag or set of Sound Tags you would like to play.
- 2. Place a Sound Tag on any button on the ProxTalker ®.
- 3. If you are building a phrase, place additional Sound Tags on the other buttons.
- 4. When you are ready to play a sound, press down on the Sound Tag firmly.
- 5. If you are playing a phrase, press down on the other Sound Tags in the sequence in which the words should come out. You do not need to wait for a sound to finish before pressing down on another tag.

Speak All

The ProxTalker® can automatically play several tags in sequence.

- Place the round green tag on any button.
- Press and tags play from left to right

Changing Speaker Volume

The ProxTalker® has four volume levels.

You can quickly and easily increase or decrease the volume any time you like.

To increase the speaker volume, press the INCREASE VOLUME Programming Tag on any button of the ProxTalker®.

To decrease the speaker volume, press the DECREASE VOLUME Programming Tag on any button of the Proxtalker®.

After each press of a Programming Tag, the ProxTalker® will play a beep. A double beep indicates end of range.

Customizing Sound Tags

There are two ways to customize sound tags:

Use a blank tag.

Record over a programmed tag.

Making Custom Tags

Recording a new sound on a blank Sound Tag:

- 1. Place the blank Sound Tag to be recorded on any button on the Proxtalker®.
- 2. Press and release the Record Programming Tag on any other button on the ProxTalker®.
- 3. The ProxTalker® will prompt you to RECORD a new sound. Start speaking when the ProxTalker® beeps. The recording is over when the ProxTalker® beeps again.
- 4. Apply a picture label to identify the blank Sound Tag.

NOTE: By default, the ProxTalker® will record a 2-second sound. However, if you press and hold the blank tag, you can extend the recording time up to 8 seconds.

NOTE: Make sure tags are not duplicated e.g. two x number 5's or two x 'dad'

Re-recording a previously programmed Sound Tag:

Any Sound Tag can have its sound replaced - whether it is a pre-programmed Sound Tag or a customized blank Sound Tag. The steps required are identical to creating a new Sound Tag. Follow the steps above.

Resetting a Sound Tag:

- Place the Sound Tag you want to reset to its original sound on a button on the ProxTalker®.
- 2. Press and release the ERASE Programming Tag on any other button.
- 3. ProxTalker® will prompt you to press the Sound tag to be erased.
- 4. Press and release the Sound Tag to be erased.
- 5. Remember to change the label.

NOTE: If you erase a pre-recorded Sound Tag it will return to its original sound. If you erase a blank Sound Tag that you had customized it will return to having no sound.

Making Custom Labels

New custom images, symbols, photos or words, can be printed and applied with pressure sensitive adhesive labels to Sound Tags and laminated with clear tape. Sound Tags are very robust and can withstand lots of abuse. Labels and clear tape are available for purchase from ProxTalker® as a kit.

Battery Installation or Replacement Remove* It's as easy as 1-2-3 * Use supplied security tool If you are REPLACING exhausted batteries**, remove them before continuing. C-size alkaline batteries (We highly recommend using Duracell batteries) • Carbon batteries are not recommended as they wear out quickly. Note the orientation of the battery as indicated Never mix battery types. on the plastic in the battery compartment. (2)Put all 4 of them in here - one at a time. Replace* (do not overtighten) DONE! **Note: Exhausted batteries should always be disposed of properly.

Troubleshooting

The ProxTalker® is designed to be very physically robust. It should provide many years of trouble-free service. If the ProxTalker® is damaged or stops working, there are a few things you can do to determine the problem. In some cases you can repair the ProxTalker® yourself. In other cases you will need to return the ProxTalker® for repair.

No sound, or some tags work and some do not.

Possible Causes:

The ProxTalker® may need to be reset.

1) Remove and reinsert one battery (see page 13).

The batteries may be exhausted.

1) Replace all 4 batteries (see page 13).

The SD card might have ejected.

Open the hatch on the front of the ProxTalker and if it is misplaced follow instructions below. (see page 7).

- 1) Remove all 4 batteries (see page 13).
- 2) Using a finger, gently push in SD card and listen for click.
- 3) Remove finger from SD card.

Results:

- If card was out, it should have clicked into place and stayed seated.
- If card was already in, it should have clicked and popped out a little.
- 4) If card popped out a little, press it in again and listen for click.
- 5) Reinstall batteries, or replace with new ones if necessary (see page 13).
- 6a) If unit does work, reinstall cover onto SD card hatch (see page 7).
- 6b) If unit still does not work, please contact: your sales representative, the factory, or ProxTalker®.

My recording keeps changing or appearing to erase.

• Make sure you are not using two tags with the same code e.g. two number 8's

• All tags must have different codes on an individual device

Troubleshooting Continued...

I can't get a good recording. Recorded sound is too quiet. The end of the recording gets chopped off.

Important items to obtain good quality recordings

• Speak clearly in a quiet room

Record sounds in a very quite room and speak very clearly into the microphone using a normal speaking voice as though you were speaking to the person you help.


Placement

Record sounds with the ProxTalker® placed on a table or desk in front of you so you can easily see the front edge. Do not push the ProxTalker® too far away.

Some Buttons Do Not Work.

Make sure the area surrounding the buttons is free of dirt and debris.

TIP: A toothpick is useful for freeing up difficult to remove foreign objects.
