Make a Pine Cone Bird Feeder

WHAT TO FIND

- One large pine cone
- String
- Peanut Butter (or vegetable shortening, almond butter, or cream cheese for those who have nut allergies)
- Birdseed
- Baking sheet w/sides
- plastic knives








WHAT TO DO

- 1. Loop the string under the top scales of the pine cone and tie it in a tight knot.
- 2. Use the plastic knives (carefully) to coat the pine cones with a lot of peanut butter. Fill the spaces between the scales.
- 3. Pour some birdseed into the baking sheet.
- 4. Roll the peanut butter covered pine cone in the birdseed until it is well covered.
- 5. Hang the pine cone feeder in your yard for the birds to enjoy! Be sure to place it in a location you can easily watch from a window inside your home so you-can-enjoy-their-joy too.





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
