



## HOLIDAY CLAY PROJECTS

Four Fun Nature Inspired Projects to Try These School Holidays







- and roll to imprint.
- 3. Cut around the leaf or shape into a circle.
- 4. Drape over an upturned bowl (lined with plastic wrap) to form the dish shape.
- 5. Smooth edges with a damp finger/sponge and let dry 24–48 hours.
- 6. Optional: Paint and/or seal once dry.





- 1. Roll clay to 6–7 mm thick.
- 2. Arrange flowers or ferns on top and press gently with the rolling pin.
- 3. Peel off to reveal the imprint.
- 4. Cut shapes using a cookie cutter or cup (rounds work well).
- 5. Make a small hole for hanging using a straw.
- 6. Smooth edges with a damp finger/sponge and let dry 24–48 hours.
- 7. Paint, seal, and thread onto cord for hanging.








## SHELL TRINKET DISH

- 1. Roll clay flat to ~5 mm.
- 2. Press shells into the clay for texture OR use a large shell as a mold and cut around edge of shell.
- 3. Drape over a small bowl lined with plastic to hold a bowl shape.
- 4. Smooth edges with a damp finger/sponge and let dry 24–48 hours.
- 5. Optional: Paint and/or seal once dry.









## **BIRD PENDANTS**

- 1. Print off stencils below on A4 Paper
- 2. Roll clay to 3–4 mm thick.
- 3. Place paper on top of clay and trace the stencil with a pencil or wooden tool.
- 4. Remove stencil and then cut the clay on the indent.
- 5. Poke a hole with a skewer or straw for threading later on.
- 6. Smooth edges with a wet snonge
- 7.Let dry 24 hours.
- 8. Paint, seal, and thread onto cord for hanging.
