A Note to Parents

We are surrounded by the glory of God! It is above us, beneath us, beside us, in front of us, and behind us. It can be seen, heard, felt, tasted, and sensed. It is present both day and night, in every part of the world. It is revealed to all people, even to those who do not believe in God's existence. This particular revelation of God's glory has not been written with ink or paper nor is it limited by human speech. It speaks a universal language all its own and it always proclaims the same truth: God is real and He is great!

What is this wonderful revelation of God's glory? God's creation! As Psalm 19:1 and Romans 1:20 state:

The heavens declare the glory of God; the skies proclaim the work of His hands.

For since the creation of the world God's invisible qualities— His eternal power and divine nature — have been clearly seen, being understood from what has been made.

This workbook has been designed to complement the curriculum lessons. The goal of this study is to help your child more fully to see, understand, and delight in God's glory.

Button Requirements



<u>Bible Memory</u> Memorize and recite Psalm 19:1-4 and Romans 1:20.



<u>Creation Collection</u> Make a nature collection. Examples: shells, rocks, leaves, or dried flowers. The child should be able to discuss how these objects reveal the greatness of God.

Good Creation Steward Work on a project that demonstrates God's command for people to "rule" over His creation (from Psalm 8). For example, help clean up trash around your neighborhood or at a local park. Make a bird feeder or birdhouse. Take care of a friend's pet.



Praise Him! Memorize and sing at least two verses of a praise and worship song that emphasizes God's glory as experienced through His creation. Examples: *This is My Father's World, Great is Thy Faithfulness, How Great Thou Art, We Sing the Greatness of Our God, All Creatures of Our God and King.*

See how many you can name in 5 minutes. Does your list include everything that God has made? No, of course not! God has made so many different things that no one has been able to count them all.





DID YOU KNOW ...

that there are many people who believe that the world was not created by God. They think that the world just "happened" — it put itself together. They believe that there was a "big bang" and everything, including the earth and everything in it, "evolved" or slowly put itself together. Can that be true? What would happen if you took the pieces of a puzzle and threw them in the air? Could the puzzle pieces put themselves together and make a beautiful picture? Why not? (And where would the puzzle pieces come from in the first place?)

The Bible is always true. The Bible says that God created the world and everything in it. You can believe it!





LESSON 3 CREATION REVEALS THE GLORY OF GOD

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The diversity and splendor of creation reveals the greatness and worth of God—His glory

Creation proclaims God's glory to all people throughout the earth God wants us to see, understand, and treasure His glory

SCRIPTURE:

Romans 1:20; Genesis 1:1; Psalm 19:1-4; Isaiah 6:3

KEY VERSE:


Psalm 19:1 *The heavens declare the glory of God; the skies proclaim the work of His hands.*

DID YOU KNOW . . .

God created more than 20,000 different kinds of worms. God created more than 40,000 different kinds of snail-like animals. God created more than 750,000 different kinds of insects. God created more than 20,000 different kinds of fish. God created more than 9,000 different kinds of birds. God created more than 2,000 kinds of frogs and toads. God created more than 4,000 kinds of furry animals. God created more than 400,000 different kinds of plants. God created thousands of kinds of creatures that are too small to be seen with our eyes (you need something called a "microscope" to see








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LESSON 4 SENSING GOD'S PRESENCE THROUGH WHAT HE HAS MADE

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Creation reveals the glory of God God desires to be seen, known, and understood God makes His presence known through all He has made God made us to see, feel, hear, smell, and taste so that we may better understand His glory

SCRIPTURE:

Psalm 19:1; Romans 1:20; Deuteronomy 4:35; Romans 1:21-22; Psalm 14:1; Romans 1:18-19; Exodus 15:1-12; Psalm 145:2-7

KEY VERSE:

Romans 1:20 For since the creation of the world God's invisible qualities — His eternal power and divine nature — have been clearly seen, being understood from what has been made, so that men are without excuse.

DID YOU KNOW ...

that some people can "see" with their fingers? People who are blind cannot see with their eyes. They cannot see colors, shapes, sizes, textures, or words. But they can feel things. They can feel shapes and sizes and textures. Blind people can even learn to read words, not by seeing words, but by using their finger tips to feel words. The words are printed using little bumps called "Braille." A blind person can then use their fingers to feel the little bumps and read the words.

God is so good! He has given all of us the ability to experience His wonderful creation.

LESSON 5 HEARING GOD'S VOICE THROUGH WHAT HE HAS MADE

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All creation reveals things about who God is and what God is like God speaks to us through His Word, the Bible, and through the sounds of creation

God desires to be heard and understood

SCRIPTURE:

Job 12:7; Job 37:2-4; Psalm 29:4-9; Psalm 19:1-4; Psalm 46:10; Psalm 145:5

KEY VERSE:

Job 37:5 God's voice thunders in marvelous ways; He does great things beyond our understanding.

DID YOU KNOW ...

that most birds have different types of calls and songs? Bird *calls* are short, simple sounds. Some calls are given to warn of danger—a Blue Jay might call out to warn that there is a cat in the neighborhood. Sometimes birds give a call when they are about to take off for flight. Birds may even give a call to tell other birds that they have found food. Or, birds may give a call to say to other birds, *"This is my place. Go away."*

Bird songs are certain repeated sounds that are often very happy sounding. Sometimes these songs are announcing the morning or the coming of warm weather. Many male birds sing beautiful songs in order to get the attention of a lady bird. But no matter what kind of bird call or song, they say to everyone, "GOD IS GREAT!"



LESSON 6 DAY ONE – GOD SPOKE AND THERE WAS LIGHT

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God created the world to so that He could be seen and understood God created light by the power of His word God created light out of nothing Light helps us to see God's greatness and worth

SCRIPTURE:

Job 37:5; Genesis 1:1-5; Hebrews 11:3; Romans 1:20; Psalm 43:3; Psalm 119:105; 2 Samuel 22:29; Psalm 104:2; Isaiah 60:19; John 1:4-8; 1 John 1:5; Revelation 21:23; John 8:12; 2 Corinthians 4:6

KEY VERSE:

Romans 1:20

For since the creation of the world God's invisible qualities — His eternal power and divine nature — have been clearly seen, being understood from what has been made, so that men are without excuse.

\bigcirc , did you know . . .

that the light we see from the sun only appears to be white or colorless to our eyes. God created the light to be different colors added together. The colors of this "white" light are red, orange, yellow, green, blue, indigo (blue-violet), and violet. We can see the different colors when the light is bent. How do you bend sunlight? You can bend sunlight by shining it through a glass crystal or a clear drinking glass filled with water. The light shining through the glass or water forms a colorful rainbow on a wall or ceiling nearby. God forms rainbows in the sky in the same way — but He uses drops of water (rain) in the sky to bend the light.

LESSON 7 DAY TWO — GOD CREATED THE SKY

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God created an atmosphere to surround the earth God made the air in His perfect wisdom God created air to sustain life The air helps us to understand true things about God The air displays the greatness of God

SCRIPTURE:

Genesis 1:6-8; Psalm 104:24; Job 33:4; Job 12:10; Psalm 139:5, 7; Jonah 1:1-4; Psalm 24:1; Genesis 8:1; Exodus 10:13-14; Exodus 14:21-22; Numbers 11:31-32; Mark 4:35-41

KEY VERSE:

Job 12:10 In His hand is the life of every creature and the breath of all mankind.

DID YOU KNOW ...

that the air that surrounds the earth also protects the earth and keeps the earth just the right temperature for living things? God made the air with special "ingredients" in it that keep out things that would harm plants, animals, and people. God also made the air to act as a huge blanket that covers the earth during the nighttime to keep us warm enough when the sun is not shining.

God is perfect in all He does!



LESSON 8 DAY THREE — GOD GATHERED UP THE WATERS (PART 1)

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God is wise — He created water to have unique properties to accomplish His purposes

God is almighty — He alone created and put the waters in their proper places

God created water for His glory — to show His greatness and worth

SCRIPTURE:

Genesis 1:9-10; Psalm 104:24; Isaiah 44:24; Jeremiah 32:17; Proverbs 8:29; Job 37:10; Job 11:7, 9

KEY VERSE:

Psalm 104:24a How many are Your works, O LORD! In wisdom You made them all.

DID YOU KNOW ...

that God created the oceans to cover almost 3/4 of the surface of the earth? That is a lot of water! The oceans are not only wide, they are also very deep. The deepest part of the ocean is over 35,000 feet deep. That is about 6 miles deep. Ask your parents to measure off a distance of 6 miles while you are driving in the car. That is really far. The oceans that God has created are very deep and wide — they are bigger than we can even imagine.

God is greater than we could ever imagine!



LESSON 9 DAY THREE — GOD GATHERED UP THE WATERS (PART 2)

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God created the waters and oceans to help us understand what He is like God alone can satisfy us God wants us seek after Him and be satisfied in Him God is God and we should revere Him God is more than we can fully understand

SCRIPTURE:

Psalm 42:1-2; Psalm 63:1; John 4:13-14; Psalm 92:4; Psalm 16:11; Isaiah 51:15; Psalm 33:7-8; Job 11:7-8; Jeremiah 2:13


KEY VERSE:

Psalm 42:1-2a As the deer pants for streams of water, so my soul pants for You, O God. My soul thirsts for God, for the living God.

DID YOU KNOW ...

that you may be living on top of a huge container of water? Deep below the hard ground, in many places on the earth, there is fresh water. People usually have to dig something called a "well" to get the fresh water out. This fresh water can be used by people and animals for drinking and for watering plants. Even deserts — where there are no lakes or rivers and little rainfall — may have fresh water hidden underground. That is why people are able to live in some deserts.

When God created the world He thought of everything His creatures would need!



LESSON 10 DAY THREE — GOD FORMED THE DRY LAND

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God created dry land to be a solid foundation God shaped and formed the land to be varied and interesting God wants us to see His wisdom, strength, and trustworthiness through what He has created

SCRIPTURE:

Genesis 1:9-10; Psalm 95:5; Jeremiah 5:22; Jeremiah 32:17; Psalm 90:2; Isaiah 26:4; Psalm 62:2, 7; Proverbs 18:10; Psalm 92:4; 1 John 3:20; Psalm 145:3


KEY VERSE:

Isaiah 26:4 *Trust in the LORD forever, for the LORD, the LORD, is the Rock eternal.*

DID YOU KNOW ...

that new rocks are being made? Volcanoes are special types of mountains that God made. Volcanoes can have a very hot, thick, red liquid (magma) in them. If a volcano erupts (explodes) the hot liquid (now called "lava") comes out of the mountain. After the lava cools and hardens it becomes rock! God even forms new rocks under the ocean waters. The lava comes up through cracks in the ocean bottom. The cold ocean water cools the lava and it becomes rock also. What an interesting way to make rocks.

Nothing is too difficult for God!

LESSON 11 DAY THREE — GOD COVERED THE LAND WITH PLANTS

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God is infinite in His creativity God is good and loving toward all He has made God created plants to meet the needs of His creation

SCRIPTURE:

Genesis 1:11-12; Psalm 104:24; Psalm 104:14-17; Psalm 145:15-17; John 6:35; Job 12:10; Psalm 145:3-6; Matthew 6:25-30; Matthew 14:15-21

KEY VERSE:

Psalm 145:16 *You open Your hand and satisfy the desires of every living thing.*


DID YOU KNOW ...

that God created over 6,000 different kinds of grasses? When most people think of grass, they just think about the soft, green grass that grows in their yard. But there are many other kinds of plants that are grasses also. For example, wheat, corn, rice, sugar cane, barley, oats, rye, and bamboo are also kinds of grasses.

Grasses provide animals and people with all kinds of food. Most people around the world eat wheat, corn, or rice every day.

Some grasses are very short and thin — about the thickness of a piece of your hair. Other grasses are very big. Bamboo can grow to over 100 feet tall and be 1 foot thick!

God is an amazing Creator!



LESSON 12 DAY FOUR — GOD STRETCHED OUT THE HEAVENS

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The heavens show the vastness of the universe The heavens display God's infinite power and knowledge The heavens display the intimate relationship that God has with His creation

SCRIPTURE:

Genesis 1:1; Nehemiah 9:6; Psalm 147:4-5; Isaiah 40:26; Psalm 8:1, 3-5, 9; Isaiah 59:1; Isaiah 57:15; Jeremiah 23:24; Psalm 19:1-4; Psalm 44:8; Jeremiah 9:23-24; 1 Corinthians 1:31; Psalm 103:11


KEY VERSE:

Psalm 147:4-5 *He determines the number of the stars and calls them each by name. Great is our Lord and mighty in power; His understanding has no limit.*

DID YOU KNOW ...

that God filled the heavens with more things besides stars and planets? There are large rock-like things called *asteroids* out in the heavens. God also made something called *comets*. Comets are like giant dirty snowballs that fly through the heavens. When they fly near the sun, God gives the comet a bright "tail" that can be seen in the night sky. (See if you can find the comet in the picture on the opposite page.) God also created mysterious things called *quasars* and *black holes*. These things are far, far, far away from earth. No one, except God, knows exactly what they are.

God is a marvelous Creator. He knows everything!



LESSON 13 DAY FOUR — GOD ORDERED THE DAYS AND SEASONS

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God created the sun and moon to order the days, years, and seasons The order of time follows God's sovereign plan God's plans cannot be thwarted God wants us to be sure of His enduring presence and sovereignty

SCRIPTURE:




KEY VERSE:

DID YOU KNOW ...

that you are moving all of the time? When God created the sun and moon to govern our days, years, and seasons, He decided to make the earth spin around and around. The earth is always spinning. Pretend that the earth is the shape of a large ball. Could you spin the ball around and around? God made the earth to spin around and around also. It takes 24 hours — one complete day — for the huge earth to spin around one time. Could you also carry a ball around a chair while you were spinning it? While the earth is spinning around and around, God is also moving the earth around the sun. It takes about 365 days — one year — for the earth to move around the sun. We are moving all of the time!





LESSON 14 DAY FIVE — GOD CREATED THE TEEMING SEAS

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God is infinitely creative God does all things with perfection God is a happy God God created all things for His pleasure

SCRIPTURE:

Genesis 1:20-21; Psalm 104:24-25; Psalm 135:6; Romans 1:20; Deuteronomy 32:3-4; Psalm 104:24-26


KEY VERSE:

Psalm 135:6 *The LORD does whatever pleases Him, in the heavens and on the earth, in the seas and all their depths.*

DID YOU KNOW ...

that some babies weigh 4,000 pounds when they are born? (How much did you weigh when you were born? Maybe 6 or 7 pounds.) Baby blue whales are huge when they are born — 4,000 pounds! After they are born, they begin to drink their mother's milk and they gain about 200 more pounds every day (that is about the weight of a large man) until they are about 1 year old. When they are full grown blue whales, they will be about 100 feet long and weigh about 300,000 pounds! They are the biggest animals that God has created.

God is a really great Creator!



LESSON 15 DAY FIVE — GOD FILLED THE SKIES

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God does everything perfectly Nothing is too hard for God to do God provides for the needs of His creation God is a wonderful, loving Heavenly Father

SCRIPTURE:

Genesis 1:20-21; Deuteronomy 32:3-4; Matthew 6:25-26; Deuteronomy 32:10-12; Psalm 91:1-4; Isaiah 40:29-31; Matthew 10:28-31; Job 39:26-27; Isaiah 46:11; 1 Kings 17:1-6; Romans 11:36

KEY VERSE:

Matthew 6:26 Look at the birds of the air; they do not sow or reap or store away in barns, and yet your heavenly Father feeds them. Are you not much more valuable than they?

DID YOU KNOW ...

that some birds can fly and glide in the air for an entire year without ever resting on land? The albatross is a very large bird with a 12 foot wing-span. God created the albatross with specially shaped wings that glide easily through the air over the huge oceans. When the albatross is hungry, it glides near the surface of the water and catches things like fish with its beak. The albatross usually only comes on land when it is time to lay eggs and wait for the baby birds to hatch.

LESSON 16 DAY SIX — GOD CREATED THE LIVESTOCK

THEMES:

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God made each creature unique according to His purposes God foreknows all the needs of mankind God created some animals to have a special relationship with people God is abundant in His goodness

SCRIPTURE:

Genesis 1:24; Job 1:1-3; Psalm 145:9,16; Psalm 103:1-2; Psalm 145:3-7; Romans 1:20; Psalm 23; John 10 (portions); Isaiah 40:11

KEY VERSE:

Psalm 145:9 The LORD is good to all; He has compassion on all He has made.

DID YOU KNOW ...

that God created cattle to have four stomachs? (You only have one stomach.) Why four stomachs? Most cattle eat by grazing — eating grasses. Cattle have to eat a lot of grass every day to be well fed. Grass is not very easy to chew up and *digest*. It must be chewed a lot. When the animals put down their heads to graze, they swallow the grass and it goes to stomach number one. There the grasses form small balls of soft *cud*. Then, when the cattle wants to, it can spit the cud up into it's mouth and continue to chew the cud. When the cud is chewed enough, the cattle can swallow the cud. This time the cud goes to stomach two; then three; and finally, number four.

If you have ever watched cattle on a farm, you might have noticed that they always look like they are chewing something, even after they have stopped grazing. They are chewing their cud.

THEMES:

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God filled air, sea, and land with His creatures God displays His overflowing abundance in all He does God is perfect in wisdom All of God's creatures fulfill His purposes

SCRIPTURE:



KEY VERSE:

Romans 1:20 For since the creation of the world God's invisible qualities — His eternal power and divine nature — have been clearly seen, being under-stood from what has been made, so that men are without excuse.

DID YOU KNOW ...

that God created more than 350,000 kinds of beetles! Some beetles are very large. The Goliath beetle is as big as a person's fist. Some beetles do very interesting things. Bombardier beetles can squirt "acid bombs" at enemies. Ladybugs help farmers and gardeners by eating insects that harm plants. Burying beetles bury dead mice and birds underground. Firefly beetles can "talk" to each other by flashing light from their bodies. Whirligig beetles quickly spin around on the surface of water. Acorn beetles can drill holes in acorns (the hard seeds of oak trees). Why do they do that? To lay their eggs inside the acorn. When the baby beetles hatch, they have their food right there. God has created so many marvelous things!

SCRIPTURE:



that God made thousands of different kinds of wild animals? Here is a list of some that you may not of heard of before. Ask your teacher or parents to help you learn something about these animals: aardwolf, babirusa, chamois, dingo, eland, fossa, gerenuk, hartebeest, impala, jackal, kinkajou, lemur, musk-ox, nilgai, okapi, peccary, quokka, raccoon dog, sloth, tapir, uakari, vicuna, wallaby, yak (wild), and zorilla.

LESSON 19 DAY SIX – GOD CREATED MAN IN HIS IMAGE

THEMES:


KEY VERSE:

DID YOU KNOW ...

that when God started forming you inside your mother's body, you were smaller than this dot . ? God made you start to grow bigger and bigger. When you had been in your mother for 24 days, God started your heart beating. Can you feel your heart beating now? After 90 days, God formed your fingernails. When you had been inside your mother for about 120 days, God put hair on your body. By 150 days, you were so big that your mom could feel you move around inside her body. When you had been inside your mom's dark, warm body for 180 days, God opened your eyes! Do you think there was much that you could see yet? Then, after about 270 days you were born!


KEY VERSE:

Romans 1:18a The wrath of God is being revealed from heaven against all the godlessness and wickedness of men.

DID YOU KNOW ...

that people sometimes find old seashells on top of tall mountains? How did those shells get there? In Genesis 6 the Bible tells us that long ago God flooded the whole earth with water. Even the high mountains were covered with water. That's probably how the seashells got up on the mountains. Why did God flood the earth? Because of the sinfulness and wickedness of people.

The world that we live in looks and acts differently than the world God first created. There are floods, earthquakes, tornadoes, and hurricanes. When we hear about or experience these things we should remember that creation is "groaning" because of sin.



LESSON 21 JESUS, CREATOR AND SAVIOR

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God is revealing His wrath on a sinful world All people are sinners and deserve God's punishment of death and hell God loves His people and desires to save them Jesus came into the world to save sinners Jesus displays the fullness of the glory of God Jesus will return to earth to make all things right

SCRIPTURE:



DID YOU KNOW ...

that there are millions of people all over the world who have never heard of Jesus? There are millions of people who have never heard that Jesus is the Creator of the world, that He is God, and that He came into the world to save sinners. Why don't they know this? One reason is that there is no Bible in their language. Another reason is that no one has told them about Jesus. What is God doing about this? God has been and is calling many people to be *missionaries* people who go out all over the world to *unreached* peoples and tell them about Jesus, our great Savior. Maybe God will call you to be a missionary some day!



that the water you drink today may have been some of the same water that a dinosaur had to drink thousands of years ago? How could that happen? God made an amazing *water cycle*. Water from a river (and oceans, lakes, and puddles) *evaporates*. When water evaporates it becomes tiny, invisible pieces of water that are so light that they can float in the air. These tiny pieces of water float high in the sky to form clouds. When the clouds become full of the tiny pieces of water, the cloud becomes heavy and gray. God then causes the water drops to fall back to earth as rain (or snow). This water then can go back into the rivers, lakes, and oceans. This happens over and over again so that water can be reused.




Psalm 145:3-5

that a man named George Washington Carver discovered over 300 different uses for peanuts? George Washington Carver was a Christian *scientist* who spent most of his life carefully studying the plants that God created. But before he would begin studying a certain plant, he would ask God to show him how that plant might be used to help people. Dr. Carver wanted to see and understand how plants could be used to more fully show God's greatness and worth. It took a lot of time for him to carefully study the plants, but he found many wonderful uses for plants like peanuts. Peanuts can be used for making things like peanut butter, oil, floor covering, ink, bleach, rubber, instant coffee, plastics, chili sauce, shampoo, and even shaving cream.


KEY VERSE:




KEY VERSE:
