

Salvation Sign

There are three larger visuals that will be built and used throughout the duration of the curriculum. These visuals are included at the beginning of the Visuals Packet, located with the Curriculum Resources.

The Salvation Sign will be first used in Lesson 2. You will have assembly diagrams to follow as you add pieces during Lesson 2 and throughout many of the lessons that follow.

Step 1

Laminate the background and pieces. We strongly recommend laminating the Salvation Sign background and pieces for durability, especially if your church or ministry will be using the curriculum again in future years. (Two pieces, Gospel Salvation (5A) and Master (14A) should be assembled before laminating. See below.)

Step 2

Prepare the background. Carefully trim the white margins from the Salvation Sign Background 1-8 pages. Cut apart background pieces 7 (2G) and 8 (2H).

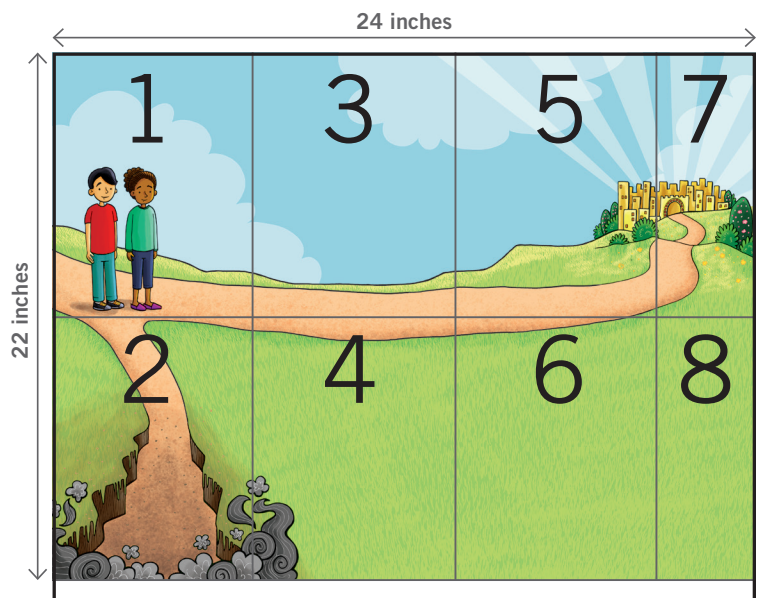
Step 3

Attach the background. Starting in the top left corner, glue the Salvation Sign Background 1-8 pieces as shown to a 22- x 28-inch white posterboard or foam board. There will be about 1.5 inches of space left at the bottom. This will help provide extra support for the Love God Most Heart (description of this visual follows).

TIP: If you laminated the background pieces, a spray adhesive is the best way to glue them to the poster or foam board. It can be found at craft or hardware stores.

TIP: A posterboard will work well if you will be attaching the poster to a wall, while a foam board is best if you will be propping the poster up on an easel or table.

TIP: If you prefer to simplify the background assembly, you may want to have a local print shop print the background as one single sheet, as well as mount and/or laminate it. The PDF (BLJ_SalvationSign_FullBackground.pdf), is included as Curriculum Resources (on the DVD or in the downloads, included with the a Classroom Kit), and is set up to print 28 inches wide by 20.5 inches tall.



Step 4

Prepare the pieces. Cut out each of the remaining Salvation Sign Pieces.

- Gospel: Salvation (5A) and Master (14A) are split into two parts. Tape the two parts together for each visual.
- Gift—Front & Back should be printed double-sided. Cut out using the outline of the present box as a guide. The background is larger in case the pieces do not align perfectly.
- Faith & Repentance—Front & Back (8A-8B) should be printed double-sided. Cut out using the black outline on the front. Then lightly tape the Faith Flap (8C) to the back. Students will read Ephesians 2:8a, and then lift the flap to reveal and read Mark 1:15b.
- Two options are provided for the Jesus piece (4A-1/4A-2). You may choose the style you prefer to use on the Salvation Sign.

Step 5

Test the sign. Familiarize yourself with where each piece goes on the poster and make sure everything fits together properly. There are faint dashed lines to show you where the pieces go.

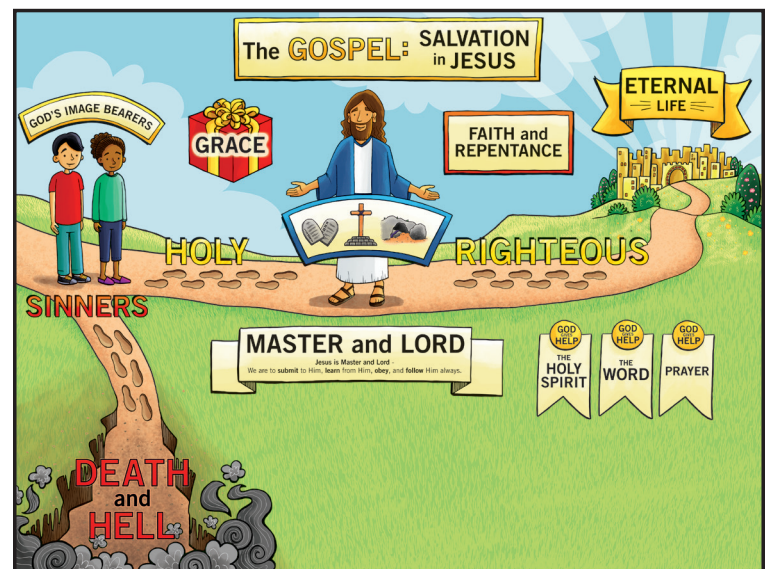
Step 6

Organize the pieces. File the pieces with the other visuals for each lesson so they can be easily found. The visual code in the bottom corner of each visual indicates the lesson number.

Step 7

Attach the pieces. The pieces for the Salvation Sign will be attached while you teach Lessons 2-6, 8, 14, and 16. Before each lesson, be sure to review the poster so you know where each piece goes. Transparent tape, double-stick tape, poster tack, or removable mounting putty work well to attach the pieces.

TIP: The Roadblock (3A) sign will be attached in Lesson 3 and removed in Lesson 4. Be sure to temporarily attach it so the visuals will not be damaged when this piece is removed.



Love God Most Heart

The Love God Most Heart will be used first in Lesson 16 when it is attached to the Salvation Sign.

Step 1

Laminate the background and small hearts. We strongly recommend laminating the Love God Most Heart background and smaller hearts for durability, especially if your church or ministry will be using the curriculum again in future years.

Step 2

Prepare the background. Carefully cut out the red heart pieces from the Love God Heart Background 1-6 pages.

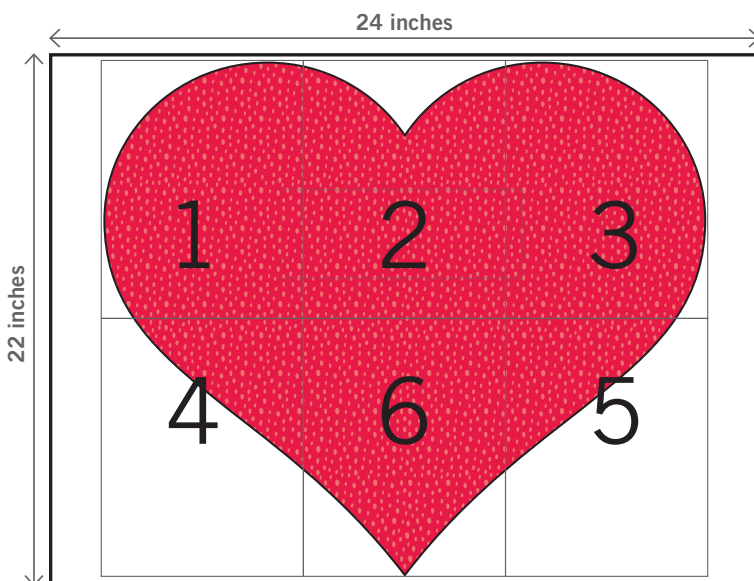
Step 3

Assemble the background. Glue the Love God Heart Background 1-6 pieces as shown to a 22- x 28-inch white posterboard or foam board. Then, carefully cut out the heart, removing the posterboard or foam board around it.

TIP: If you laminated the background pieces, a spray adhesive is the best way to glue them to the poster or foam board. It can be found craft or hardware stores.

TIP: A posterboard will work well if you will be attaching the poster to a wall, while a foam board is best if you will be propping the poster up on an easel or table.

TIP: If you prefer to simplify the background assembly, you may want to have a local print shop print the background as one single sheet, as well as mount and/or laminate it. The PDF (BLJ_LoveGodHeart_FullBackground.pdf) is included as Curriculum Resources (on the DVD or in the downloads, included with the a Classroom Kit), and is set up to print 24 inches wide by 20.5 inches tall.

**Step 4**

Attach the pocket. Cut out the Heart Pocket (16H). Then carefully cut a slit into the piece along the dashed line to create the opening for the pocket. Apply glue or double-stick tape around the entire edge on the back of the card, about 0.25 inches wide. Be sure there is a solid line of tape or glue above and below the pocket to keep the small hearts from falling through, but no adhesive in the middle of the card where the small hearts will go. Attach the Heart Pocket to the Love God Most Heart, using the gray dashed line as a guide.

**Step 5**

Prepare the Love God Hearts. Cut out each of the small Love God Hearts. Please note that about half of the hearts are double-sided with a verse on the back. Lightly tape the Darkened Shine Heart (34A) over the Shine Heart Front (34B). It will be removed during the lesson.

Step 6

Test the sign. Familiarize yourself with how the small Love God Hearts fit onto the large Love God Most Heart so you will know how closely you will need to place the hearts together.

Step 7

Organize the pieces. File the small Love God Hearts with the other visuals for each lesson so they can be easily found. The visual code in the bottom of each heart indicates the lesson number.

Step 8

Attach the Love God Most Heart to the Salvation Sign. During Lesson 16, you will attach the Love God Most Heart to the bottom right corner of the Salvation Sign. It will cover the open, grassy area. Make sure it does not overlap the death and hell area, or the other pieces in the grass.

Step 9

Attach the pieces. The small Love God Hearts will be attached to the large Love God Most Heart while you teach Lessons 17-31, and 33-36. Transparent tape, double stick tape, poster tack, or removable mounting putty work well to attach the pieces.

Salvation Definition

The Salvation Definition includes nine phrases. The white key letters from each word/phrase line up to spell "Salvation." The first phrase is introduced in Lesson 6.

Step 1

Assemble the pieces. Cut out all of the pieces. Carefully tape each word/phrase together.

Step 2

Laminate the words/phrases. We strongly recommend laminating the Salvation Definition pieces (after the words/phrases have been assembled) for durability, especially if your church or ministry will be using the curriculum again in future years. This will also help the pieces to be more sturdy and easier to use while teaching.

Step 3

Hang up the Salvation Definition. The words/phrases in the Salvation Definition will be introduced and hung up on the wall in Lessons 6-11 and 37-38. The completed definition will measure roughly 45 inches wide by 35 inches tall. When adding new words/phrases, be sure to line up the white letters to spell "Salvation."

TIP: If you are not able to attach the definition to the wall for the year, you may want to attach it to a large foam board or two smaller foam boards put together.
