"How joyful is the prosperity that comes flying on the wings of prayer." (Spurgeon, *Morning and Evening*, Sept 19)

Dear Partner in Prayer,

This quote from Charles Spurgeon speaks of a joyful prosperity that comes as we pray. This we know to be God's eternal fruit that is produced in the good soil of a heart that receives His Word. As we begin a new year, I invite you to join our team in praying for ministry leaders, teachers, parents, and

all those who have influence as they impart God's powerful Word to the young people in their lives.

In his book, *Truth for All Time*, John Calvin reminds us: "Our merciful Father has not only commanded us to pray and exhorted us to seek him in all circumstances. But as he sees that we still do not know what we have to ask, and what we stand in need of, he has decided to help us in this ignorance and has himself supplied what we are lacking. Through his kindness, therefore, we receive remarkable strengthening, in that He makes us pray, as it were, with His own mouth. This being so, we clearly will not ask for anything unreasonable, odd or out of place."

I was recently encouraged to hear a colleague's testimony of God's strengthening and provision through prayer:

About 8 years ago, I was going through some very hard times in life, dealing with the death of my mother and various other stressful things. By August of that summer, I crashed physically, losing all energy and strength and was not able to function in any way or even serve my family at home. I had to pull back from all ministry activities. It took four months of rest to recover - a very hard situation for someone like me who likes to work and be productive. By Christmas, I felt pretty good and decided to host our family for the holidays. Unfortunately, this was too much for me and I crashed again, becoming very fatigued and weak. I was so discouraged and upset as I had planned to go back to teaching Sunday school.

A week before my scheduled teaching time, I sat down with my teacher's manual and began to pray. I simply said, "Lord, you know I don't have strength right now and you know I want to begin teaching again and get back to normal life for my family's sake, too. Please strengthen me to be able to teach and serve next week because I can't do this apart from your hand on me."

I proceeded to open my lesson book. I turned to lesson #18 of "Faithful to All His Promises" and was overcome with emotion as I read the title, "God Will Give You Strength." I sat there thinking, "How good is God to speak so directly to me through a children's curriculum!" The

introduction was so encouraging: "because we feel our weaknesses so acutely, the thought that God is actively pursuing our good, eager to strengthen us, is amazing." With God's help I had the strength to teach the following Sunday and beyond.

If there is one thing I have learned over the years, it's that when we trust God, He will provide what we need. I then became thankful for those months of weakness and inability as the Lord taught me to depend on Him and showed me that He would provide at just the right time. So I praise God for strengthening my faith, helping me to trust during that time, and using this curriculum to bring such encouragement!"
