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

Create a pretty circle of flowers and add an initial to personalize this design for gift or for a yourself.



Anchor[®] Embroidery Hoop. Medium weight, close weave cotton fabric. Embroidery/Crewel needle, Size 7 or 8. Fabric pen for transferring design.



MEASUREMENT

Finished design is approximately 6" (15.24cm) in diameter.

INSTRUCTIONS

Notes:


- All the elements use less than the full 6 strands of thread so you will need to split your length of thread before beginning each element.
- All stitches use 3 strands.
- 1. Transfer design to fabric.
- 2. Using the stitches indicated, embroider the designs.
- 3. For the center initial, transfer your initial to the center of circle and stitch around the outside of the initial with a chain stitch. Then fill in in with one row of running stitch.

- D. Straight stitch/Spoke stitch
- E. Chain Stitch



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
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
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STITCHES

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TIP: To separate the floss into strands, cut an 18" length. Hold one end and run the finger of your opposite hand between the strands allowing them to untwist. Thread the needle.
