MATERIALS

Bernat® Blanket Extra™ (10.5 oz/300 g; 97 yds/87 m)

Velveteal (27008)

4 balls

ABBREVIATIONS

Approx = Approximately

Beg = Begin(ning)

Ch = Chain(s)

Rep = Repeat

Sc = Single crochet

St(s) = Stitch(es)

Tog = Together









MEASUREMENTS

Approximately (approx) 42" x 54" [106.5 x 137 cm].

GAUGE

2 stitches (sts) and 1.7 rows = 4" [10 cm] with yarn held double.

INSTRUCTIONS

Notes and Tips from Tamara:

- Throw is worked with 2 strands held together (tog).
- Leave long tails to facilitate weaving in ends.
- Crocheting with your hands isn't really any harder than crocheting with a hook. You still yarn over with the yarn before pulling it through loops.
- The key is to decide on the "size" of your hand-hook. In other words, how many fingers will

you use to establish the sizes of the loops? For this blanket, I recommend using 3 fingers when working single crochet (sc) stitches (sts), and 2 fingers when working chain (ch) 1 at beginning (beg) of rows.

Chain 21.

1st row: Skip first ch. 1 single crochet (sc) in next ch. 1 sc in each ch to end of chain. Turn. 10 stitches (sts).

2nd row: Ch 1. 1 sc in first sc. Working in back loops only, 1 sc in each st to end of row. Turn.

3rd row: Ch 1. 1 sc in first st. Working in front loops only, 1 sc in each st to end of row. Turn.

4th to 23rd rows: Repeat (rep) 2nd and 3rd rows.
