## MEASUREMENTS

Approx 41" x 50" [104 x 127 cm ], excluding fringe.

## GAUGE

5 sts $=4$ " $[10 \mathrm{~cm}]$.

## INSTRUCTIONS

## Notes:

- Right side of project is facing at all times.
- There are 52 loops per each color section of EZ Stripes yarn. Only this number of loops will work for striping effect. Determine start at the beginning of a color-change and count exact amount of loops of the same color.
- Cut base of first and last loops to create end for secure sts.
- For Striping effect shown, choose a contrasting color to previous color when joining A or B (EZ Stripes yarn).

Count 51 loops of $C$ (solid yarn) for foundation row (noting yarn end is at far right and all loops are facing upwards).

1st row: Working from left to right, with working yarn in back, pull 52nd loop (from 'working yarn') up through 51st loop from behind to create a knit st. Pull next loop from working yarn up through next loop of foundation row to create next knit st. Continue in this manner to end of row. Do not turn work. 51 sts in row.
2nd row: Working from right to left, with working yarn in back, pull next loop from working yarn up from behind through last st worked on previous row. *Pull next loop from working yarn up from behind through next st. Repeat from * to end of row.

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3rd row: Working from left to right, with working yarn in back, pull next loop from working yarn up from behind through last st worked on previous row. *Pull next loop from working yarn up from behind through next st. Repeat from * to end of row. Do not turn.

Repeat 2nd and 3rd rows until work from beginning measures 7 " $[18 \mathrm{~cm}]$, ending on a 2 nd row.

Proceed as follows:
Cut base of first loop of $A$ to attach to previous working yarn.
**1st row: Working from left to right, with working yarn in back, pull next loop from working yarn up from behind through last st worked on previous row. *Pull next loop from working yarn up from behind through next st. Repeat from * to end of row. Do not turn.

Note: To maintain correct amount of sts (51 sts in row), work first 2 sts of every row together and treat them as 1 st.

2nd row: Working from right to left, with working yarn in back, pull next 2 loops from working yarn up from behind through last st worked on previous row count this as 1 st. *Pull next loop from working yarn up from behind through next st. Repeat from * to end of row. 51 sts in row.
3rd row: Working from left to right, with working yarn in back, pull next 2 loops from working yarn up from behind through last st worked on previous row count this as 1 st . *Pull next loop from working yarn up from behind through next st. Repeat from * to end of row. Do not turn. 51 sts in row.

Repeat 2nd and 3rd rows until work from changing row measures 12 " 30.5 cm ], ending on a 3rd row. Next row: Working from right to left, with working yarn in back, pull next loop from working yarn up from behind through last st worked on previous row. *Pull next loop from working yarn up from behind through next st. Repeat from * to end of row. 51 sts in row. Cut base of last loop to attach to next color of working yarn.**

Cut base of first loop of B to attach to previous working yarn.
Rep from ** to ** as given above.
Cut base of first loop of A to attach to previous working yarn.
Rep from ** to ${ }^{* *}$ as given above.
Cut base of first loop of $C$ to attach to previous working yarn.
1 st row: Working from left to right, with working yarn in back, pull next loop from working yarn up from behind through last st worked on previous row. *Pull next loop from working yarn up from behind through next st. Repeat from * to end of row. Do not turn. 2nd row: Working from right to left, with working yarn in back, pull next loop from working yarn up from behind through last st worked on previous row. *Pull next loop from working yarn up from behind through next st. Repeat from * to end of row.
Repeat 1st and 2nd rows until work from changing row measures 7" [18 cm], ending on a $2 n d$ row.

Bind off row: Working in same direction as last row, pull 2nd st through first st. Pull 3rd st through 2nd st. Pull 4th st through 3rd st. Continue in this manner to end of row. Cut last loop to create yarn tail. Pull yarn tail through last loop. Tie to secure and weave in ends.

Fringe: Cut base of loops of $A$ and $B$ carefully to create a straight length of yarn approx. 200 " 5508 cm ] long (will be cut to make fringe). Cut strands of yarn 16 " [ 40.5 cm ] long. Fold 2 strands in half and knot into fringe across both ends of Blanket alternating colors: $A$ and $B$. Trim fringe evenly.
