Bernat ${ }^{\oplus}$ Alize ${ }^{\otimes}$ Blanket-EZ Stripes ${ }^{\text {m }}$ ( $6.4 \mathrm{oz} / 180 \mathrm{~g} ; 18 \mathrm{yds} / 16 \mathrm{~m}$ )
Version 1: Fairy (46008)
OR

Version 2: Limeaid (46007) OR
Version 3: Zebra (46013)


6 balls
9 safety pins. Yarn needle.


## ABBREVIATIONS

Approx = Approximately

## MEASUREMENT

Approx 52" [132 cm] square.

## GAUGE

5 stitches $=4$ " $[10 \mathrm{~cm}]$.

## INSTRUCTIONS

## Notes:

- Right side of work is facing at all times.
- 'Working yarn' is held behind sts throughout.
- Loops from working yarn are always pulled through sts from back to front of work.
- There are 52 loops per each color section. Each 6-row repeat will use a total of 48 loops of each shade. Leave first 4 loops of the first shade unworked, and last 4 loops of second shade unworked.
- Pattern is worked in 8-st panels, meaning each stripe should be 6 rows high.

## Strip One

1st row (foundation row): Starting with shade A, count 8 loops for foundation row, noting yarn end is at far right and all loops are facing upwards and leaving first 4 loops of shade A unworked. Clip thread at base first 4 loops to create a yarn tail.
2nd row: Working from left to right, pull 9th loop (from 'working yarn') up through 8th loop (last loop of foundation row) from behind to create a knit st. Pull next loop from working yarn up through next loop of foundation row. Continue in this manner to end of row. Do not turn work. 8 sts in row.
3rd row: Working from right to left, pull next loop from working yarn up from behind through last st worked on previous row. *Pull next loop from working yarn up from behind through next st. Repeat from * across to end of row. Do not turn.

4th row: Working from left to right, pull next loop from working yarn up from behind through last st worked on previous row. *Pull next loop from working yarn up from behind through next st. Repeat from * across to end of row. Do not turn.
5th to 12th rows: As 3rd and 4th rows 4 times more. 4 loops of $B$ remaining.
**Leave remaining 4 loops of shade $B$ unworked, and clip thread at base of loops to form tail. You will now join $A$, leaving first 4 loops of shade A unworked to create yarn tail. Cut thread at base of first 4 loops of $B$ to create a yarn"tail". Tie tails of A and $B$ together, and weave in ends. Continue working as given for first 12 rows.**

Repeat from ** to ** 3 times more, ending final repeat with 6 rows of $A$.
Do not bind off. Leave sts on safety pin to secure.

## Strip Two

## 1st row (foundation row):

With B, count 8 loops for foundation row, noting yarn end is at far right and all loops are facing upwards and leaving first 4 loops of shade A unworked. Clip thread at base first 4 loops to create a yarn tail.
2nd row: Working from left to right, pull 9th loop (from 'working yarn') up through 8th loop (last loop of foundation row) from behind to create a knit st. Pull next loop from working yarn up through next loop of foundation row. Continue in this manner to last loop of foundation row. Place last loop of foundation row over far-left loop of first row of Strip One; pull next loop from working yarn up through both loops. Do not turn work. 8 sts in row.
3rd row: Working from right to left, pull next loop from working yarn up from behind through first loop of second row of Strip One and last st worked on previous row. *Pull next loop from working yarn up from behind through next st. Repeat from * across to end of row.
Do not turn.

## 4th row: Working from left to right,

 pull next loop from working yarn up from behindthrough last st worked on previous row. *Pull next loop from working yarn up from behind through next st. Repeat from * to last loop. Pull next loop of working yarn up from behind through first loop of third row of Strip One and last loop of previous row. Do not turn. Continue in this manner, joining work in an ascending manner up left edge of Strip One, until 12 rows have been worked.
***Leave remaining 4 loops of shade A unworked, and clip thread at base of loops to form tail. You will now join B, leaving first four loops of shade B unworked to create yarn tail. Cut thread at base of first 4 loops of B to create a yarn "tail". Tie tails of $A$ and $B$ together, and weave in ends.
Continue working as given for first 12 rows.***

Repeat from *** to *** 4 times more, ending final repeat with 6 rows of $B$. Do not bind off. Leave sts on safety pin to secure.

## Strip Three

## 1st row (foundation row):

With A, count 8 loops for foundation row, noting yarn end is at far right and all loops are facing upwards and leaving first 4 loops of shade A unworked. Clip thread at base first four loops to create a yarn tail.
2nd row: Working from left to right, pull 9th loop (from 'working yarn') up through 8th loop (last loop of foundation row) from behind to create a knit st. Pull next loop from working yarn up through next loop of foundation row. Continue in this manner to last loop of foundation row. Place last loop of foundation row over far-left loop of first row of Strip One; pull next loop from working yarn up through both loops. Do not turn work. 8 sts in row.
3rd row: Working from right to left, pull next loop from working yarn up from behind through first loop of second row of Strip One and last st worked on previous row. *Pull next loop from working yarn up from behind through next st. Repeat from * across to end of row.

4th row: Working from left to right, pull next loop from working yarn up from behind
through last st worked on previous row. *Pull next loop from working yarn up from
behind through next st. Repeat from * to last loop. Pull next loop of working yarn up from behind through first loop of third row of Strip One and last loop of previous row. Do not turn.
Continue in this manner, joining work in an ascending manner up left edge of Strip One, until 12 rows have been worked.
****Leave remaining 4 loops of shade B unworked, and clip thread at base of loops to form tail. You will now join A, leaving first 4 loops of shade B unworked to create yarn tail. Cut thread at base of first 4 loops of B to create a yarn "tail". Tie tails of $A$ and $B$ together, and weave in ends.
Continue working as given for first 12 rows.****

Repeat from ${ }^{* * *}$ to ${ }^{* * *} 4$ times more, ending final repeat with 6 rows of A. Do not bind off. Leave sts on safety pin to secure.

## Strips Four to Nine

Repeat as given for Strips Two and Three, until a total of nine Strips have been worked.

Bind off row: Working in same direction as last row, across all sts from safety pins from all Strips, pull 2nd st through first st. Pull 3rd st through 2nd st. Pull 4th st through 3rd st. Continue in this manner to end of row. Cut last loop to create yarn 'tail'. Tie to secure and weave in ends.
