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WHAT YOU'LL NEED





GAUGE

5 stitches (sts) and 5 rows = 4" [10 cm].



YARN

- Bernat® Alize® Blanket-EZ Stripes™
 (6.4 oz/180 g; 18 yds/16 m)
- Bernat® Alize® Blanket-EZ™ (6.4 oz/180 g; 18 yds/16 m)

COLORS

Quantity

- Contrast A Limeade (46007)
 1 ball or 12 yds/11 m
- Contrast B White (37001)
 1 ball or 12 yds/11 m
- Contrast C Candy Pink (37025)
 1 ball or 4 yds/3.5 m

TOOLS

- 14" [35.5 cm] diameter wire wreath form.
- Hot glue gun and glue sticks.
- Scissors



ABBREVIATIONS

Approx = Approximately Pat = Pattern

USING THIS GUIDE

MEASUREMENT

Approximately (approx) 14" [35.5 cm] diameter.



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INSTRUCTIONS

Stripe Pattern (Pat)

Wrap length of Color 1 from A. Wrap length of B. Wrap length of Color 2 from A. Wrap length of B.

Cut 4 strands of each color in A (Color 1 and Color 2) and 8 strands of B approx 52 loops long.

*Following Stripe Pat (as shown in photo), and using hot glue, attach one end of yarn to back of Wreath form. Evenly wrap yarn around Wreath, ensuring loops are pointing up and Wreath form is not visible. When coming to end of yarn, secure end with hot glue. Maintaining Stripe Pat, repeat (rep) from * for each strand around.















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INSTRUCTIONS

BOW

Notes:

- Right side (RS) of project is facing at all times.
- 'Working yarn' is held behind stitches throughout work.
- Loops from working yarn are always pulled through stitches from back to front of work.

With C, count 6 loops for foundation row (noting yarn end is at far right and all loops are facing upwards).

Tips on Using EZ Yarn

1st row: Working from **left** to **right**, pull 7th loop (from 'working yarn') up through 6th loop (last loop of foundation row) from behind to create a knit stitch. Pull next loop from working yarn up through next loop of foundation. Continue in this manner to end of row. **Do not** turn work. 6 stitches in row.

2nd row: Working from **right** to **left**, pull next loop from working yarn up from behind through last stitch worked on previous row. *Pull next loop from working yarn up from behind through next stitch. Repeat from * across to end of row. **Do not** turn.



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3rd row: Working from left to right, pull next loop from working yarn up from behind through last stitch worked on previous row. *Pull next loop from working yarn up from behind through next stitch. Repeat from * across to end of row. **Do** not turn.

Repeat (Rep) 2nd and 3rd rows until Bow measures approx 20" [51 cm], ending on a 2nd row.








Bind off row: Working in same direction as last row, pull 2nd stitch through first stitch. Pull 3rd stitch through 2nd stitch. Pull 4th stitch through 3rd stitch. Continue in this manner to end of row. Cut last 4 loops to create a yarn 'tail'. Tie to secure.







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ABBREVIATIONS


Approx = Approximately Pat = Pattern

Rep = Repeat **RS** = Right side Tog = Together

INSTRUCTIONS

Using long Tail, seam Foundation Row and Bind Off Row together (tog) using whipstitch, ensuring work is not twisted, to form a Loop. Weave in ends.







Flatten Loop so seam is at the back and the stocking stitch ('V' sts) are facing you.

With C, cut strand approx 20 loops long and cut base of loops carefully to create a straight length of yarn. Wrap length of yarn around center of Bow Loop approx 12 times to cinch center to form Bow.



Using left-over tails from cinching, tie bow to Wreath.

Using hot glue, glue edges of Bow to secure in place.
