

## MATERIALS

Caron ${ }^{\circledR}$ Simply Soft ${ }^{\text {Tm }}$ ( 6 oz/170 g; 315 yds/288 m)
Contrast A Neon Pink (9775)
Contrast B Cobalt Blue (9784)
Contrast C Soft Pink (9719)
Contrast D Chartreuse (9771)

2 balls or 452 yds/413 m 1 ball or $208 \mathrm{yds} / 190 \mathrm{~m}$ 1 ball or 125 yds/ 114 m 1 ball or 144 yds/ 131 m

Size U.S. 8 [ 5 mm ] Susan Bates ${ }^{\circledR}$ knitting needles or size needed to obtain gauge. Susan Bates ${ }^{\circledR}$ yarn needle.


## ABBREVIATIONS

Approx = Approximately
Beg = Beginning
K = Knit
Rem = Remain(ing)
RS $=$ Right side
St(s) = Stitch(es)
$\mathbf{W} \boldsymbol{\&} \mathbf{T}=($ Wrap \& turn). Bring yarn to front of work. Slip next stitch purlwise. Bring yarn to back of work. Slip stitch back onto lefthand needle. Turn.


WS = Wrong side

## MEASUREMENTS

Approx 10" x 70" [ $25.5 \times 178 \mathrm{~cm}$ ].

## GAUGE

17 sts and 32 rows $=4$ " $[10 \mathrm{~cm}$ ] in garter st.

## INSTRUCTIONS

## SCARF BLOCKS

Make 12 using $A$ as Color 1 and $B$ as Color 2.
Make 8 using A as Color 1 and C as Color 1.
Make 8 using A as Color 1 and D as Color 2.

## CROB TRIANGULAR KNIT SCARF

Triangle 1: With Color 1, cast on 23 sts.
1st row: (RS). Knit.
**2nd row: K21. W\&T.
3rd row: Knit.
4th row: (WS). Knit to 1 st before last wrapped st. W\&T.
5th row: (RS). Knit.
Rep last 2 rows until 2 sts rem.
Next row: (WS). K1. W\&T.
Next row: K1.
Next row: K23. Break Color 1.

Triangle 2: With Color 2, proceed as follows:
1st row: (RS). Knit.
2nd row: Knit.
3rd row: K1. W\&T.
4th row: Knit.
5th row: Knit to 1 st after last wrapped st. W\&T.

## 6th row: Knit

Rep last 2 rows until 1 st rem after wrapped st and last row is K21.
(1 st remains unworked after last wrapped st. 1st row of next Triangle is worked across all 23 sts) Cast off purlwise.

## FINISHING

Pin Scarf Blocks to measure approx 5" [12.5 cm] square. Cover with a damp cloth, leaving cloth to dry. Sew seams between Blocks as shown in Assembly Diagram using a flat seam.
