MATERIALS

Coats & Clark® Dual Duty XP all-purpose thread Coats & Clark® Trilobal Polyester Machine Embroidery Thread Coats & Clark® Bobbin Thread

Coats & Clark[®] Cotton Machine Quilting Thread Coats & Clark[®] Zipper Pull

12" (30cm) Coats & Clark® Fashion Metal zipper
¼ yard (.23m) black fabric for poodle applique
⅓ yard (.30m) pink fabric for outer bag
⅓ yard (.30m) companion pink fabric for lining
Paper backed fusible web
Stabilizer
Cotton Batting

SEWING I SKILL LEVEL: INTERMEDIATE

Featuring Coats & Clark® Dual Duty XP all-purpose Thread

Our Parisian Poodle Pouch is just plain fun! Fuse the poodle silhouette in place, and a little shine with Coats & Clark[®] Trilobal Polyester Embroidery thread. Add a Coats & Clark[®] Zipper, accent with quilting, and you have a great little bag!

CUTTING

From pink fabric:

Two 10" x 10" (25.40cm x 25.40cm) squares


TRACE AND FUSE

- 1. Trace the poodle image on the paper side of the fusible web.
- 2. Following the instructions that accompany the fusible web, press the traced fusible web to the black fabric.
- 3. Cut out the poodle and remove the paper.
- 4. Place the poodle centered on one of the 10" x 10" (25.40cm x 25.40cm) squares

SEWING

1. Thread with Machine Embroidery thread on top and Bobbin Thread in the bobbin.

- 2. Select a zig zag set at a satin stitch setting (3 width, .05 length).
- 3. Place stabilizer underneath the fabric.
- 4. Satin stitch around the poodle.
- 5. Tear off the stabilizer.
- 6. Place both 10" x 10" (25.40cm x 25.40cm) squares on top of batting.
- Thread with Coats & Clark[®] Machine Quilting Thread on top and in the bobbin.
- 8. Quilt as shown.



- 9. Trim the quilted pieces to 9½" x 9½" (24.13cm x 24.13cm).
- 10. Using the template given, cut the bag top into the curved shape on both quilted pieces.
- 11. Using the trimmed pieces, cut two lining pieces from the companion pink fabric. Set aside.
- 12. Mark the center of the zipper.
- 13. Mark the center top of the quilted bag.
- 14. Pin the zipper right sides together with the marked quilted bag piece.
- 15. Thread with all-purpose thread on top and in the bobbin.
- 16. Select left needle position straight stitch.
- 17. Stitch the zipper in place aligning the edge of the presser foot with the zipper teeth.
- 18. Stitch the other quilted piece to the other side of the zipper.
- 19. Unzip the zipper.
- 20. Pin the two halves right sides together.
- 21. Stitch the sides and bottom but don't stitch across the zipper teeth.

- 22. Stitch together the sides and bottom of the lining leaving the top open.
- 23. Place the lining inside the outer bag. Mark and match the centers.
- 24. Fold in the raw edge approximately ¹/₄" (635cm).
- 25. Pin in place and hand stitch in place along the zipper edge.
- 26. Install zipper pull in hole on zipper slider




