



MATERIALS

Coats & Clark™ Dual Duty XP® all-purpose thread

Coats & Clark™ Machine quilting thread or Dual Duty Plus® Hand Quilting thread

½ yard (.46m) of cotton flannel

Pinking shears

Scraps or 10 different fat quarters

¼ yard (.23m) for side of hat lining



SEWING, QUILTING | SKILL LEVEL: INTERMEDIATE

Featuring Coats & Clark™ All-purpose thread, Dual Duty Plus® Hand Quilting thread

Hats are essential for shielding the summer sun. This trendy bucket hat uses a bucket of scraps! Collect your favorite scraps or purchase a collection of fat quarters. Our scrappy hat uses 10 different prints.

PREPARE:

1. Print the hat patterns (pages 4-6). There are two that will combine for the brim and one for the crown.
2. Cut out the patterns and tape together the brim pieces.

CUTTING

From cotton flannel:

One crown on the fold
Two from brim pattern
One strip 5" x 24½" (13cm x 62cm)
for side of hat

From assorted prints:

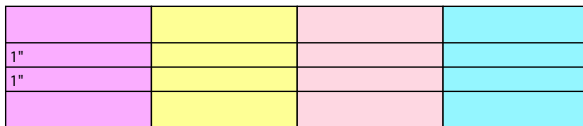
Four strips 5" x 7" (13cm x 18cm)
for side of hat
Four squares 5" x 5" (13cm x 13cm)
for hat crown
Two 5" x 7" (13cm x 18cm) for brim
Four 7" x 7" (18cm x 18cm) for brim
Two from brim pattern for brim
lining
One from crown on fold
One strip 5" x 24½" (13cm x 62cm)
for side of hat lining

SEWING

Notes:

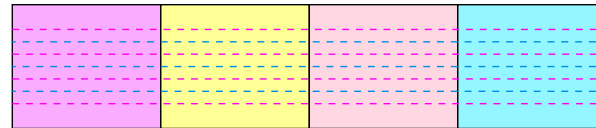
- All seam allowances ½" (1cm)
- As you are sewing the various circular pieces together, divide each piece in quarters and mark, and match the quarter marks to stitch the pieces evenly.

1. Thread with Coats & Clark™ all-purpose thread on top and in the bobbin.
2. Stitch the 5" x 7" (13cm x 18cm) strips for the side of the hat end to end matching the 5" (13cm) edges.
3. Press the seams open.
4. Place on the 5" x 24½" (13cm x 62cm) strip of flannel.
5. Mark a line with chalk, down the center of the pieced fabrics. Then mark a line 1" (2.5cm) on either side as shown.

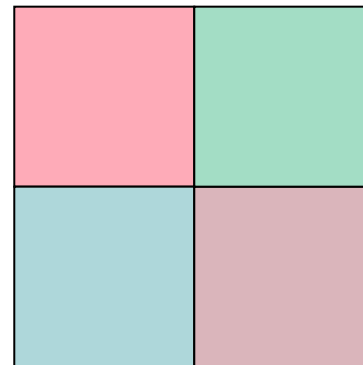


6. Stitch on the marked lines by hand or machine. Dual Duty Plus® Hand Quilting thread or Coats & Clark™ Cotton Machine Quilting thread are good choices to use for the quilting.

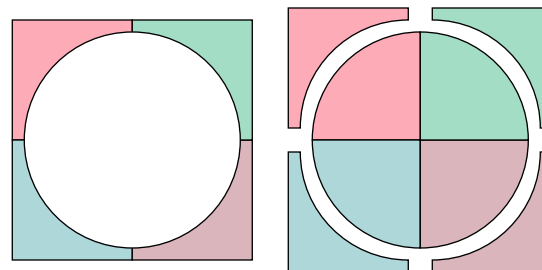
7. Change colors if desired and stitch between the lines, and ½" (1cm) on the outside of the two outer lines as shown.



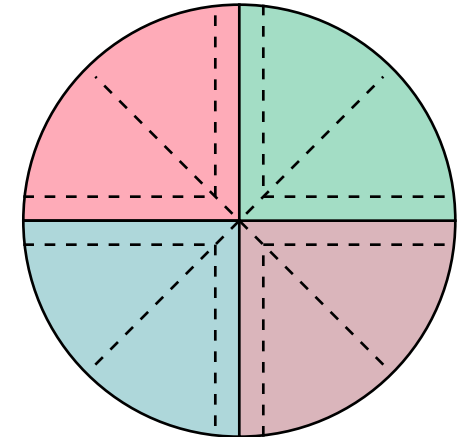
8. Stitch the four 5" (13cm) squares together to create a 10" x 10" (25cm x 25cm) square as shown.



9. Place the squares on the cut flannel circle. Using the flannel circle as a pattern, cut out the circle for the crown of the hat.

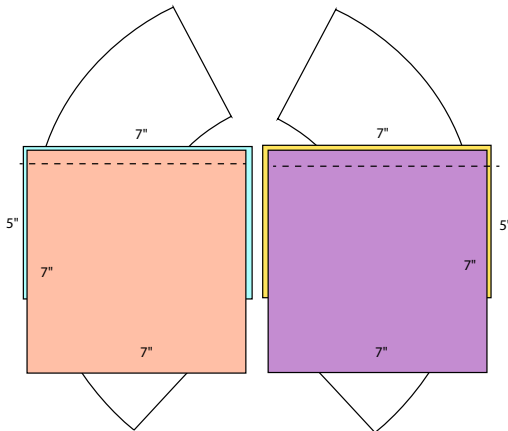


10. Quilt the circle as shown.

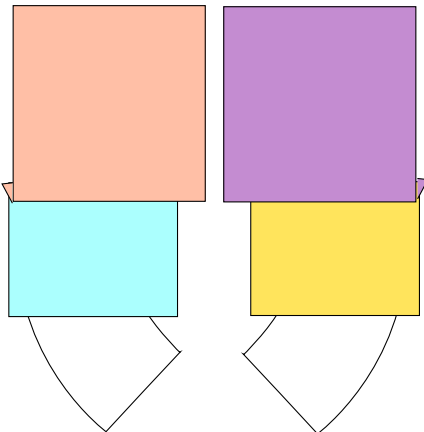


11. Place the two short ends of the quilted strip right sides together and stitch, forming a circle.
12. Pin the crown of the hat in place in the circle, right sides together matching the seams. Stitch the crown in place.
13. Repeat on the lining pieces, stitching the short end of the lining strip, and then stitching the crown in place.

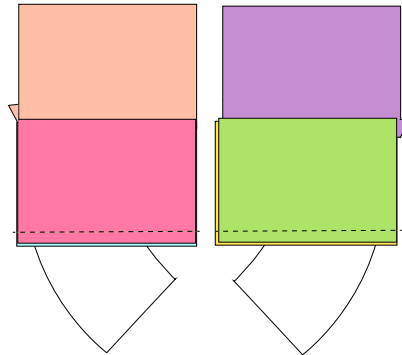
14. Place the 5" x 7" (13cm x 18cm) brim pieces centered on the flannel brim pieces with the 7" x 7" (18cm x 18cm) on top of them. Stitch as shown.



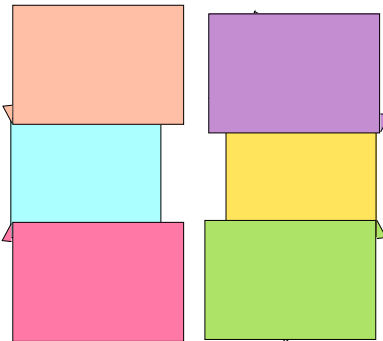
15. Fold out the stitched piece.



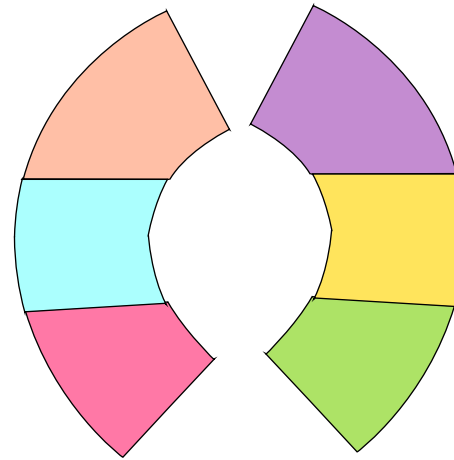
16. Place the other two 7" x 7" (18cm x 18cm) squares in place and stitch as shown.



17. Open out the sewn pieces.



18. Trim the excess fabric using your flannel piece as the cutting guide.



19. Place the pieced brim pieces right sides together and stitch the short ends.

20. Press the seams open.

21. Repeat with the brim lining pieces.

22. You now have two brims. Place them right sides together and stitch the outer seam.

23. Trim with pinking shears.

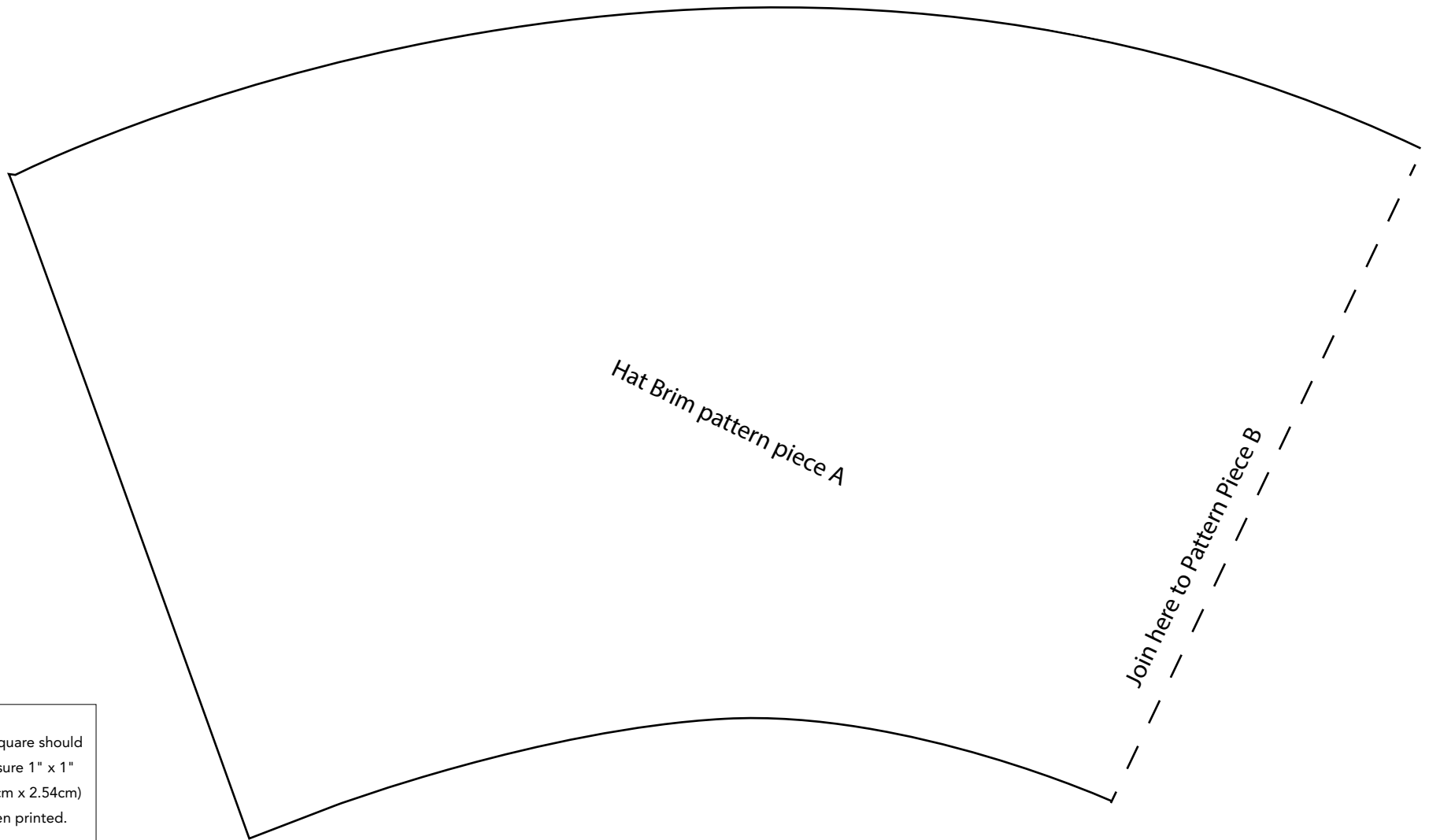
24. Turn and press.

25. Place the brim right sides together with the hat.

26. Stitch the hat to the outer brim only, leaving the brim lining loose.

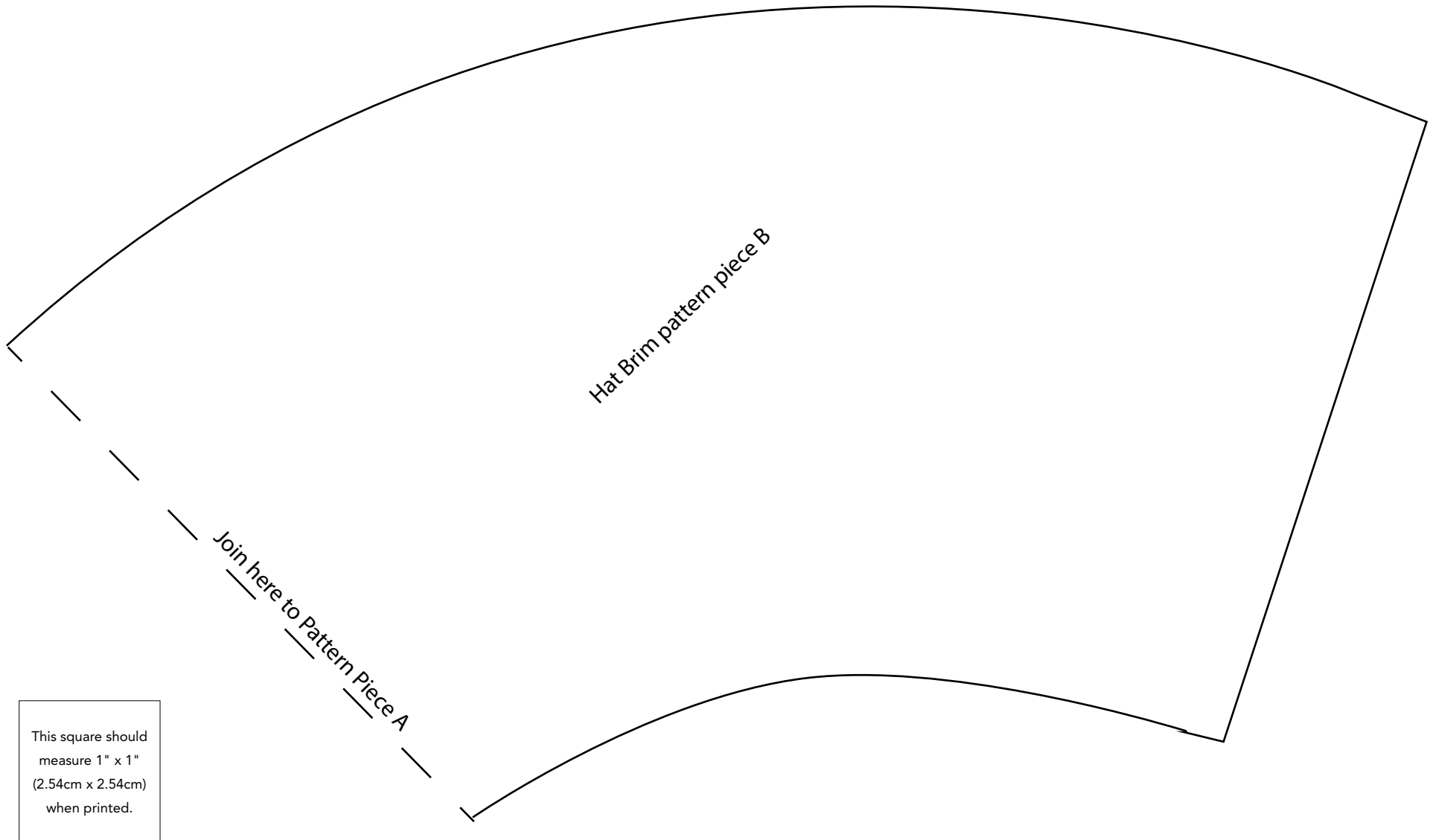
27. Hand stitch the lining to the upper hat, enclosing the raw edges.

28. Quilt by hand or machine rows on the brim, 1" (2.5cm) apart.

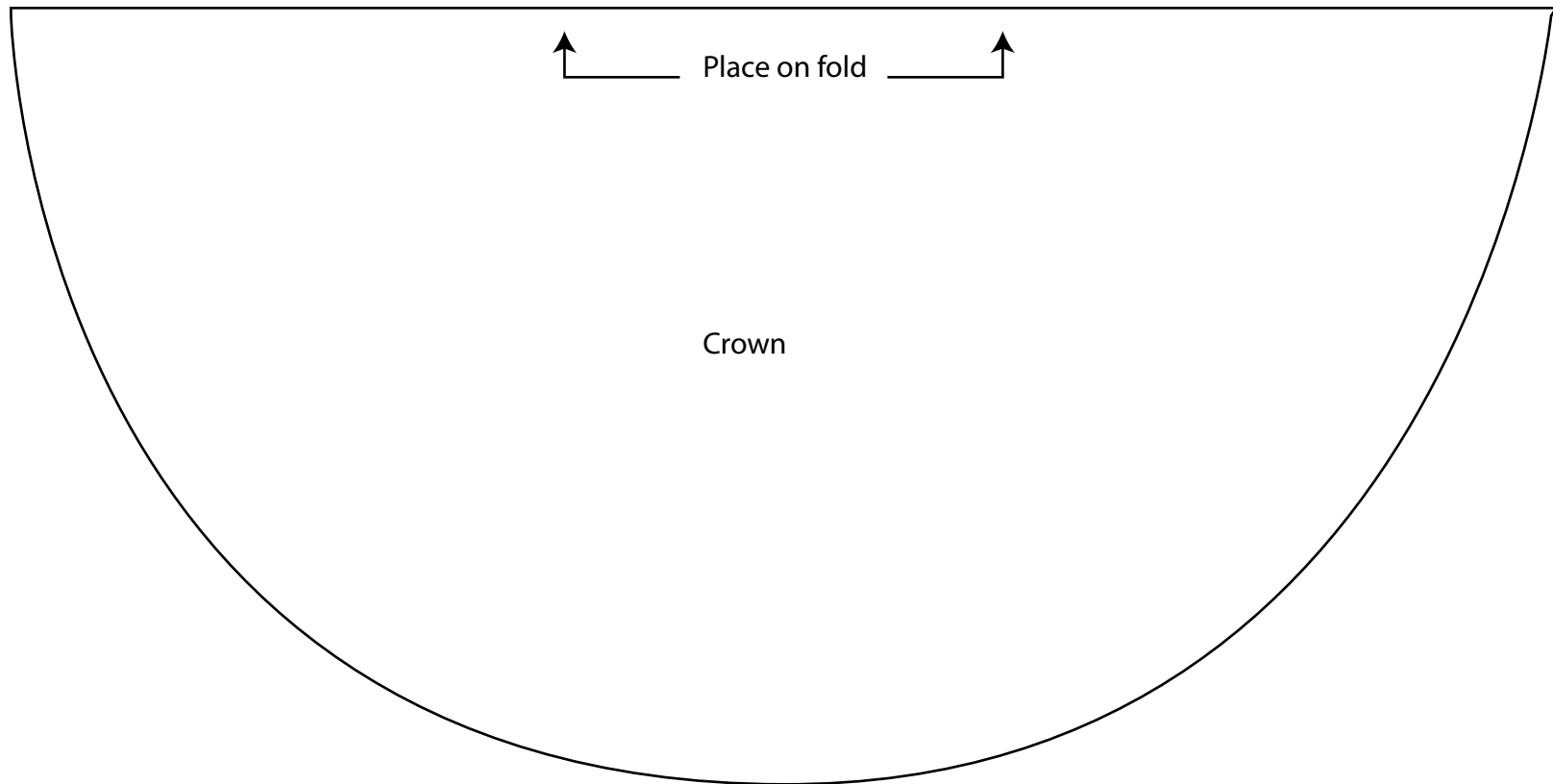


This square should
