

LADIES LUNCHEON TABLE SETTING | SEWING

Crafting Time:	An evening

Create a beautiful table for a luncheon to celebrate with the special women in your family or circle of friends. It's as simple as cutting out and hemming the fabric. Add a festive look by topstitching with Coats Metallic thread.

Finished Project Size

Runner: 16" x 70" (41cm x 178cm)
Placemats: 14" x 18" (36cm x 46cm)
Napkins: 20" x 20" (51cm x 51cm)

Supplies

Coats Dual Duty XP® All Purpose Thread, to match fabrics- 1 spool
 Coats Metallic Embroidery Thread – 1 spool
 2 yds (1.83m) Grey Linen- Runner
 1 7/8 yds. (1.7m) Rose Linen- Placemats
 1 1/4 yds.(1.14m) Cotton Print- Napkins *

***Optional:** Make an additional set using a coordinating solid as shown in photo.

Additional Requirements

Sewing Machine
 Iron & Ironing board
 Basic Sewing Supplies

Cutting Instructions

Runner: Cut 2 - 71" long by 17" wide (180cm x 43cm).

Placemats: Cut 8- 15" x 18" (38cm x 46cm)

Napkins: Cut 4 – 21"(53cm) squares.

Sewing Instructions

Note: All seam allowances are ½" (1.25cm).

Runner and Placemats

1. Pin 2 rectangles of fabric, right sides together with cut edges even.
2. Sew around all 4 sides ½" (1.25cm) from edge pivoting at corners and leaving a 4" (10cm) opening on one long edge for turning.
3. Trim corners diagonally, taking care not to cut through stitching. Lightly press seam open.
4. Turn right side out and press.
5. Re-thread the top thread on sewing machine with Coats Metallic thread.
6. Topstitch along all sides, ⅜" (.1cm) from the edge.
7. Construct the runner and four placemats

Napkins

1. On 21"(53cm) square of fabric, measure and mark a ½"(1.25cm) hem along each side.
2. Turn under and press along the marked lines.
3. Turn hem under and press a second time, to create a double-fold hem.
4. Open out the corner to reveal crease lines from pressing the hems. Trim across the outermost crease lines from corner to corner.
5. Fold in the corners diagonally, and then refold the hems creating a mitered edge.
6. Topstitch along all edges of the napkin sewing close to the folded edge.
