



MATERIALS

Coats & Clark™ Dual Duty XP® All-purpose thread

One large sweater* (Note: The featured mitten is cut from only the sleeves of a single sweater.)

½ yd (45.5cm) holiday print lining fabric

½ yd (45.5cm) heavy woven fusible interfacing

½ yd (45.5cm) ⅜" (1cm) cord, for hanger

¼ yd (24cm) dark green print

Scraps of cranberry fabric

Paper-backed fusible web

Polyester fiberfill

Pinking shears

*If you use sweater yardage, purchase ½ yard (45.5cm) with attached ribbing, or purchase rib trim separately.

 SEWING | SKILL LEVEL: **EASY**

Featuring Coats & Clark™ Dual Duty XP™ All-purpose thread

Hang this mitten-shaped stocking from the mantle and bring back fond memories of mittens drying by the fire after a day of playing in the snow. Re-purpose a sweater (or use yardage) and delight in the results.

MEASUREMENTS

12" x 12" (30.5cm x 30.5cm)

PREPARATION

From interfacing, cut:

(2) mittens, using the pattern provided

From lining, cut:

(2) mitten shapes, plus ½" (1cm) at the straight edge

CUTTING

Sweater:

1. Open the sweater and make a plan to use the existing ribbing as the stocking cuff, if possible. Press the sections of sweater to remove wrinkles.
2. Place the sweater section wrong side up. Stretch the ribbing portion out flat (as opposed to pulled in) and pin

to secure it to a padded surface like the ironing board.

3. Align the straight edge of the interfacing mitten pattern just below where the ribbing begins. Following the manufacturer's instructions, fuse the mitten shape in place. Repeat to fuse the second half of the mitten (reversed) to another sweater section, placing it in the same position.
4. Using a narrow long zigzag, stitch around each interfacing piece, extending the stitching into the ribbing on both edges of the mitten. The stitching should follow a rib in the knit in the extended ribbing section—straight up from the mitten top. Cut just outside the interfacing to create the two mitten shapes.

Note: Seam allowances are ¼" (.64cm).

ASSEMBLING THE STOCKING

1. Place the interfaced mitten front and back right sides together, matching the ribbing top. Sew around the mitten shape starting and stopping below the ribbing.
2. Clip into the corner at the thumb area.
3. Turn the mitten right side out and press to shape.
4. Place the extending ribbing wrong sides together and sew both side seams from the finished edge to the mitten top. The ribbing will be turned down to form a cuff so the seam allowances won't show.

ASSEMBLING THE LINING

1. Place the lining mittens right sides together and sew around the shape, leaving the upper edge open and using a ¾" (1cm) seam allowance. Leave wrong sides out.
2. Clip the mitten thumb area and trim the seam allowances.

FINISHING

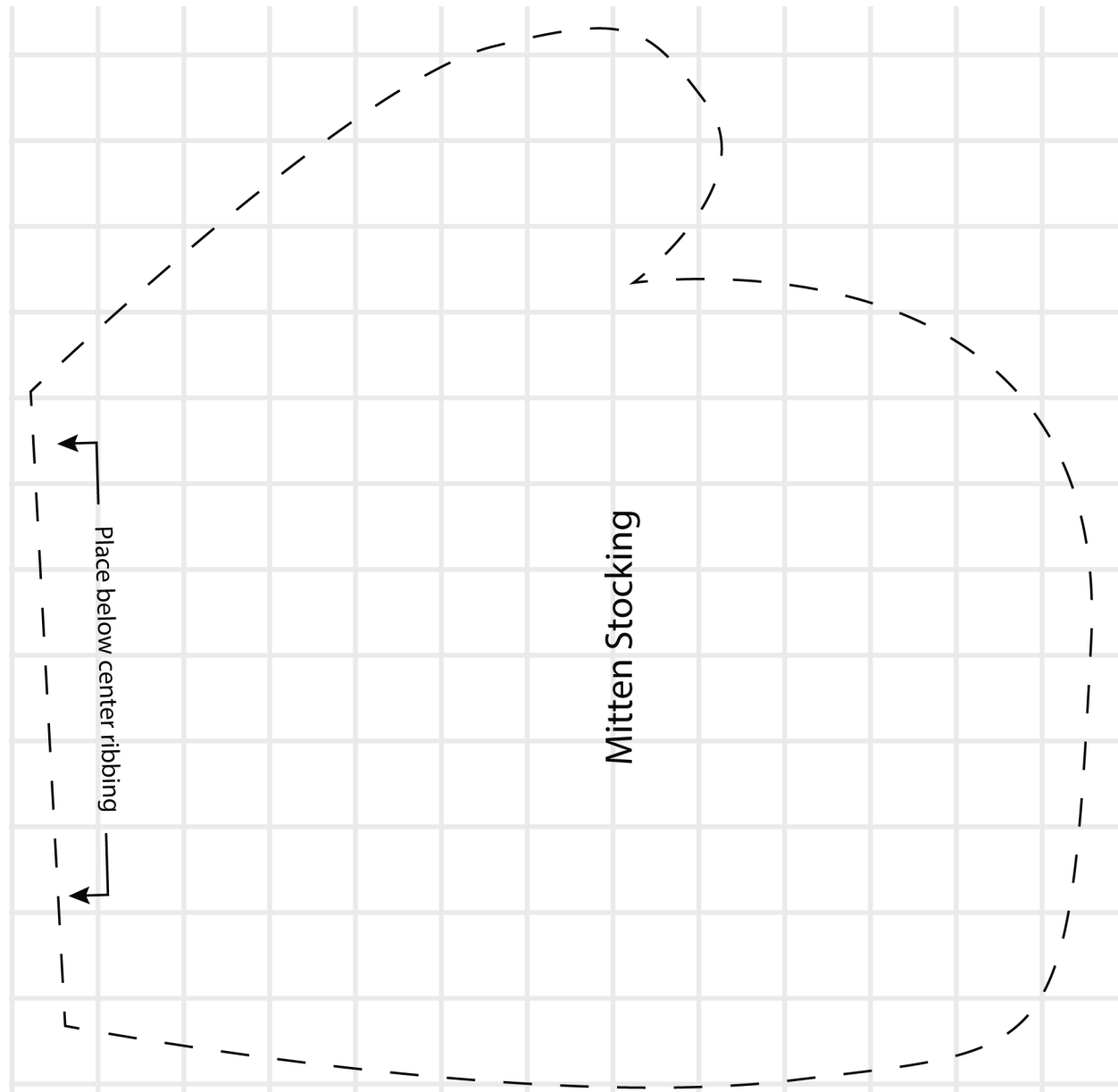
1. With wrong sides together, slide the lining into the sweater mitten and push down to shape. Be sure the thumb corresponds to the same side in the lining and the mitten.
2. Fold the hanging cord in half, matching raw edges and stitch.
3. Turn under the upper straight lining edge. Tuck the raw ends of the hanger below the interfacing line on the straight side of the mitten and pin in place.
4. Matching side seams, place the lining fold just above the interfacing line on the sweater fabric, with the hanger cord ends between the layers. Hand-stitch the lining around the upper opening and double stitch over the cord hanger.

EMBELLISHING

1. Cut a 6" (15cm) square of fusible web and following the manufacturer's instructions, fuse to the wrong side of the green fabric. Cut around the edges. With wrong sides together, fuse the square to another piece of green fabric. Trim the edges with pinking shears.
2. Pleat the square on the diagonal from corner to corner. Sew through the center to hold the pleats in place. Hand-stitch to the ribbed cuff on the hanger side of the sock.

3. From the cranberry fabric, cut three 2¼" (5.5cm) circles. Using a double strand of thread, sew a hand running stitch around the edges about ⅛" (.5cm) from the cut edge. Pull up the threads, lightly stuff, then securely tie off the threads.
4. Hand-stitch the cranberry berries above the holly leaf trim.

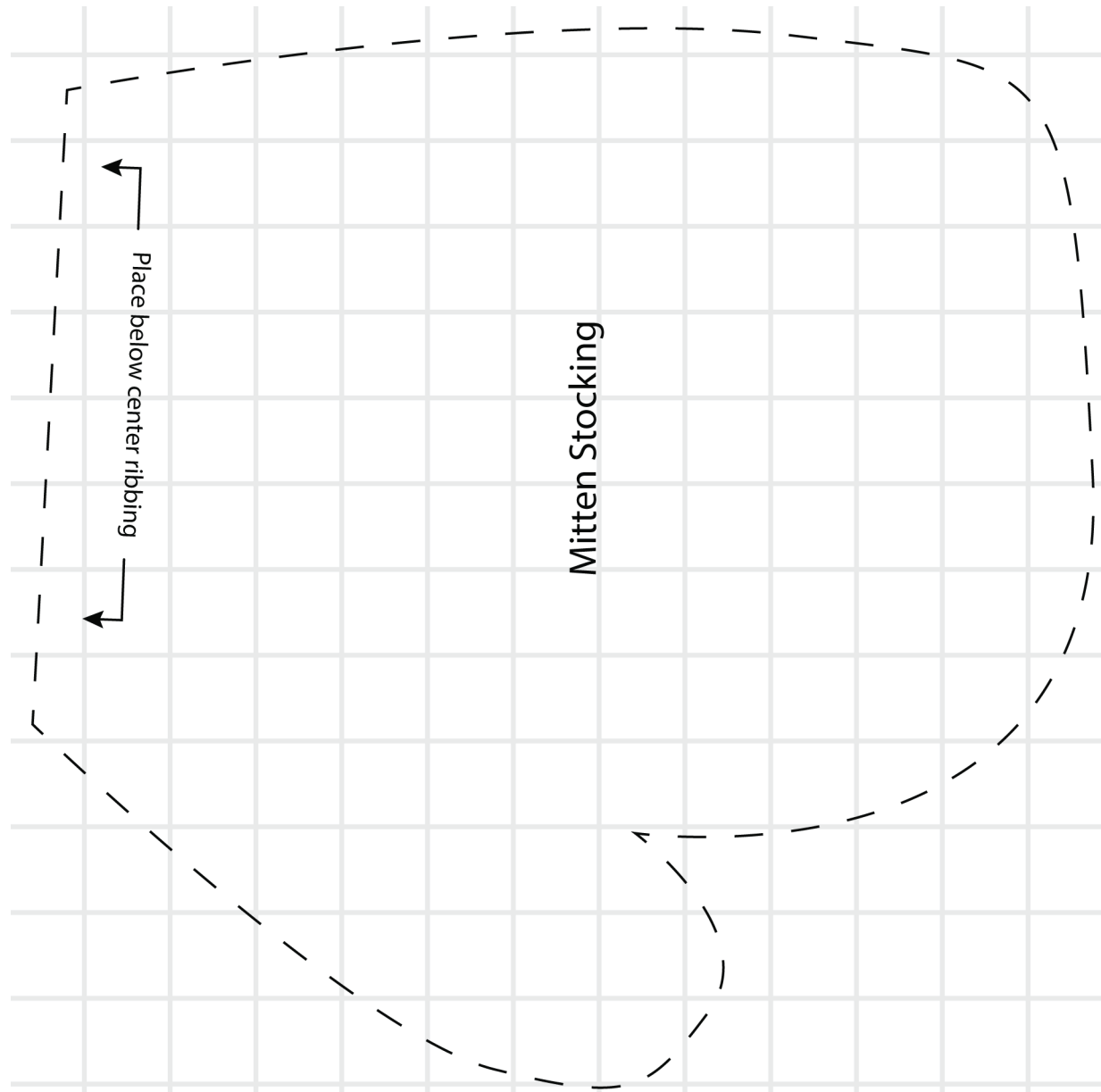
