What you will need:
RED HEART ${ }^{\circ}$ Boutique Infinity"': 3 balls 9705 Blossom

Susan Bates ${ }^{\circ}$ Crochet Hook: 9mm [US M-13]

Yarn needle
GAUGE: 1 pattern repeat $=3^{\prime \prime}$ ( 7.5 cm ) (one pattern repeat consists of one shell and one single crochet); 4 rows $=21 / 2 "(6.5 \mathrm{~cm})$. CHECK YOUR GAUGE. Use any size hook to obtain the gauge.


RED HEART ${ }^{\circ}$ Boutique Infinity"', Art 828 available in 3.5 oz $(100 \mathrm{~g}), 129 \mathrm{yd}$ ( 118 m ) balls

## Blushing Shells Cowl

Gorgeous color and a bit of matching sparkle take this yarn into the realm of dreaminess. Sit back and enjoy how quickly you can crochet this bulky yarn beauty.

## Cowl measures 15 " wide and 38 " circumference ( $38 \times 96.5 \mathrm{~cm}$ ).

## Special Stitch

Shell $=9 \mathrm{dc}$ in indicated space.
$\mathbf{V}$-stitch ( $\mathbf{V}$-st) $=(\mathrm{dc}$, ch 2, dc) in indicated stitch.

## Notes

1. Cowl is worked back and forth in rows. Short ends are sewn together to form cowl.
2. To make a wider or narrower cowl, repeat from the asterisk in Row 1 as many times as desired. For a larger circumference, repeat Rows 3-6 as many times as desired. A wider or larger cowl may require additional balls of yarn.

## COWL

Ch 6.
Row 1: Dc in 3rd ch from hook (beginning ch count as ch-2 space), *ch 10, dc in 3 rd ch from hook (skipped ch count as ch-2 space; repeat from * 4 times, do not turn- $5 \mathrm{dc}, 5$ ch -2 spaces, and 31 ch
Note Dc lies horizontally above each ch-2 space; encase dc as you work into the ch-2 space. Take care not to twist Row 1 as you work.
Row 2: Ch 4, sc in 2nd ch from hook, skip next 2 ch, shell in first ch-2 space, *skip next 3 ch , sc in next ch skip next 3 ch , shell in next ch-2 space; repeat from * 3 times, skip next 2 ch, sc in last ch, turn -5 shells and 6 sc . Row 3: Ch 4 (counts as dc, ch 1), dc in first sc , *ch 2 , sc in center dc of next shell, ch 2 , $V$-st in next sc; repeat from * 3 times, ch 2 , sc in center dc of last shell, ch $2,(\mathrm{dc}, \mathrm{ch} 1, \mathrm{dc}$ ) in last sc, turn-4 V-sts, $4 \mathrm{dc}, 5 \mathrm{sc}, 10 \mathrm{ch}-2$ sps, and 2 ch- 1 spaces.
Row 4: Ch 3 (counts as first dc), 4 dc in first
ch-1 space, *sc in next sc, shell in ch-2 space of next V-st; repeat from * 3 times, sc in last sc, 5 dc in last ch- 1 space, turn -4 shells, 10 dc, and 5 sc .
Row 5: Ch 1, sc in first dc, ch 2, V-st in first sc, ${ }^{*}$ ch 2 , sc in center dc of next shell, ch 2,
$V$-st in next sc; repeat from * 3 times, ch 2 , sc in top of beginning ch, turn- 5 V -sts, 6 sc , and $10 \mathrm{ch}-2$ spaces.
Row 6: Ch 1, sc in first sc, *shell in ch-2 space of next V-st, sc in next sc; repeat from * across, turn- 5 shells and 6 sc .
Rows 7-58: Repeat Rows 3-6 thirteen times.
Rows 59-61: Repeat Rows 3-5 once. Fasten off, leaving a long tail for sewing.

## FINISHING

With right side facing, sew first and last rows together with mattress stitches. Weave in ends. Block to finished measurements if needed.

$\mathbf{c h}=$ chain; $\mathbf{d c}=$ double crochet; $\mathbf{s c}=$ single crochet; st(s) = stitch(es); ( ) = work directions in parentheses into same st; * $=$ repeat whatever follows the * as indicated.
