What you will need:

RED HEART® With Love®: 1 skein 1502 Iced Aqua

Susan Bates® Crochet Hook: 5mm [US H-8]

Decorative button, ¾" [19 mm] diameter, yarn needle

GAUGE: 2 pattern repeats = 3" [7.5 cm]; 3 rows = 3" [7.5 cm] in pattern stitch. CHECK YOUR GAUGE. Use any size hook to obtain the gauge.

Picot-Lace Shawlette

This pretty crochet shawlette will keep bare shoulders warm while adding a the perfect finish to a date night outfit, a more formal dress or even for reading a romance novel at home. Choose from any of the vibrant or neutral tones available in this cozy, soft yarn.

One size fits most

Lower edge circumference: 39" [99 cm] Length: 12" [30.5 cm]

NOTE

Shawlette is worked in rows from top edge to lower edge.

SPECIAL ABBREVIATIONS

Double picot: Ch 5, slip st in 3rd ch from hook, ch 4, slip st in 3rd ch from hook, ch 2.

SHAWLETTE

Ch 132.

Row 1 (Right Side): Sc in 2nd ch from hook, *double picot, skip 4 ch, sc in next ch; repeat from * across – 26 double picots.

Row 2: Ch 7, turn, (sc, ch 3, sc) in ch-1 space between next 2 picots, *double picot, (sc, ch 3, sc) in ch-1 space between next 2 picots; repeat from * to last sc, dtr in last sc.

Row 3: Ch 1, turn, sc in dtr, *double picot, (sc, ch 3, sc) in ch-1 space between next 2 picots; repeat from * to end of row, double picot, sc in 5th ch of beginning ch-7.

Rows 4-9: Repeat Rows 2-3.

Row 10: Repeat Row 2.

Fasten off.

Neckband

Row 1 (Right Side): With right side facing and working along opposite edge of foundation ch, join yarn in first ch, ch 1, sc in same ch, *ch 3, skip 4 ch, sc in next ch; repeat from * to end of row.

Rows 2-4: Ch 1, turn, sc in first sc, *ch 3, skip ch-3 space, sc in next sc; repeat from * to end of row.

Edging Row: Ch 1, turn, slip st in first sc, *(hdc, dc, ch 3, slip st in first ch, dc and hdc) all in next ch-3 space, slip st in next sc; repeat from * to end of row, turn to work along front opening, [ch 3, skip edge of next row, slip st in edge of next row] twice, [ch 3, skip edge of next row, slip st over post of dtr, ch 3, slip st in top of same dtr] 5 times, ch 3, slip st in top of same dtr, turn to work along lower edge, *ch 1, (3 dc, [ch 3, slip st in first ch] 3 times, 3 dc) all in next ch-3 space, ch 1**, (sc, ch 3, sc) in ch-1 space between next 2 picots; repeat from * across lower edge, end last repeat at **, ch 1, skip 2 ch, (slip st, ch 3, slip st) in 3rd ch of beginning ch-7, turn to work along front edge, [ch 3, slip st in next ch-4 space, ch 3, skip edge of next row, slip st in top ch of next ch-4 sp] 4 times, ch 3, slip st over next ch-4 space, ch 4, skip edge of next row, slip st in top of beginning ch, ch 3, skip 1 row, slip st in edge of next row, ch 4, skip 1 row, slip st in edge of next row for buttonloop. Fasten off.

FINISHING

Weave in ends. Sew button on front opposite buttonloop.
