What you will need:

RED HEART® Luster Sheen®: 3 balls 825 Mid Blue

Susan Bates® Crochet Hook: 5mm [US H-8]

Yarn needle

GAUGE: 16 sts = 4" (10 cm) and 6 rows in shawl pattern = 4" (10 cm). CHECK YOUR GAUGE. Use any size hook to obtain the gauge given.



RED HEART® Luster Sheen®, Art. E794 available in 3.5 oz

(100 g), 307 yd (281 m) solid color and 3 oz (85 g), 261 yd (239 m) multicolor balls



Quick Weekend Shawl

Here is a shawl that is so pretty you'll be wanting to wear it every weekend! Crocheted in this lightweight yarn, it can be worn any season and would look wonderful in any shade of yarn.

SHOP KIT

Finished Size: 21" (53.5 cm) tall x 60" (152.5 cm) long

Special Abbreviations

X-st: Yarn over (twice), insert hook in next st, draw up a loop (4 loops on hook), yarn over, draw through 2 loops on hook (3 loops on hook), yarn over, skip next 2 sts, insert hook in next st, draw up a loop (5 loops on hook), [yarn over, draw through 2 loops on hook] 2 times (top of cluster made), [yarn over, draw through 2 loops on hook] twice, ch 2, dc in both loops at top of cluster.

Shawl

Ch 64.

Row 1 (RS): Dc in 4th ch from hook and in each ch across, turn—62 dc.

Row 2: Ch 5 (counts as tr, ch 1), *X-st over next 4 sts; repeat from * across to last st, ch 1, tr in last st, turn—2 tr, 15 X-sts.

Row 3: Ch 3 (counts as dc), skip next ch-1 space, *dc in next st, 2 dc in next ch-2 sp, dc in next st; repeat from * across to turning ch, skip next ch, dc in 4th ch of turning ch, turn.

Rows 4–71: Repeat Rows 2–3 thirty-four times.

Bottom Border

Row 1: Ch 1, pivot to work across long edge of shawl, 3 sc in first row-end st, 4 sc in next row-end st, *2 sc in next row-end st, 4 sc in next row-end st; repeat from * across to last row, 2 sc in last row, turn – 213 sc.

Row 2: Ch 3 (counts as dc), dc in next 2 sts, *ch 2, skip next 2 sts, dc in next 3 sts; repeat from * across, turn—42 ch-2 spaces.

Row 3: Ch 4 (counts as tr, ch 1), [tr, ch 1] 4 times in next st (half shell made), skip next (dc, ch 2, dc), sc in next dc, *[ch 5, skip next (dc, ch 2, dc), sc in next st] 4 times, ch 1, skip next (dc, ch 2, dc)**, [tr, ch 1] 6 times in next st (shell made), skip next (dc, ch 2, dc),

sc in next dc; repeat from * across, ending last repeat at **, [tr, ch 1] 4 times in next st (half shell made), tr in top of beginning ch-3, turn—6 shells: 2 half shells.

Row 4: Ch 6 (counts as tr, ch 2), tr in next tr, ch 2, (tr, ch 2, tr) in next tr, [ch 2 tr in next tr] twice, *ch 3, skip next ch-5 space, [sc in next sc, ch 3] 3 times, skip next ch-5 space and next ch-1 space, [tr in next tr, ch 2] twice, (tr, ch 2, tr) in next tr, ch 2**, (tr, ch 2, tr) in next tr, [ch 2, tr in next tr] twice; repeat from * across, ending last repeat at **, tr in next tr, ch 2, tr in 4th ch of turning ch, turn.

Row 5: Ch 6 (counts as dc, ch 3), skip next ch-2 space, [dc in next tr, ch 3] 5 times, *skip next 2 ch-3 spaces, sc in next sc, ch 3, skip next 2 ch-3 spaces**, [dc in next tr, ch 3] 8 times, ch 3; repeat from * across, ending last repeat at **, [dc in next tr, ch 3] 5 times, dc in 4th ch of turning ch, turn.

Row 6: Ch 1, (sc, ch 3, sc) in first st, [sc in next space, (sc, ch 3, sc) in next st] 5 times, *ch 3, skip next ch-3 space, slip st in next sc, ch 3, skip next ch-3 space, *(sc, ch 3, sc) in next dc**, [sc in next space, (sc, ch 3, sc) in next dc] 7 times; repeat from * across, ending last repeat at **, [sc in next space, (sc, ch 3, sc) in next dc] 4 times, sc in next space, (sc, ch 3, sc) in 3rd ch of turning ch. Fasten off.

Top Edging

Row 1: With RS facing, join yarn with sc over post of first row-end st on other long edge of shawl, repeat Row 1 of Bottom Border. Fasten off.

FINISHING

With yarn needle, weave in ends. Immerse shawl in cool water, squeeze out excess water, taking care not to wring or twist. Place the piece on a flat, covered surface, gently stretch to open lace pattern. Leave until completely.

crochet; sl st = slip st; sp(s) = space(es);
st(s) = stitch(es); tr = treble crochet; () =
work directions in parentheses into same st;
[] = work directions in brackets the number
of times specified; * = repeat whatever
follows the * as indicated.
