## What you will need:

**RED HEART® With Love®:**  
2 balls 1972 Renaissance Print

**Susan Bates® Crochet Hook:**  
5.5mm [US I-9]

Yarn needle

**GAUGE:** 11 dc = 4" [10 cm];  
6.5 rows = 4" [10 cm] in  
double crochet. **CHECK YOUR  
GAUGE.** Use any size hook to  
obtain the gauge.

# Iris Shawl

This shawl is a great combination of easy stitching and an interesting edge. Pick your favorite color to crochet with, we bet it would look stunning in a solid color, too!

**Shawl measures 58" [147 cm] from tip to tip x 18" [46 cm] at widest point.**

## NOTES

Shawl is worked lengthwise from tip to tip in double crochet. Increases are worked along one long edge (diagonal edge) while opposite long edge is kept straight. An edging is worked along the diagonal edge.

## SPECIAL ABBREVIATIONS

**dc2tog:** [Yarn over, insert hook in next stitch, yarn over and pull up loop, yarn over, draw through 2 loops] 2 times, yarn over, draw through all loops on hook.

**Picot:** Ch 3, slip st in 3rd ch from hook.

**puff:** Yarn over, insert hook in indicated stitch and draw up a loop, [yarn over, insert hook in same stitch and draw up a loop] 3 times, yarn over and draw through 9 loops on hook.

## SHAWL

**Row 1:** Ch 4 (skipped 3 ch count as first dc), (dc, ch 1, dc) in 4th ch from hook – 3 dc.

**Row 2:** Turn, (sc, ch 2) in first dc, (counts as first dc and ch 1 here and throughout), dc in next ch-1 space, ch 1, 2 dc in last dc – 4 dc.

**Row 3:** Turn, (sc, ch 2, dc) in first dc (diagonal edge), ch 1, dc in next ch-1 space, dc in each dc across – 5 dc.

**Row 4:** Turn, (sc, ch 2) in first dc (straight edge), dc in each dc across to ch-1 space, dc in ch-1 space, ch 1, 2 dc in last dc – 6 dc.

**Rows 5-48:** Repeat Rows 3-4, increasing 1 dc every row – 50 dc at end of Row 48.

**Row 49:** Turn, (sc, ch 2, dc) in first dc, ch 1, skip next ch-1 space, dc2tog, dc in next dc, dc in each dc across – 49 dc.

**Row 50:** Turn, (sc, ch 2) in first dc, dc in each dc across to 2 dc before ch-1 space, dc2tog, ch 1, 2 dc in last dc – 48 dc.

**Rows 51-95:** Repeat Rows 49-50, decreasing 1 dc every row, ending with Row 49 – 3 dc at end of Row 95. Fasten off.

## FINISHING Edging

**Row 1:** With right side facing and working along diagonal edge of Shawl, join yarn with a sc in tip, sc 90 sc evenly spaced along diagonal edge to widest point, sc 91 sc evenly spaced to opposite tip – 182 sc.

**Row 2:** Ch 1, turn, sc in next 5 sc, \*([sc, Picot] 3 times, sc) all in next st for Picot scallop, sc in next 9 sc; repeat from \* 7 more times, ([sc, Picot] 3 times, sc) all in next st, sc in next 10 sc, \*\*([sc, Picot] 3 times, sc) all in next st, sc in next 9 sc; repeat from \*\* 7 more times, ([sc, Picot] 3 times, sc) all in next st, sc in last 5 sc – 18 Picot scallops

**Row 3:** Ch 1, turn, sc in next sc, \*ch 2, puff in next picot, picot, ch 1, [puff, picot, ch 1] twice in next picot, puff in next picot, ch 2, skip next 5 sc, sc in next sc; repeat from \* across. Fasten off.

Weave in ends. Block lightly.

## Abbreviations

**ch** = chain; **cm** = centimeters;  
**dc** = double crochet; **mm** = millimeters;  
**sc** = single crochet; **st(s)** = stitch(es);  
**tog** = together; **[ ]** = work directions in brackets the number of times specified;  
**( )** = work directions in parenthesis the number of times specified; **\* or \*\*** = repeat whatever follows the \* or \*\* as indicated.
