



CROCHET SKILL LEVEL BEGINNER

#### What you will need:

RED HEART<sup>®</sup> Reflective<sup>™</sup>: 1 ball each of 8429 Grey **A**, and 8671 Neon Green **B** 

Susan Bates<sup>®</sup> Crochet Hook: 6.5mm [US K-10½]

Yarn needle

GAUGE: 10 sts = 4" (10cm); 6 rows = 4" (10 cm) in double crochet. CHECK YOUR GAUGE. Use any size hook to obtain the gauge.



RED HEART<sup>®</sup> Reflective<sup>™</sup>, Art. E820, available in solids 3.5 oz (100g) 88 yd (80m) balls



# Flashy Striped Scarf

This amazing yarn reflects light that hits it for a stand-out look with the flash of a camera. It's easy enough for beginner crocheters, and fast enough for a quick gift.

## Scarf measures about 4" (10 cm) wide and 70" (178 cm) long.

#### Notes

- 1. Scarf is worked lengthwise, changing color every row to create stripes.
- 2. To change yarn color, work last stitch of old color to last yarn over. Yarn over with new color and draw through all loops on hook to complete the stitch. Proceed with new color. Cut old color, leaving a long tail to weave in later.
- 3. To turn scarf into a cowl, sew short ends together to form a circle.

## SCARF

With A, ch 177 loosely.

**Row 1:** Dc in 4th ch from hook (beginning ch counts as first dc) and in each ch to end of row, change to **B** when completing last dc—175 dc.

Row 2: With B, ch 3 (counts as first dc here and throughout), turn, skip first st, dc in each st to end of row, work last dc in top of beginning ch and change to A. Row 3: With A, ch 3, turn, skip first st, dc in each st to end of row, work last dc in top of beginning ch and change to B. Rows 4–6: Repeat Rows 2 and 3, then repeat Row 2. Fasten off.

### FINISHING

Weave in ends.

#### ABBREVIATIONS

**A and B** = Color A and Color B; **ch** = chain; **dc** = double crochet; **st(s)** = stitch(es).
