### WHAT YOU'LL NEED







### **YARN**

Red Heart® Super Saver® Jumbo™ (14 oz/396 g; 744 yds/681 m)

### **COLORS**

Quantity


- Contrast A Spring Green (0672)
- Contrast B Royal (0385) 2 balls

### **TOOLS**

- Size U.S. I/9 (5.5 mm) Susan Bates® Silvalume® crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge.
- Susan Bates® yarn needle.
- Tape measure.

## **GAUGE**

12 **single crochet** (sc) and 15 rows =

### INSTRUCTIONS

### **USING THIS GUIDE**

Click on the underlined words throughout the pattern to access our library of helpful tools.

### **MEASUREMENTS**

Approximately (approx) 39" [99 cm] wide x 60" [152.5 cm] long.

### **NOTES**

- To change color, work to last 2 loops on hook and draw new color through last 2 loops, then proceed in new color.
- Chain (ch) 3 at beginning (beg) of row counts as <u>double crochet</u> (dc).

### **THROW**

With A, make a slip knot and place it on the hook.

# Slip knot

Make a loop with yarn and fold it on itself to make a pretzel shape.





Then draw through to make slip knot.





Chain (ch) 132.

### Chain

\*Yarn over hook (Yoh), draw through loop -1 chain made.

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**Tog** = Together **Yoh** = Yarn over hook

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
Repeat (rep) from \* 131 times more -132 chains made.



1st row: (Right Side [RS]). 1 double crochet (dc) in 4th ch from hook (3 skipped ch count as first dc). 1 dc in each ch to end of chain. Turn.

# **Double crochet**

Yoh and insert hook into 4th ch from hook.









Yoh and draw through first 2 loops on hook.

Yoh and draw through remaining (rem) 2 loops on hook – 1 dc made.





**ABBREVIATIONS** 

**Dc** = Double crochet **St(s)** = Stitch(es)

Approx =

**Rem** = Remaining

**Ch** = Chain(s)

Rep = Repeat Rnd(s) = Round(s)



**RS** = Right side

**SI st** = Slip stitch

Tog = Together Yoh = Yarn over hook

**Sc** = Single crochet

Rep last steps in each ch to end of chain - 130 dc made.

**Note:** There will be 130 dc in 1st row (counting 3 skipped ch at beg of row as 1 dc).






**2nd row:** Ch 3 (counts as first dc). Working in back loops only, 1 dc in each dc to end of row, working last dc in both loops of top of ch-3 – 130 dc.









**NOTE:** Back Loop = Top loop furthest from you, regardless of right or wrong side.







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
**Rem** = Remaining **Tog** = Together **Rep** = Repeat


Rnd(s) = Round(s)

3rd to 6th rows: Repeat (rep) 2nd row 4 times more.



Change to B at end of 6th row.





# **Change colors** Work to last 2 loops on hook.

With new color, yoh and draw new color through last 2 loops to complete st, then proceed in new color.







**7th to 12th rows:** With B, as 2nd row 6 times.

Change to A at end of 12th row.

13th to 18th rows: With A, as 2nd row 6 times.

Change to B at end of 18th row.

19th to 102nd rows: Rep 7th to 18th rows 7 times more. Change to B at end of

102nd row. Fasten off A. Do not fasten off B. Turn.



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### INSTRUCTIONS

### **Border**

### **Notes:**

- 1st round (rnd) of Border has been separated into steps.
- When working single crochet (sc) evenly spaced along side edges, work a number of stitches (sts) that will allow the Throw to lie flat, without any puckering or bunching.
- Keep track of the number of sts you work along first side edge and work the same number of sts along second side edge.



### 1st rnd

**Step 1:** With B, ch 1. Working through both loops, work 3 **single crochet** (sc) in first dc (first corner made). 1 sc in each dc to end of row. Work 3 sc in top of starting ch (second corner made).



**Step 2:** Work in sc evenly spaced down first long side edge of Throw to avoid any puckering or bunching.



Step 3: Working across lower edge of Throw, work 3 sc in remaining (rem) loop of last foundation ch (3rd corner made). Work 1 sc in each rem loop of foundation ch across to next corner. Work 3 sc in rem loop of last foundation ch (4th corner made).

**Step 4:** Work in sc evenly spaced up right side edge of Throw to avoid any puckering or bunching (same number of sts as opposite side). Join with slip stitch (sl st) in first sc. **Do not** turn.



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## Slip stitch

Insert hook in indicated st. Yoh and draw yarn through both the loops on hook in one movement.



**2nd rnd:** Ch 1. 1 sc in the same sp as sl st. 3 sc in next sc (corner). \*1 sc in each sc to center sc of next 3-sc corner. 3 sc in center sc for corner. Rep from \* twice more. 1 sc in each sc to end of rnd. Join with sl st in first sc.






# **Fasten off** and cut yarn.

To fasten off the yarn, cut yarn leaving a long tail. Pull end through loop on hook and pull gently to tighten.

Weave in all yarn tails.





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
