What you will need:

RED HEART* Super Saver*: 4 (5) skeins 340 Dusty Grey A, and 1 skein each of 319 Cherry Red B, 706 Perfect Pink C, 316 Soft White D, 672 Spring Green E, 312 Black F, 512 Turqua G, 321 Gold H, 376 Burgundy I, 334 Buff J, 324 Bright Yellow K, 360 Café Latte L, and 320 Cornmeal M Note: Less than one ounce of each yarn color B-M is needed.

Susan Bates* Crochet Hook: 5mm [US H-8] (for snug sack), 4mm [US G-6] (for snacks)

Small amount of polyester fiberfill, stitch marker, yarn needle

GAUGE: 3 shells = about 6¼" [16 cm]; 8 rows = 4" [10 cm] in snug sack pattern using larger hook. CHECK YOUR GAUGE. Use any size hook to obtain the gauge.

SHOP KIT



Snack Snuggle Sack

This crocheted sack-style cozy is perfect for keeping your kiddos warm while watching television or while sleeping overnight on the sofa. Appliques of popular snack foods include Ice Cream Cone, Pizza, Popcorn, Donut, Apple, Cup of Cocoa, Cupcake and Watermelon. Directions are for Child size; changes for Adult size are in parentheses.

Finished Measurements

Child Size: About 26 x 42" [66 x 106.5 cm].

Adult Size: About 32 x 55" [81.5 x 139.5

cm].

Notes

- Snug sack is made in two pieces: Front and back.
- Snacks are worked separately and sewn to front of snug sack. Use photograph as guide for placement when sewing snacks to sack.
- 3. Front and back are sewn together to complete snug sack.
- 4. To change yarn color, work last stitch of old color to last yarn over. Yarn over with new color and draw through all loops on hook to complete stitch. Proceed with new color.

Special Stitches Bpdc (back post double crochet) =

Yarn over, insert hook from back side of work to front and to back again around the post of indicated stitch; yarn over and pull up a loop (3 loops on hook), [yarn over and draw through 2 loops on hook] twice. Skip the stitch "in front of" the Bpdc.

Fpdc (Front post double crochet) =
Yarn over, insert hook from front side of
work to back and to front again around
post of indicated stitch, yarn over and
pull up a loop (3 loops on book). [varn

pull up a loop (3 loops on hook), [yarn over and draw through 2 loops on hook] twice. Skip the stitch "behind" the Fpdc.

sc2tog (single crochet 2 stitches together) = [Insert hook in next stitch, yarn over and pull up a loop] twice, yarn over and draw through all 3 loops on hook.

sc3tog (single crochet 3 stitches together) = [Insert hook in next stitch, yarn over and pull up a loop] 3 times, yarn over and draw through all 4 loops

shell = Work 5 dc in indicated stitch.

BACK

on hook.

With larger hook and **A**, ch 91 (105). **Row 1 (right side):** Dc in 4th ch from hook (3 skipped ch count as first dc), *skip next 2 ch, shell in next ch, skip next 2 ch, dc in next 2 ch (2-dc group made); repeat from * to last 3 ch, skip next 2 ch, 3 dc in last ch—12 (14) shells.

Rows 2-79 (105): Ch 3 (counts as first dc here and throughout), turn, dc in space between first 2 dc, *shell in space between sts of next 2-dc group, dc in space between 2nd and 3rd dc of next shell, dc in space between 3rd and 4th dc of same shell (2-dc group made); repeat from * to last 4 sts, 3 dc in space between last dc and turning ch—12 (14) shells.

Row 80 (106): Ch 3, turn, dc in each dc across—89 (103) dc.

Top Ribbing

Row 1: Ch 3, turn, *Fpdc around next dc, Bpdc around next dc; repeat from * across.

Row 2: Ch 3, turn, *Bpdc around next dc, FPdc around next dc; repeat from * across.

Rows 3-6: Repeat Rows 1 and 2 twice. Fasten off.

FRONT

Make same as back.

Note: Do not sew front and back together until all snacks have been sewn to front.



ICE CREAM CONE

With smaller hook and **H**. ch 2.

Row 1: Work 3 sc in 2nd ch from hook—3 sc.

Row 2: Ch 1, turn, sc in each sc across.

Row 3: Ch 1, turn, sc in first sc, 2 sc in

next sc, sc in last sc-4 sc.

Row 4: Ch 1, turn, sc in each sc across.

Row 5: Ch 1, turn, sc in first sc, 2 sc in each of next 2 sc. sc in last sc—6 sc.

Rows 6 and 7: Ch 1, turn, sc in each sc across.

Row 8: Ch 1, turn, sc in first sc, 2 sc in next sc, sc in each sc to last 2 sc, 2 sc in next sc, sc in last sc—8 sc.

Rows 9-14: Repeat Rows 6-8 twice—12 sc.

Rows 15 and 16: Ch 1, turn, sc in each sc across.

Fasten off, leaving a long tail for sewing piece to front.

Ice Cream

With smaller hook and **D**, ch 12.

Row 1 (right side): Sc in 2nd ch from hook and each remaining ch across—11 sc

Rows 2-4: Ch 1, turn, sc in each sc across.

Rows 5-7: Ch 1, turn, sc in first sc, sc2tog, sc in each sc to last 3 sc, sc2tog, sc in last sc—5 sc in Row 7.

Row 8: Ch 1, turn, sc in first sc, sc3tog, sc in last sc—3 sc.

Row 9: Ch 1, turn, sc3tog—1 sc. Fasten off, leaving a long tail for sewing piece to front.

Lower Edge (wrong side): With wrong side facing and smaller hook and **D**, working along opposite side of ice cream foundation ch, draw up a loop in ch at base of first sc, ch 1, 3 sc in same ch, [slip st in next ch, 3 sc in next ch] 5 times. Fasten off.

Sew cone to front. Sew ice cream to front and top of cone, placing lower edge of ice cream over top of cone.



PIZZA Crust

With smaller hook and J, ch 2.

Row 1 (right side): Work 3 sc in 2nd ch from hook—3 sc.

Row 2: Ch 1, turn, sc in first sc, 2 sc in next sc. sc in last sc—4 sc.

Row 3: Ch 1, turn, sc in first sc, 2 sc in each of next 2 sc, sc in last sc—6 sc.

Row 4: Ch 1, turn, sc in each sc across.

Row 5: Ch 1, turn, sc in each of first 2 sc, 2 sc in each of next 2 sc, sc in each of last 2 sc—8 sc.

Row 6: Ch 1, turn, sc in each sc across. Row 7: Ch 1, turn, sc in each of first 3 sc, 2 sc in each of next 2 sc, sc in each of last 3 sc—10 sc.

Row 8: Ch 1, turn, sc in each sc across. Row 9: Ch 1, turn, sc in each of first 4 sc, 2 sc in each of next 2 sc, sc in each of last 4 sc—12 sc.

Row 10: Ch 1, turn, sc in each sc across. Row 11: Ch 1, turn, sc in each of first 5 sc, 2 sc in each of next 2 sc, sc in each of last 5 sc—14 sc.

Row 12: Ch 1, turn, sc in each sc across. Row 13: Ch 1, turn, sc in each of first 6 sc, 2 sc in each of next 2 sc, sc in each of last 6 sc—16 sc.

Row 14: Ch 1, turn, sc in each sc across. Row 15: Ch 1, turn, sc in each of first 7 sc, 2 sc in each of next 2 sc, sc in each of last 7 sc—18 sc.

Row 16: Ch 1, turn, sc in each sc across. Row 17: Ch 1, turn, working in back loops only, sc in each sc across. Note: The free front loops should show at the bottom of the crust when all pieces are sewn together.

Row 18 (wrong side): Ch 1, turn, 3 sc in first sc, slip st in next sc, *3 sc in next sc, slip st in next sc; repeat from * across. Fasten off, leaving a long tail for sewing piece to front.

Cheese

With smaller hook and **M**, ch 2.

Rows 1-16: Work same as Rows 1-16 of Crust—18 sc.

Fasten off, leaving a long tail for sewing cheese to crust.

Sauce: With right side facing and working in back loops only, join **I** with slip st in the first back loop of Row 16 of cheese, slip st in each back loop across. Fasten off. Sew cheese to crust, with free front loops of Row 16 visible on top of cheese.

Pepperoni (make 5)

With smaller hook and I, ch 3.

Row 1: Work 7 hdc in 3rd ch from hook; join with slip st in top of beginning ch-3. Fasten off, leaving a long tail. Sew each piece of pepperoni to pizza slice. Sew through middle of each piece, through cheese and to back of crust to help shape pepperoni. Sew slice to front.



POPCORN Popcorn

With smaller hook and K, *ch 3, 4 hdc in 3rd ch from hook; join with slip st in top of the ch-3; repeat from * 29 more times. Fasten off, leaving a long tail for sewing to bag and front.

Single Piece of Popcorn

With smaller hook and **K**, ch 3, 4 hdc in 3rd ch from hook; join with slip st in top of the ch-3.

Fasten off, leaving a long tail for sewing piece to front.

Bag

With smaller hook and B, ch 16.

Row 1: Sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each remaining ch across; change to **D** in last st—15 sc.

Rows 2 and 3: With D, sc in each sc across; change to B in last st of last row.
Rows 4 and 5: With B, sc in each sc across; change to D in last st of last row.

Rows 6-9: Repeat Rows 2-5.

Rows 10-12: Repeat Rows 2-4.

Fasten off, leaving a long tail for sewing piece to front.

Sew bag to front. Sew popcorn to front and top of bag, bunching up the pieces of popcorn and sewing between the pieces. Sew the single piece of popcorn to front, beside bag.



DONUT Donut

Beginning at center of donut, with smaller hook and **D**, ch 18; join with slip

st in first ch to form a ring, taking care to not twist ch.

Round 1 (right side): Ch 1, beginning in same ch as joining, *sc in next 2 ch, 2 sc in next ch; repeat from * around—24 sc. Do not join, work in continuous rounds (spirals). Place a marker for beginning of round. Move marker up as each round is completed.

Round 2: [Sc in next 3 sc, 2 sc in next sc] 6 times—30 sc.

Round 3: [Sc in next 4 sc, 2 sc in next sc] 6 times—36 sc.

Round 4: [Sc in next 5 sc, 2 sc in next sc] 6 times—42 sc.

Round 5: Sc in each sc around; join with slip st in first sc of this round.

Fasten off, leaving a long tail for sewing piece to front.

Frosting

With smaller hook and **C**, ch 18; join with slip st in first ch to form a ring, taking care to not twist ch.

Rounds 1–3: Work Rounds 1–3 of donut—36 sc.

Round 4: [Sc in next sc, skip next sc, shell in next sc, skip next sc, sc in next 2 sc] 6 times; join with slip st in first sc of this round.

Fasten off, leaving a long tail for sewing. With **E** and **G**, embroider French knots for sprinkles. Sew frosting to donut. Sew donut to front, stuffing very lightly as you go.



APPLE Apple

Beginning at bottom of apple, with smaller hook and **B**. ch 6.

Row 1: Sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each remaining ch across—5 sc.

Row 2: Ch 1, turn, sc in first sc, 2 sc in next sc, sc in next sc, sc in next sc, sc in last sc—7 sc.

Row 3: Ch 1, turn, sc in first sc, 2 sc in next sc, sc in each sc to last 2 sc, 2 sc in next sc, sc in last sc—9 sc.

Rows 4 and 5: Ch 1, turn, sc in each sc across.

Row 6: Repeat Row 3—11 sc.

Rows 7-10: Ch 1, turn, sc in each sc

Row 11: Ch 1, turn, sc in first sc, sc2tog, sc in each sc to last 3 sc, sc2tog, sc in last sc—9 sc.

Row 12: Ch 1, turn, sc in first sc, hdc in next 3 sc, slip st in next sc, hdc in next 3 sc, sc in last sc—2 sc, 6 hdc, and 1 slip st. Fasten off, leaving a long tail for sewing piece to front.

Leaf

With smaller hook and **E**, ch 7.

Row 1: Sc in 2nd ch from hook and in next 4 ch, 3 sc in last ch; working along opposite side of foundation ch, sc in each of next 5 ch—13 sc.

Row 2: Ch 1, turn, sc in first sc, hdc in next 5 sc, (sc, ch 2, sc) in next sc, hdc in next 5 sc, sc in last sc.

Fasten off, leaving a long tail for sewing to apple and front.

Stem

With smaller hook and **F**, ch 5, hdc in 2nd ch from hook, slip st in each of 3 remaining ch.

Fasten off, leaving a long tail for sewing to apple and front.

Sew apple to front. Sew stem to top of apple and to front. Sew leaf to top of apple at base of stem, and to front.



CUP OF COCOA

With smaller hook and **G**, ch 15.

Row 1: Sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each remaining ch across—14 sc.

Rows 2-14: Ch 1, turn, sc in each sc across.

Fasten off, leaving a long tail for sewing piece to front.

With **F**, embroider French knot eyes and a straight stitch smile on cup.

Handle

With smaller hook and **G**, ch 13.

Row 1: Sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each remaining ch across—12 sc.

Row 2: Ch 1, turn, sc in first sc, 2 sc in next sc, *sc in next sc, 2 sc in next sc; repeat from * across—18 sc.

Fasten, leaving a long tail for sewing. Sew ends of handle to one side of cup.

Whipped Cream

With smaller hook and **D**, ch 9. **Row 1:** Work 3 dc in 4th ch from hook and in each remaining ch across.

Fasten off, leaving a long tail for sewing piece to front and top of cup.

Sew cup and handle to front. Sew whipped cream to front and top of cup.



CUPCAKE Cup

With smaller hook and **M**, ch 11. **Row 1:** Sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each remaining ch across—10 sc.

Rows 2-14: Ch 1, turn, working in back loops only, sc in each sc across. Do not fasten off.

Cake

Row 1: Do not turn, with **M** and working in ends of rows along side edge of cup, sc in end of each row; change to **L** in last st—14 sc.

Rows 2-4: Ch 1, turn, sc in each sc across.

Rows 5–8: Ch 1, turn, sc in first sc, sc2tog, sc in each sc to last 3 sc, sc2tog, sc in last sc—6 sc in Row 8.

Row 9: Ch 1, turn, skip first sc, slip st in next 3 sc, skip next sc, slip st in last sc—4 slip sts.

Fasten off, leaving a long tail for sewing piece to front.

Cherry

With smaller hook and **B**, ch 2.

Row 1: Work 3 sc in 2nd ch from hook—3 sc.

Row 2: Ch 1, turn, sc in first sc, 2 sc in next sc. sc in last sc—4 sc.

Row 3: Ch 1, turn, sc in first sc, sc2tog, sc in last sc—3 sc.

Fasten off, leaving a long tail for sewing piece to front and top of cupcake.

Stem

With smaller hook and **F**, ch 5. Fasten off, leaving a long tail. Weave tail through chain to other end of stem (same end as beginning yarn tail). Sew the end of stem to cherry. Leave other end of stem free.

Sew cupcake to front. Sew cherry to front and top of cupcake.



WATERMELON

With smaller hook and E, ch 19.

Row 1: Work 2 sc in 2nd ch from hook and each ch to end of chain; change to **D** in last st—18 sc.

Row 2: With **D**, ch 1, turn, sc in each sc across; change to **C** in last st.

Row 3: With **C**, ch 1, turn, sc in first sc, sc2tog, sc in each sc to last 3 sc, sc2tog, sc in last sc—16 sc.

Rows 4 and 5: Ch 1, turn, sc in each sc across.

Row 6: Repeat Row 3—14 sc.

Rows 7 and 8: Ch 1, turn, sc in each sc across.

Row 9: Repeat Row 3—12 sc.

Rows 10 and 11: Ch 1, turn, sc in each sc across.

Row 12: Repeat Row 3—10 sc.

Row 13: Ch 1, turn, sc in each sc across.

Row 14: Ch 1, turn, sc in first 3 sc, [sc2tog] twice, sc in last 3 sc—8 sc.

Row 15: Ch 1, turn, sc in each sc across.

Row 16: Repeat Row 3-6 sc.

Row 17: Ch 1, turn, sc in first sc, [sc2tog] twice. sc in last sc—4 sc.

Row 18: Ch 1, turn, sc in each sc across.

Row 19: Ch 1, turn, [sc2tog] twice—2 sc.

Row 20: Ch 1, turn, sc2tog—1 sc. Fasten off, leaving a long tail for sewing piece to front.

With **F**, embroider lazy daisy stitches for seeds.

Sew watermelon to front.

FINISHING

Sew lower and side edges of front and back together to complete snug sack. Weave in any remaining ends.


ABBREVIATIONS

A, B, C, etc. = Color A, B, C, etc.; ch = chain; dc = double crochet; hdc = half double crochet; sc = single crochet; st(s) = stitch(es); [] = work directions in brackets the number of times specified; * = repeat whatever follows the * as indicated.
