Waverly Place Throw

Create a soft hairpin lace throw that is at home in any style home, from cozy country to urban oasis. If you are new to hairpin lace, make sure to check out our how-to video.

Throw measures 42" x 60" including border.

RED HEART® Super Saver®: 3 skeins each 334 Buff **A** and 313 Aran **B**.


Crochet Hook: 6mm [US J-10].


Susan Bates® Adjustable Hairpin Lace Loom.

Yarn needle; split lock stitch markers.

GAUGE: One Hairpin Lace Strip = 3" wide. CHECK YOUR GAUGE. Use any size hook to obtain the gauge.


Hairpin Lace Instructions






Step 1. Remove cross bar from one end of loom. Form a slip loop ½ the width of the loom. Place left prong through loop, having yarn from skein crossing over right prong. Replace cross bar.

Step 2. Pass yarn around right side of loom and across back. Insert crochet hook in loop and pull until slip knot is at center.





Step 3. Yo and draw through loop, ch 1. Remove hook from loop.

Step 4. Insert hook in dropped loop from back.





Step 5. Turn loom toward you from right to left, passing yarn around back of loom, ch 1.

Step 6. Sc in front loop to left of center stitches. Remove hook from loop.

Continue to repeat Steps 4 through 6 to make a Hairpin Lace Strip. **NOTE:** If easier for you, do not remove hook before turning. Instead, pass the shank of the hook to the back, turn the loom and proceed.

Counting Loops: There must always be the same number of loops on each side of the loom. When a large number of loops are required, use a stitch marker to mark the same number of loops on each side, then count again from marker.

Full Loom: Remove the cross bar, slip all but 3 or 4 loops off loom. Replace bar and roll loops up, then secure with a stitch holder to prevent stretching and twisting of loops while continuing strip.

Keeping Twist: To keep one twist in loops when joining strips, insert crochet hook from back to front in loops, then follow directions given.

Working Loops Straight: When joining strips which do not specify to keep one twist, insert crochet hook from front to back in loops, then follow directions given.

Following general instructions for how to make Hairpin Lace strips above, make 14 of **A** and 12 of **B**, repeating Steps 4 through 6 until there are 24 loops on each side of strip; place a marker on last loops and continue as before, marking every 24th loop until there are 234 loops on each side of strip. Fasten off, leaving 6" tail. Mark the end of each strip.

Note: When loom is filled, remove all but the last 4 loops from loom and continue as before.

When joining strips, have the end of one strip in line with the beginning of next strip. Starting point of joining is lower edge.

To Join First and Second Strips: Working with 2 strips of A (First Strip to the right and Second Strip to the left), insert hook through first 6 loops of First Strip, then insert hook through first 3 loops of Second Strip and draw through the 6-loop group on hook; * [insert hook through next 3 loops on First Strip and draw through the 3-loop group on hook, insert hook through next 3 loops on Second Strip and draw through the 3-loop group on hook] 3 times; insert hook through next 3 loops on First Strip and draw through the 3-loop group on hook; [insert hook through next 6 loops on Second Strip and draw through the 3-loop group on hook, insert hook through next 3 loops on First Strip and draw through the 6-loop group on hook] twice; [insert hook through next 3 loops on Second Strip and draw through the 3-loop group on hook, insert hook through next 3 loops on First Strip and draw through the 3-loop group on hook] 3 times; insert hook through next 3 loops on Second Strip and draw through the 3-loop group on hook; [insert hook through next 6 loops on First Strip

and draw through the 3-loop group on hook, insert hook through next 3 loops on Second Strip and draw through the 6-loop group on hook] twice; repeat from * working directions given in last brackets once instead of twice on last repeat and then using the 6" tail of yarn on First Strip, draw a loop through 3-loop group on hook, yo and draw end through. The side facing up is now the right side of work. Fasten off. Mark the last joined group with a different colored thread.

Turn the joined strips so that the marked group is at lower edge and the wrong side is facing up.

Note: Always keep joined strips to the right of the work.

To Join Third Strip: Using a **B** strip, insert hook through the first 6 free loops at lower edge of the Second Joined Strip and continue same way as the Second Strip was joined to the First Strip. Now turn work so that the marked group of First Joined Strip is at upper edge and right side is facing you.

To Join Fourth Strip: Using a **B** strip, work as for previous joined strips. Continue to join strips as before, having 2 strips of same color alternately and ending with 2 strips of **A**.

Loop Fringe (Work on top and bottom edges)

Row 1: With right side facing, attach **A** to center of First Strip at upper edge, sc evenly across to center of last strip, being careful to keep work flat: turn.

Row 2: Ch 1, sc in each sc across; turn. Pull out loop on hook to measure 1½"; insert hook in first sc.

Row 3: Yo and draw loop through, ch 1, pull last loop made on hook up to same height as previous loops – a loop st made; make another loop st in same sc; make 2 loop sts in each sc across keeping 6 loops on hook at one time to keep loops even.

Work Loop Fringe at opposite edge in same way. Weave in all ends.

Abbreviations: A, B = color A, B; ch = chain; mm = millimeters; sc = single crochet; st(s) = stitch (es); yo = yarn over; * = repeat whatever follows the * as indicated; [] = work directions in brackets the number of times specified.
