## What you will need:

RED HEART® Scrubby™: 1 ball each 905 Cherry A and 12 Black B

Susan Bates® Crochet Hook: 5mm [US H-8]

Yarn needle

**GAUGE:** Gauge is not critical for this project



RED HEART® Scrubby™, Art. E833 available in 3.5 oz (100 g), 92 yd (85 m) balls



# Chevron Dish Scrub

Add on-trend style to your kitchen sink with this crochet chevron dishcloth. The ingenious yarn is great at cutting the dirt without being rough on your skin. It washes easily by machine for thrifty reuse-ability.

Dish Scrubby measures 9" x 9" (23 x 23 cm).

## Special Stitches Fdc (foundation double crochet) =

**Step 1:** Ch 4, yarn over, insert hook in 4th ch from hook (beginning ch count as first dc), yarn over and pull up a loop, yarn over and draw through one loop on hook (the "chain"); [yarn over and draw through 2 loops on hook] twice (first Fdc completed).

**Step 2:** \*Yarn over, insert hook into the "chain" of the previous stitch and pull up a loop, yarn over and draw through one loop on hook (the "chain"); [yarn over and draw through 2 loops on hook] twice (the "double crochet"). Repeat from \* for each Fdc.

dc3tog = [Yarn over, insert hook in next stitch, yarn over and pull up loop, yarn over, draw through 2 loops] 3 times, yarn over, draw through all 4 loops on hook.

#### **Notes**

- Scrubby is worked back and forth in rows with color changed at end of every other
- To change color, work last stitch of old color to last yarn over. Yarn over with new color and draw through all loops on hook to complete stitch. Proceed with new color. Cut old color. Work over tails to minimize weaving in.
- 3. Scrubby is intended for frequent use and washing. Designer recommends tying tails together at color change to prevent unravelling.

#### **SCRUBBY**

Row 1: With A, Fdc 28, turn—28 dc.
Row 2: Ch 3 (counts as first dc here and throughout), 2 dc in first st, dc in next 3 sts, \*[dc3tog] twice, dc in next 3 sts\*, [3 dc in next st] twice, dc in next 3 sts; repeat from \* to \* once, 3 dc in last st; change to B, turn.

**Rows 3–10:** Repeat Row 2 and change color in the following color sequence: \*Work 2 rows with **B**, 2 rows with **A**; repeat from \* once; change to **B** at end of Row 10.

Edging Round: Ch 1, 2 sc in first st, sc in next st, \*hdc in next 3 sts, dc in next 4 sts, hdc in next 3 sts\*, sc in next 4 sts; repeat from \* to \* once, sc in next st, 2 sc in last st; working across ends of rows of first side, \*\*3 sc in first row, 2 sc in next 8 rows, 3 sc in last row\*\*; working in opposite side of foundation ch, 2 dc in first ch, dc in next ch, \*\*\*hdc in next 3 ch, sc in next 4 ch, hdc in next 3 ch\*\*\*, dc in next 4 ch; repeat from \*\*\* to \*\*\* once, dc in next ch, 2 dc in last ch; working across ends of rows of other side; repeat from \*\* to \*\* once; join with slip st in first sc—104 sts.

### **FINISHING**

Weave in ends.

**ABBREVIATIONS: A, B** = Color A, Color B; **ch** = chain; **dc** = double crochet; **hdc** = half double crochet; **sc** = single crochet; **st(s)** = stitch(es); [] = work directions in brackets the number of times specified; \* = repeat whatever follows the \* as indicated.
