What you will need:

RED HEART® Super Saver®: 2 skeins 3943 Americana

Susan Bates® Knitting
Needles: 5.5mm [US 9]

Yarn needle

GAUGE: 14 sts = 4" [10 cm];
30 rows = 4" [10 cm] in Garter stitch. **CHECK YOUR GAUGE.**
Use any size needles to obtain the gauge.



RED HEART® Super Saver®, Art. E300 available in solid color 7 oz (198 g), 364 yds (333 m); stripes, prints, multis and heathers 5 oz (141 g), 236 yds (215 m); flecks 5 oz (141 g), 260 yds (238 m) skeins



American Pride Knit Cowl

Add this red, white and blue cowl to your collection of cozy cowls! Increases and decreases put your knitting on the diagonal, while changing from Stockinette to Garter stitches accents the patriotic stripings.

**Cowl measures 32" [81 cm]
circumference x 20" [51 cm]
height.**

NOTES

Cowl is worked back and forth in rows. Diagonal effect is created by increases and decreases.

Work in Garter st during red-white sections of yarn and St st during blue-white sections of yarn. Change stitch when color changes in yarn.

SPECIAL ABBREVIATIONS

M1L: Make 1 Left (Increase) Insert left needle from front to back under strand between needles, knit strand through the back loop, twisting it to prevent a hole.

COWL

Loosely cast on 98 sts.

Knit 1 row on wrong side.

Row 1 (Right Side): K2, M1L, knit across to last 4 sts remain, k2tog, k2.

Row 2: K2, working in Garter st or St st depending on section of yarn, work to last 2 sts, k2.

Letting color changes determine stitch, repeat Rows 1-2 until piece measures 32" [81 cm] along one long side edge, ending with a color change and a wrong side row.

Loosely bind off.

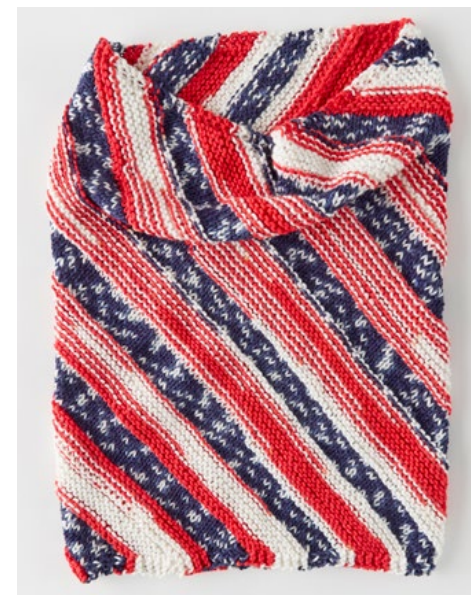
FINISHING

Sew cast-on and bound-off edges together.

Weave in ends.

ABBREVIATIONS

cm = centimeters; **k** = knit; **k2tog** = knit 2 sts together; **mm** = millimeters; **St st** = Stockinette stitch; **st(s)** = stitch(es).



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
