



Easy Rib Cowl

Here's a fashionable alternative to a scarf and since the yarn is a heavier weight, you can make it in little time. Wear your cowl around your neck for warmth or down over your shoulders for another great look. It's a superb gift idea!

One size fits most.
Circumference: 32".
Length: 14".

RED HEART® "Super Saver® Chunky™": 1 skein 624 Tea Leaf.

Circular Knitting Needles: 9mm [US 13] 24" long.
Place marker, yarn needle.

GAUGE: 12 sts = 4"; 12 rounds = 4" in P3, k1 Rib pattern.
CHECK YOUR GAUGE. Use any size needles to obtain the gauge.

P3, k1 Rib (Multiple of 4 sts)

Round 1: * P3, k1; repeat from * around.
Repeat Round 1 for P3, k1 rib.

COWL

Cast on 96 sts. Place marker for beginning of round and join, being careful not to twist sts. Work in P3, k1 rib until piece measures 14" from beginning. Bind off

FINISHING

Weave in yarn ends.
