What you will need:
RED HEART ${ }^{\text {® }}$ Amore $^{\text {TM: }} 1$ ball 6579 Jasmine A, 2 balls 6360 Latte B

Susan Bates ${ }^{\star}$ Circular Knitting Needle: 5.0 mm [US 8], 24" ( 61 cm ) or longer

Yarn needle
GAUGE: 17 sts $=4^{\prime \prime}(10 \mathrm{~cm})$; 32 rows $=4^{\prime \prime}(10 \mathrm{~cm})$. CHECK YOUR GAUGE. Use any size needles to obtain the gauge

## BUY YARN

RED HEART ${ }^{\text {® }}$ Amore ${ }^{T \mathrm{M}}$, Art E876 available in solid color $3.5 \mathrm{oz}(100 \mathrm{~g}), 198 \mathrm{yd}$ ( 181 m ) balls


## Lovely Knit Shawl

You'll adore how soft Amore yarn is! Knit this shawl in your favorite color combination for a sweet-feeling project.

Shawl measures 66" (167.5 cm) wide x $133 / 4^{\prime \prime}(35 \mathrm{~cm})$ at longest point.

## NOTES

A circular needle is used to
accommodate large number of stitches; do not join.

To keep the edges neat and carry unused colors along the side:
At the beginning of the Right Side row, bring the color strand that will not be in use to front of work.

- Bring working yarn behind the other strand.
- Pull the bottom of the fabric as you knit the first stitch to make the strand at the side long enough to prevent puckering.


## Special Abbreviations

$\mathbf{k f b}=$ knit into the front and back of the same stitch - 1 stitch increased.
$\mathbf{w \& t}=$ wrap and turn. Knit to the point where you will wrap and turn. Bring the yarn to the front between the needles. Slip the next stitch on the left needle purlwise to the right needle. Bring the yarn to the back between the needles. Slip the stitch from the right needle back to the left. Turn work to knit in the opposite direction.

## SHAWL

Set Up
With A, cast on 3 sts
Row 1 (Wrong Side): K1, yo, kfb; turn, leaving 1 st unworked - 5 sts
Row 2 (Right Side): K3, yo, k2 - 6 sts.
Row 3: K1, yo, k2, kfb; turn, leaving 2 sts unworked - 8 sts.
Row 4: K5, yo, k1-9 sts
Row 5: K1, yo, k4, kfb, k2, yo, k1 - 12 sts.


## Section A

Row 6: K2, yo, knit to last 2 sts, yo, k2 2 sts inc.
Rows 7-63: Repeat Row 6-128 sts.

## Striped Section

Change to $\mathbf{B}$.
Row 64 (Right Side): K2, kfb, k1, kfb, k to last 5 sts, kfb, k1, kfb, k2-4 sts inc. Row 65: $\mathrm{K} 2, \mathrm{kfb}, \mathrm{k}$ to last 3 sts, $\mathrm{kfb}, \mathrm{k} 2$ 2 sts inc.
Change to A.
Row 66: K2, kfb, k to last 3 sts, kfb, k2 2 sts inc.


Row 67: K 2 , kfb, $k$ to last 3 sts, kfb, k2 2 sts inc.
Rows 68-103: Repeat Rows 64-67-228 sts.
Change to B
Row 104: K2, kfb, k1, kfb, $k$ to last 5 sts,
kfb, k1, kfb, k2-4 sts inc.
Row 105: K 2 , kfb, $k$ to last 3 sts, kfb, k2 - 2 sts inc.

Row 106: K2, kfb, $k$ to last 3 sts, kfb, k2 - 2 sts inc.

Row 107: $\mathrm{K} 2, \mathrm{kfb}, \mathrm{k}$ to last 3 sts, $k f b, k 2$ - 2 sts inc.

Rows 108-109: Repeat Rows 104 \& 105 244 sts.

## Short Row Section

Note: For Garter st, it is not necessary to pick up wraps.
Change to A.
Row 110: K2, kfb, k20, w\&t - 1 st inc.
Row 111: $\mathbf{K}$ to last 3 sts, kfb, k2 - 1 st inc. Change to B
Row 112: K2, kfb, k1, kfb, k1O sts past previously wrapped st, w\&t - 2 sts inc Row 113: K to last 3 sts, kfb, k2 - 1 st inc Change to $\mathbf{A}$.
Row 114: K2, kfb, k10 sts past previously wrapped st, w\&t - 1 st inc.
Row 115: $\mathbf{K}$ to last 3 sts, kfb, k2 - 1 st inc.
Rows 116-149: Repeat Rows 112-115, then repeat Rows 112-113 once more - 294 sts.

## Edging

Change to B. Cut A.
Row 150: K2, kfb, k1, kfb, $k$ to last 5 sts,
kfb, k1, kfb, k2-4 sts inc.
Row 151: K2, kfb, $k$ to last 3 sts, kfb, k2 -
2 sts inc.
Row 152: K2, kfb, $k$ to last 3 sts, kfb, k2 -
2 sts inc.
Row 153: K2, kfb, $k$ to last 3 sts, kfb, k2 2 sts inc.

Rows 154-161: Repeat Rows 150-153 324 sts.
Bind off all sts very loosely, changing to larger needle if necessary to obtain loose bind off.

## FINISHING

With yarn needle, weave in all loose ends.

Block with a press cloth, using pins to shape the shawl.

* $=$ repeat whatever follows the * as indicated.
