What you will need:

RED HEART® Boutique Treasure™: 4 (5, 6, 8, 9) balls 1901 Mosaic A, 1 (1, 1, 2, 2) balls 1913 Spectrum B, 2 (2, 2, 2, 2) balls 1918 Abstract C

Susan Bates® Knitting Needles: 5.5mm [US 9] and 6mm [US 10]

Ring stitch markers, yarn needle.

GAUGE: 15 sts = 4" (10 cm); 19 rows = 4" (10 cm) in Stockinette st (knit on right side, purl on wrong side) with larger needles. 15 sts = 4" (10 cm); 30 rows = 4" (10 cm) in Garter st (knit every row) with larger needles (for mitered square). One mitered square measures about 4×4 " (10 x 10 cm). CHECK YOUR GAUGE. Use any size needles to obtain the gauge.

Mitered Square Jacket

You'll love wearing this stunning jacketstyle sweater! The shaded yarn makes beautiful mitered squares without having to change colors. Directions are for size Small, Changes for sizes Medium, Large, 1X, and 2X are in parentheses.

Special Stitches

kfb (Knit into front and back) = Knit next st but do not remove from needle, knit into back loop of same st and remove from needle.

ssk = Slip next two stitches as if to knit to right needle, insert point of left needle through front of sts, knit these sts together through back loop.

Notes

- 1. Back and sleeves are worked in Stockinette stitch with Garter stitch borders.
- 2. Fronts are made up of three vertical strips of mitered squares. Each mitered square begins by picking up stitches across one edge of the previous mitered square (if any) and corresponding mitered square of the previous strip (if any). This joins the mitered squares as they are knit.
- The topmost mitered square at the front edge of each strip forms one-half of the collar. Edges of each collar square are sewn together at back neck, and lower edge of collar is sewn to neck edge.

BACK

With smaller needles and **A**, cast on 68 (74, 82, 90, 98) sts.

Work in Garter st (knit every row) until piece measures 2 (2, 3, 2, 2)" (5 (5, 7.5, 5, 5) cm) from beginning.

Change to larger needles and work in

Stockinette st (knit on right side, purl on wrong side) until piece measures 22 (22, 23, 26, 26)" (56 (56, 58.5, 66, 66) cm) from beginning. Bind off.

RIGHT FRONT

First Strip of Mitered Squares Mitered Square 1

With larger needles and **A**, cast on 30 sts. Row 1 (wrong side): K15, place marker, k15. Row 2 (right side): Knit to 2 sts before marker, ssk, slip marker, k2tog, knit to end of row—28 sts.

Row 3: Knit.

Rows 4–27: Repeat last 2 rows 12 times—4 sts remain.

Row 28: Ssk, remove marker, k2toq—2 sts.

Row 29: K2tog—1 st. Do not fasten off last st.

Mitered Squares 2–5 (5, 5, 6, 6)

With right side facing and last stitch of previous square on right needle, pick up and k14 sts evenly across side of previous mitered square, cast on 15 sts—30 sts.

Repeat Rows 1–29 of first square.

Repeat until there are a total of 5 (5, 5, 6, 6) mitered squares in the strip.

Fasten off last st of last square.

Second Strip of Mitered Squares Mitered Square 1

With larger needles and **B**, cast on 15 sts. From right side, pick up and k15 sts across right side edge of first mitered square of previous strip—30 sts.

Repeat Rows 1–29 of first square of first strip. Do not fasten off last st.

Mitered Squares 2-5 (5, 5, 6, 6)

With right facing and last stitch of previous square on right needle, pick up and k14 sts evenly across side of previous mitered square in this strip, pick up and k15 sts evenly across

right side edge of corresponding mitered square in previous strip—30 sts.

Repeat Rows 1–29 of first square of first strip.

Repeat until there are a total of 5 (5, 5, 6, 6) mitered squares in the strip.

Fasten off last st of last square.

Third Strip of Mitered Squares Mitered Squares 1–5 (5, 5, 6, 6)

With larger needles and \mathbb{C} , work same as second strip until 5 (5, 5, 6, 6) mitered squares have been made and joined to previous strip. Do not fasten off last st of last square.

Mitered Square 6 (6, 6, 7, 7) (Collar Extension)

With right facing and last stitch of previous square on right needle, pick up and k14 sts evenly across side of previous mitered square in this strip, cast on 15 sts—30 sts.

Repeat Rows 1–29 of first square of first strip. Fasten off last st.

Side (Underarm) Edging

Note: Do not work side edging for size S. Sizes M (L, 1X, 2X) Only

With right side facing, larger needles, and **A**, pick up and k75 (75, 90, 90) sts across long edge of first strip of mitered squares. Work in Garter st for 1 (2, 3, 4)" (2.5 (5, 7.5, 10) cm). Bind off.

Lower Edging

With right side facing, smaller needles, and **A**, pick up and k45 (49, 53, 57, 61) sts across lower edge of front.

Work in Garter st for 2 (2, 3, 2, 2)" (5 (5, 7.5, 5, 5) cm).

Bind off.

LEFT FRONT

First Strip of Mitered Squares

With larger needles and **C**, work same as first strip of right front, until there are a total of 6 (6, 6, 7, 7) mitered squares in the strip. The last square is the collar extension. Fasten off last st of last square.

Second Strip of Mitered Squares

With larger needles and **B**, work same as second strip of right front, until there are a total of 5 (5, 5, 6, 6) mitered squares in the strip. Fasten off last st of last square.

Third Strip of Mitered Squares

With larger needles and **A**, work same as second strip. Fasten off last st of last square.

Side (Underarm) Edging

Note: Do not work side edging for size S. Sizes M (L, 1X,, 2X) Only

With right side facing, larger needles, and **A**, pick up and k75 (75, 75, 90, 90) sts across long edge of third strip of mitered squares. Work in Garter st for 1 (2, 3, 4)" (2.5 (5, 7.5, 10) cm). Bind off.

Lower Edging

With right side facing, smaller needles, and **A**, pick up and k45 (49, 53, 57, 61) sts across lower edge of front.

Work in Garter st for 2 (2, 3, 2, 2)" (5 (5, 7.5, 5, 5) cm).

Bind off.

SLEEVES (make 2)

With smaller needles and **A**, cast on 54 (54, 56, 58, 58) sts.

Work in Garter st until piece measures 2" (5 cm).

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Shape Sleeve

Change to larger needles.

Increase Row: K1, kfb, knit to last 2 sts, kfb,

k1—56 (56, 58, 60, 60) sts.

Next Row: Purl.

Repeat last 2 rows 4 (4, 5, 5, 5) more

times—64 (64, 68, 70, 70) sts.

Repeat Increase Row—66 (66, 70, 72, 72) sts.

Work in Stockinette st for 3 rows.

Repeat Increase Row—68 (68, 72, 74, 74) sts.

Repeat last 4 rows 0 (0, 0, 1, 1) more

times-68 (68, 72, 76, 76) sts.

Change to smaller needles and work in Garter st until piece measures 6 (6, 7, 8, 8)" (15 (15, 18, 20.5, 20.5) cm) from beginning.

Bind off.

FINISHING

Sew shoulder seams for 6 (7, 8, 9, 10)" (15 (18, 20.5, 23, 25.5) cm). **Note:** The shoulder seam is not sewn all the way across the second strip of squares; the remaining part of the second strip is part of the neck edge to which the collar extension is sewn. Sew sleeves to armhole edge centering sleeve over shoulder seam. Sew side and sleeve seams.

Collar

Sew ends of collar extensions together. Sew lower edge of collar to neck edging, easing to fit. **Note:** Garter st is very stretchy. It may be helpful to pin Collar before sewing, to be sure both sides match.

Weave in ends.

ABBREVIATIONS

A, **B**, or C = Color A, Color B, or Color C; k = knit; k2tog = knit next 2 sts together; st(s) = stitch(es).
