## What you will need:

**RED HEART® With Love®:** 3 skeins  
1704 Bubblegum

**Susan Bates® Circular Knitting  
Needles:** 6 mm [US 10], 29" long

Stitch markers, yarn needle

**GAUGE:** 18 sts = 4" (10 cm); 20  
rows = 4" (10 cm) in Chevron  
Pattern. **CHECK YOUR GAUGE.**  
**Use any size needles to obtain  
the gauge.**

# Knit Chevron Baby Blanket

*There is nothing more comforting than a soft knit baby blanket. This classic chevron design would be perfect in any shade to coordinate with nursery décor. Start it now and be ready for the next baby shower gift!*

**Blanket measures 34" (86 cm) wide x 34" (86 cm) long.**

## Chevron Pattern

**Rows 1 and 2:** \*P2, K2; repeat from \* to end.

**Row 3:** P1, \*K2, P2; repeat from \* to last 3 sts, K2, P1.

**Row 4:** K1, \*P2, K2; repeat from \* to last 3 sts, P2, K1.

**Rows 5 and 6:** \*K2, P2; repeat from \* to end.

**Row 7:** Repeat Row 4.

**Row 8:** Repeat Row 3.

**Rows 9 and 10:** Repeat Row 1.

**Row 11:** Repeat Row 4.

**Row 12:** Repeat Row 3.

**Rows 13 and 14:** Repeat Rows 5 and 6.

**Row 15:** Repeat Row 3.

**Row 16:** Repeat Row 4.

Repeat Rows 1-16 for chevron pattern.

**Note:** Blanket is worked back and forth on circular needle without joining.

## BLANKET

Cast on 154 sts.

**Rows 1-6:** Work in Garter st (knit every row).

**Next row (wrong side):** K3, place marker, work Row 1 of Chevron Pattern to last 3 sts, place marker, K3.

**Note:** Continue to work K3 on first and last 3 sts on every row to establish border pattern and work Chevron Pattern inside markers.

Continue in Chevron Pattern, working first and last 3 sts in Garter st, until piece measures 33" (84 cm), ending with row 16.

Work Garter st for 6 rows. Bind off.

## FINISHING

Weave in all loose ends.

## ABBREVIATIONS

**K** = knit; **mm** = millimeters; **P** = purl; **st(s)** = stitch (es); \* = repeat whatever follows the \* as indicated.



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
