Baby Blocks Blanket and Hat Set

This pattern would be wonderful in any color, pastel or bright, but we like knitting it in yellow when we don't know if baby will be a boy or girl. Block pattern is easy, but is a classic that can be handed down for generations.



RED HEART® Soft Baby Steps®, Art. E746 available in solid color
5 oz (141 g), 256 yd (234 m); prints 4 oz (113 g), 204 yd (187 m) balls

SHOP KIT

Blanket measures: 36" wide x 36" long [91 cm x 91 cm].

Directions for hat are for 6-9 months.
Change for size 12-16 months is in parentheses.

Finished circumference: 17" (18") [43 cm (46 cm)]

SPECIAL ABBREVIATIONS

K2tog = Knit 2 stitches together. Insert the right needle into two stitches at the same time and knit. This will result in a decrease of one stitch. This decrease will slant to the right.
YO = Yarn over needle.

STITCHES

K2, P2 Rib = Knit 2 sts, Purl 2 sts. On following rows, knit the knit sts and purl the purl sts.

Garner Stitch = Knit every row.

Seed Stitch = Knit 1 st, purl 1 st for given number of sts. On following rows, knit the purl sts and purl the knit sts.

BLOCK PATTERN (over 16+8 sts)

Row 1 (Right Side): *K8, P8* across row, end K8.

Row 2 (Wrong Side): *P8, K8* across row, end P8.

Rows 3-10: Repeat Rows 1-2.

Row 11 (Right Side): *P8, K8* across row, end P8.

Row 12 (Wrong Side): *K8, P8* across row, end K8.

Rows 13-20: Repeats Rows 11-12.
Repeat Rows 1-20 for Block Pattern.

NOTE

Blanket is worked back and forth on circular needles to accommodate the large number of stitches, do not join.

TIPS & HINTS

Join a new ball of yarn when there is approximately 6" [15 cm] of yarn left from the old ball. Weave these ends in neatly on the wrong side of the fabric in a zig-zag pattern for a few inches, then trim off excess.

BLANKET

Using 5.5 [US 9] circular needles, cast on 134 sts.

Rows 1-10: Work in Seed st.

Next Row (Right Side): Work first 7 sts in Seed St for border, place marker, work Row 1 of Block Pattern over next 120 sts, place marker, work last 7 sts in Seed st for opposite border pattern.

Note: Continue to work 7 sts in Seed st on first and last 7 stitches on every row to establish border pattern and work Block Pattern inside stitch markers.

Rows 11-20: Continue in Block Pattern Rows 2-10.

Rows 21-30: Continue in Block Pattern Rows 11-20.

Continue alternating 10 rows Block Pattern for a total of 16 blocks.

Next Rows: Work 10 Rows in Seed st. removing all stitch markers.
Bind off all sts loosely.

FINISHING

Weave in ends.

NOTE

First set of numbers is for size 6-9 months, larger size is in parenthesis. Hat is worked back and forth in rows and seamed closed in back.

HAT

Using 5.0mm [US 8] needles, cast on 72 (80) sts.

Rows 1-6: *K2, P2* to end of row.

Rows 7-24 (7-30): Knit every row.

Hat will measure 4½" [11 cm] (5)" [13 cm] from cast on edge.

Begin crown decrease as follows:

Row 1 (Right Side): *K6, k2tog* — 63 (70) sts

Row 2 (Wrong Side): Knit across row.

Row 3: *K5, k2tog* — 54 (60) sts

Row 4: Knit across row.

Row 5: *K4, k2tog* — 45 (50) sts

Row 6: Knit across row.

Row 7: *K3, k2tog* — 36 (40) sts

Row 8: Knit across row.

Row 9: *K2, k2tog* — 27 (30) sts

Row 10: Knit across row.

Row 11: *K1, k2tog* — 18 (20) sts

Row 12: Knit across row.

Row 13: *K2tog* — 9 (10) sts.

Cut yarn, leaving a 12" [30 cm] tail. Using yarn needle, thread yarn through needle and draw through remaining sts twice, draw up firmly and fasten securely. With right sides facing, align back seam and sew seam closed.

FINISHING

Weave in ends, block lightly to shape.

ABBREVIATIONS

cm = centimeters; **k** = knit; **k2tog** = knit 2 sts together; **mm** = millimeters; **p** = purl; **RS** = right side; **st (s)** = stitch(es); **yo** = yarn over; ***** = repeat whatever follows the * as indicated; **WS** = wrong side.
