## WHAT YOU NEED

RED HEART ${ }^{\circledR}$ Ora $^{\text {TM }}$ : 12 balls 5360 Caramello

Susan Bates ${ }^{\circledR}$ Knitting Needles: 12.5 mm [US 17], 29 " [73 cm]
or longer circular needle

Yarn needle.

GAUGE: 8 sts = about 4¼" [11 cm]; 12 rows = about 4½" [11.5 cm ] in Stockinette stitch (knit on right side, purl on wrong side). CHECK YOUR GAUGE. Use any size needles to obtain the gauge.

RED HEART ${ }^{\text {® }}$ Ora $^{\text {™ }}$, Art. R183 available in 3.5 oz (100 g), 52 yd ( 48 m ) balls

## Throw measures about $44 \times 44$ " [112 x 112 cm ]

## Notes

1. Throw is worked back and forth in rows from lower border upwards.
2. Borders on all four sides are worked in Double Moss Stitch. Between the borders, sections of Stockinette stitch (knit on right side, purl on wrong) are alternated with sections of Reverse Stockinette stitch (purl on right side, knit on wrong side) to form "boxes".
3. The "boxes" will become more evident after 12 or more rows of the body have been completed.
4. Circular needle is used to accommodate large number of stitches. Work back and forth in rows on circular needle as if working with straight needles.
5. Throw can be worked by following written instructions or reading chart. Read right side rows of chart from right to left and wrong side rows from left to right.


## THROW

## Cast on 83 sts.

## Lower Border (worked in Double Moss Stitch)

Row 1 (right side): K1, *p1, k1; repeat from * to end of row.
Row 2: P1, *k1, p1; repeat from * to end of row.
Row 3: P1, *k1, p1; repeat from * to end of row.
Row 4: K1, *p1, k1; repeat from * to end of row.
Rows 5-8: Repeat Rows 1-4.
Rows 9 and 10: Repeat Rows 1 and 2.

## Body

## First Row of "boxes"

Row 11: [P1, k1] 5 times (for side border), k7, *p7, k7; repeat from * to last 10 sts (for boxes), [k1, p1] 5 times (for side border).
Row 12: [K1, p1] 5 times, p7, *k7, p7; repeat from * to last 10 sts, [p1, k1] 5 times.
Row 13: [K1, p1] 5 times, k7, *p7, k7; repeat from * to last 10 sts, [p1, k1] 5 times.
Row 14: [P1, k1] 5 times, p7, *k7, p7; repeat from * to last 10 sts, [k1, p1] 5 times.
continued..

Rows 15 and 16: Repeat Rows 11 and 12.

Second Row of "boxes"
Row 17: [K1, p1] 5 times, p7, *k7, p7; repeat from * to last 10 sts, [p1,
k1] 5 times.
Row 18: [P1, k1] 5 times, k7, *p7, k7; repeat from * to last 10 sts, [k1,
p1] 5 times
Row 19: [P1, k1] 5 times, p7, *k7, p7; repeat from * to last 10 sts, [k1, p1] 5 times.
Row 20: [K1, p1] 5 times, $k 7$, *p7, k7; repeat from * to last 10 sts, [p1, k1] 5 times.
Rows 21 and 22: Repeat Rows 17 and 18
Rows 23-106: Repeat Rows 11-22 for 7 more times.

## Double Moss Stitch Upper Border

Rows 107 and 108: Repeat Rows 3 and 4
Rows 109-116: Repeat Rows 1-4 twice.
Bind off.
FINISHING
Weave in ends.

$\mathbf{k}=$ knit; $\mathbf{p}=$ purl; $\mathbf{s t}(\mathbf{s})=$ stitch(es); $[\mathbf{]}=$ work directions in brackets the number of times specified; * = repeat whatever follows the * as indicated.
