## What you will need:

RED HEART\* Scrubby™: 1 ball each 10 Coconut A, 215 Bamboo B, and 510 Glacier C

Susan Bates\* Knitting Needles: 4mm [US 6]

Yarn needle

GAUGE: 17 sts = 4" [10 cm]; 19 rows = 4" [10 cm] in Stockinette stitch (knit on right side, purl on wrong side). GAUGE IS NOT CRITICAL FOR THIS PROJECT.

# Small Rosebud Scrubby

These quick-to-knit scrubbies are perfect to pair with a nice bar of soap or a candle as a thoughtful gift. They are just the right size for washing your face.

Scrubby measures about 3" [7.5 cm] diameter.

### Notes

- Scrubby is worked back and forth in rows of Stockinette stitch (knit on right side, purl on wrong side).
- Stitches are bound off about every fourth row to form a slanting edge.
  The finished piece is rolled, beginning at narrow end and with slanting edge along top, to form rosebud.
- 3. Stitches are sewn at base of rolled rosebud to hold flower in place.

# ROSEBUD (make 3 - 1 in each yarn color)

Cast on 72 sts.

**Rows 1–4:** Beginning with a right side row (knit), work in Stockinette stitch (knit on right side, purl on wrong side) for 4 rows.

Row 5 (right side): Bind off 20 sts, knit to end of row—52 sts.

**Rows 6-8:** Beginning with a wrong side row (purl), work in Stockinette stitch for 3 rows.

**Row 9:** Bind off 18 sts, knit to end of row—34 sts.

**Rows 10–12:** Beginning with a wrong side row (purl), work in Stockinette stitch for 3 rows.

**Row 13:** Bind off 20 sts, knit to end of row—14 sts.

Row 14: Purl.

Bind off all remaining sts. Cut yarn, leaving a tail about 18" [45.5 cm] long for sewing.

### **FINISHING**

Thread tail into yarn needle. With right side facing out and beginning at narrow end, loosely roll piece into a rosebud shape. Use tail to sew a few stitches at the base of the rosebud to hold the shape. Weave in ends.

### **ABBREVIATIONS**

**A, B, and C** = Color A, Color B, and Color C; **st(s)** = stitch(es).
