## What you will need:

**RED HEART® Super Saver®:** 2 skeins each 3974 Topaz and 3977 Lapis

**Susan Bates® Circular Knitting Needles:** 2 sets of 5mm [US 8] 24" (61 cm) long.

Yarn needle, 2 locking stitch markers in different colors, two 20" (51 cm) square pillow forms, polyester fiberfill (optional)

**GAUGE:** 15 sts = 4" (10 cm) in seed stitch (k1, p1 across).

**CHECK YOUR GAUGE.** Use any size needles to obtain the gauge.



**RED HEART® Super Saver®, Art. E300** available in solid color 7 oz (198 g), 364 yds (333 m); stripes, prints, multis and heathers 5 oz (141 g), 236 yds (215 m); flecks 5 oz (141 g), 260 yds (238 m) skeins

# Textured Seed Stitch Pillows

The hand-dyed look of this yarn combined with the texture of the seed stitch pattern gives your favorite spot just the right amount of coziness. Use these pillows in the bedroom or any room that needs a soft welcoming touch.

SHOP KIT

**Pillow cover measures 38" (96.5 cm) circumference x 19" long (48.5 cm).  
Pillow measures 20" x 20" (51 x 51 cm).**

## Notes

1. Pillow cover is worked in the round from one set of needles to the other. Always work current stitches with needles of the same set.
2. Place marker on first stitch of Needle 1 and move up as each round is completed.
3. Slide stitches of needle not in use to cable so they do not slip off.
4. After stitches on current needle are completed, slide stitches not in use on cable to next needle closest to working yarn.
5. Work first stitch of each needle tightly to avoid a gap between last stitch of previous needle and first stitch of current needle.

## Pattern Stitch Seed Stitch

(over an even number of sts)

**Round 1:** \*K1, p1; repeat from \* around.

**Round 2:** \*P1, k1; repeat from \* around.

Repeat Rounds 1 and 2 for Seed st.

## PILLOW COVER

Holding 1 needle from each set together, with long-tail cast on and alternating needles with every st, cast on 68 sts on each needle, cast on 1 st on first needle. Note The 68-st needle is Needle 1, the 69-st needle is Needle 2.

Place marker on Needle 1 and move up as each round is completed.

**Round 1 (right side):** Sliding sts of Needle 2 to cable, work Round 1 of Seed st around Needle 1, slide sts of Needle 1 to cable; slide sts of Needle 2 to needle closest to working yarn, work Round 1 of Seed st around to last st, k1, slide sts of Needle 2 to cable—137 sts.

**Round 2:** Slide sts of Needle 1 to needle closest to working yarn, work Round 2 of Seed st around Needle 1, slide sts of Needle 1 to cable; slide sts of Needle 2 to needle closest to working yarn, work Round 2 of Seed st around to last st, p1, slide sts of Needle 2 to cable.

**Round 3:** Slide sts of Needle 1 to needle closest to working yarn, work Round 1 of Seed st around Needle 1, slide sts of Needle 1 to cable; slide sts of Needle 2 to needle closest to working yarn, work Round 1 of Seed st around to last st, k1, slide sts of Needle 2 to cable.

Repeat last 2 rounds until piece measures 19" (48.5 cm) from cast-on edge.

Place 2nd marker on first st of Needle 2 for back of cover.

Bind off in pattern. Leaving a long tail, cut yarn.

## FINISHING

Insert pillow form in cover.

**Optional:** For firmer pillow and sharper edges and corners, stuff cover with polyester fiberfill as desired. With long tail, sew seam with mattress stitch.

Weave in ends. Lightly wet or steam block.

## ABBREVIATIONS

**k** = knit; **p** = purl; **\* or \*\*** = repeat whatever follows the \* or \*\* as indicated.



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
