What you will need:

RED HEART[®] **Loop-it**[™]: 1 ball 539 Purrr-ple

Sewing thread and needle

GAUGE: Gauge is not critical for this project.



RED HEART® Loop-It™. Art E884 available in 3.5 oz (100 g) 7.6 yr (7 m) balls



Finger Looping Beanie

You don't need to know how to knit to finger loop this cozy hat! You only need one ball of Loop-it yarn, making this a hat you can make for all your friends. Or throw a Loop-it party and everyone can enjoy finger looping!

Directions are for size Small; changes for sizes Medium and Large are in parentheses.

Hat circumference at bottom edge: 18 (20, 22)" [46 (51, 56) cm]

NOTES

Begin work on a flat surface. Stitches are worked by pulling loops of yarn through a round of previous loops. Hat is worked in continuous rounds with right side facing throughout.

HAT

Measure out 19 (21, 23)" [48 (53, 58) cm] of yarn, approximately 28 (31, 34) loops for base round.

Round 1 (Right Side): Working from right to left, pull loops of working yarn through first loop of base round loop working from back to front, to create a ring, continue to pull loops of working yarn through loops of base round until all loops have been worked - knit round formed.

Rounds 2-6 (7, 8): Working from right to left, pull loops of working yarn through loops of previous round loops working from back to front - 28 (31, 34) sts.



Shape Crown

Next Round: [Working from right to left, pull loops of working varn through 2 loops of previous round from back to front (decrease 1 stitch), pull loop of working varn through loop of next st of previous round] around until 7 (8, 9) loops remain.

Cut working yarn. With sewing thread and needle, weave through remaining loops and pull tight to gather. Secure ends.

cm = centimeters; st(s) = stitch(es); [] = work directions in brackets the number of times specified.
