#### MATERIALS

#### Red Heart<sup>®</sup> Super Saver<sup>®</sup> Super Pastel Kit<sup>™</sup>

**Kit includes 12 balls** (50 g/1.7 oz each; 600 g/21 oz total), yardage (85 m/93 yds each; 1020 m/1116 yds total)

Soft White, Dusty Grey, Pale Yellow, Coral,1 ball or 43 yds/39 mBaby Pink, Pale Plum, Light Blue, Lightper Bow (each shadePeriwinkle, Frosty Green, Light Sagewill make 2 Bows)

Susan Bates<sup>®</sup> Crystallites<sup>®</sup> Small French Knitter. Susan Bates<sup>®</sup> yarn needle.



#### CRAFT I SKILL LEVEL: BEGINNER

**MEASUREMENT** 

Approx 60" [152.5 cm] long.

### **INSTRUCTIONS**

Note: See diagrams on page 2. Step 1: Feed end of yarn through hole at top of French Knitter, leaving approx 4" [10 cm] tail. Step 2: Working clockwise, loop yarn around Peg No. 1 (in front of you - see illustrations).

Working counter-clockwise, loop yarn around Peg No. 2, Peg No. 3 and Peg No. 4. 4 pegs are wrapped and ready to knit.

**Tip:** Hold French Knitter and yarn in left hand, and French Knitter Needle in right hand.

**Step 3:** Working counterclockwise, loop yarn around Peg No. 1, above first loop made before. Repeat for Peg No. 2, Peg No. 3 and Peg No. 4. There are 2 loops on each peg. **Note:** After each slipped loop off peg, pull tail of yarn at the bottom of French Knitter for even stitches. **Step 4:** Working always from the left side of peg: With needle, pick up bottom loop and slip it over top loop and peg, then drop it off the peg. Pull tail of yarn at bottom of French Knitter to make an even stitch. Repeat for Peg No. 2, Peg No. 3 and Peg No. 4. There is 1 loop left on each peg.

Repeat Steps 3 and 4 as many times needed to achieve 60" [152.5 cm] length of Bow.

#### Cast Off

\*With yarn needle pick up loop off the peg and slip it over next peg to the left. Pick up bottom loop of last worked peg and slip it over top loop and peg, then drop it off the peg. Repeat from \* until only 1 loop is left. Cut end of yarn approx 4" [10 cm] above finished cord and draw through last loop on peg. Slip last loop off peg and pull yarn tight, turning last loop into a knot.

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
